

WHAT DO I DO AND ITS IMPACT ON THE WORLD?

As an Internal Audit Manager, I evaluate and manage test activities or procedures performed by others to ensure the activities are performed as intended. I test and manage the test of balances documented in the financial statements to ensure the balances are accurate. A financial statement is a report that shows the amount of money an organization has and how much money it spends. It is important to ensure activities are properly performed to ensure the accuracy of the financial statements because it will encourage people to invest in or do business with an organization.

Auditors provide an independent opinion of the reliability of an organization's financial statements that allow investors, employees, customer, suppliers and others to trust the organization. Auditors can identify risks before problems evolve and may identify fraud during their assessment, which allows an organization to quicky address the fraud and implement necessary procedures to reduce the fraud from reoccurring in the future.



My typical day is attending 3 – 4 meetings with management discussing changes in business processes or procedures to reduce risk, identifying risks within the organization, researching ways to apply improvements within the audit process, and reviewing work completed by my team.
