Momkey Monkey

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Crochet









Recommanded Yarn

SIZE

Height:

Approx. 50 cm lying down, approx. 32 cm sitting up



Not suitable for children under 3.

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr Luxery Velvet, 100 g ball

Approx. 100 g \approx 75 m

Col. 00010 (bear) 2 balls Col. 00020 (bunny) 1 ball Schachenmayr Catania, 50 g ball

Approx. 50 g \approx 125 m

Col. 00110 (schwarz) 1 ball (nose, mouth, eyes)

For the light monkey:

Col. 00015 (fox) 2 balls

The amount of yarn needed can vary from person to person.

stuffing

1 crochet hook 6,0 mm

1 tapestry needle (nose, mouth, eyes)

1 tapestry needle for weaving in ends

1 stitch marker

GAUGE

Single crochet (tightly crocheted):

10 st and 10 rounds = $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$

If your gauge differs from the given gauge, use a hook of a larger or smaller size accordingly.

NOTE:

Animals should be tightly crocheted so they can be properly stuffed and shaped, and so that there are no holes through which the stuffing can escape.

THE BASICS

Stitches:

Slip stitches, chain, single crochet, half double crochet, increases and decreases

Starting off:

When using a thick chenille yarn such as Luxury Velvet, it is

not possible to start with a magic ring as the yarn cannot be drawn together. That's why we start with 2 ch and work the next stitches in the 2nd ch from the hook.

Spiral rounds:

At the end of a rnd <u>do not</u> close with a sl st. The 1st st of the new rnd is worked in the 1st st of the previous rnd. This creates a spiral shape.

For a better overview, mark the 1st st of every rnd with a stitch marker.

Increasing 1 st: Work 2 st in the same insertion point.

Decreasing 1 st: Work 2 st together.

INSTRUCTIONS

NOTES:

- Stuff before joining the pieces together. Do this gradually with a small amount of stuffing and shape the animal as you go.
- It is difficult to separate the work later on. If you do need to however, do it very slowly and do not pull to hard since the yarn could break.
- Sew the individual pieces on with a different yarn such as Catania or Bravo in a similar color as Luxury Velvet is too thick for this.

Body

Work the head from the top to the bottom:

Starting with Bear, ch 2:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 6 sc.

Rnd 2: Increase every sc = 12 sc.

Rnd 3: Increase every 2nd st = 18 sc.

Rnd 4: Increase every 3rd st = 24 sc.

Rnd 5: Increase every 4th st = 30 sc.

Rnd 6: Increase every 5th st = 36 sc.

Rnds 7–11: 5 rnds of the same number of st = 36 sc.

Rnd 12: work every 5th and 6th st together = 30 sc.


Rnds 13–16: 4 rnds of the same number of st = 30 sc.


Rnd 17: work every 4th and 5th st together = 24 sc.

Rnds 18-20: 3 rnds of the same number of st = 24 sc.

Rnd 21: work every 3rd and 4th st together = 18 sc.

Rnds 22-24: 3 rnds of the same number of st = 18 sc.








Rnd 25: work every 2nd and 3rd st together = 12 sc.

Rnd 26: 1 t sc = 12 sc.

Rnd 27: 1 t, only insert in the back loop = 12 sc.

Finish the work with 1 sl st, cut the yarn and draw it inside the body through 2 or 3 st if necessary.

Head

Start with Bunny, ch 2:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 6 sc.

Rnd 2: Increase every sc = 12 sc.

Rnd 3: Increase every 2nd st = 18 sc.

Rnd 4: Increase every 3rd st = 24 sc.

Rnd 5: Increase every 4th st = 30 sc.

Rnd 6: Increase every 5th st = 36 sc.

Rnds 7–1: 4 rnds of the same number of st = 36 sc.

Rnd 11: work every 5th and 6th st together = 30 sc.

Rnd 12: work every 4th and 5th st together = 24 sc.

Rnd 13: work every 3rd and 4th st together = 18 sc.

Rnd 14: work every 2nd and 3rd st together = 12 sc.

Rnd 15: elke 1e and 2e s samen doorhalen = 6 sc.

Finish the work with 1 sl st and close the opening.

Cut the yarn and draw it inside the head (Picture 2)

Hood

Start with Bear, ch 2:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 6 sc.

Rnd 2: Increase every sc = 12 sc.

Rnd 3: Increase every 2nd st = 18 sc.

Rnd 4: Increase every 3rd st = 24 sc.

Rnd 5: Increase every 4th st = 30 sc.

Rnd 6: Increase every 5th st = 36 sc.



Rnd 13: Work 17 sc, then work hdc+dc in the next st and dc+hdc in the following st. Then work another 17 sc =

Rnd 14: Work 19 sl st, then ch 2 and then work another 19 sl st = 40 st

Finish the work with 1 sl st, cut the yarn short and pull it inside the hood. (Picture 3)





Now pull the 'hood' over the head so that the beginning and the end of the head are no longer visible.

The point in the top middle of the 'hood' should be in the middle of the forehead. Sew the 'hood' on along the edge.

(Picture 4)

Embroider the face using Catania Schwarz.

Ear (2x)

Work 1 piece with Bunny and 1 piece with Bear.

Start with Bunny, ch 2:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 6 sc.

Rnd 2: Increase every sc = 12 sc.

Rnd 3: Increase every 2nd st = 18 sc.

Finish the work with 1 sl st, knot the threads at the back. Start with Bear, ch 2:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 6 sc.

Rnd 2: Increase every sc = 12 sc.

Rnd 3: Increase every 2nd st = 18 sc.

Finish the work with a sl st and tie off the start and finish threads on the back.

Do not finish the work, instead place one Bunny piece and one Bear piece back to back so that the Bunny pieces are on top. (Picture 5)

Work the two pieces together by inserting the hook in the back loops of the Bunny piece and in both loops of the Bear piece. (Picture 6)











Rnd 4: Increase every 3rd st = 24 sc.

Sew the ears onto the sides of the head (Picture 7)

Arm (x2)

Work in Bunny and Bear but only stuff half the arm. Start with Bunny, ch 2:

Rnd 1: Work 4 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 4 sc.

Rnd 2: Increase every sc = 8 sc.

Rnd 3-6: 4 rnds of the same number of st = 8 sc. Change color to Rose Bear:

Rnd 7-2: 18 rnds of the same number of st = 8 sc.

Now squash the arm flat and crochet the opening together with 4 sc.

Finish the work with 1 sl st, cut the yarn short and pull it inside. (Picture 8)

Sew the arms onto the sides of the body. (Picture 9)





Tail

Do not stuff the tail. Start with Bear, ch 2:

Rnd 1: Work 6 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 6 sc. **Rnds 2–28:** 27 rnds of the same number of st = 6 sc.

If you have yarn left over, you can make the tail 2 rnd longer. Squash the tail flat and crochet the opening together with 3 sc. Finish the work with 1 sl st, cut the yarn short and fasten off. (Picture 10)

Sew the tail on at the back of the body. (Picture 11)





FINISHING OFF

Sew the head onto the body. This is best done with a large needle going through both the hood and the head for more stability.

Leg (x2)

Work in Bunny and Bear but only stuff the fisrt part. Start with Bunny, ch 2:

Rnd 1: Work 5 sc in the 2nd ch from hook = 4 sc.

Rnd 2: Increase every sc = 10 sc.

Rnd 3-6: 4 rnds of the same number of st = 10 sc.

Change color to Rose Bear:

Rnd 7–24: 18 rnds of the same number of st = 10 sc.

Now squash the leg flat and crochet the opening together with 5 sc.

Finish the work with 1 sl st, cut the thread short and pull it inside. (Picture 12)

Sew the legs onto the sides of the body. (Picture 13)

ABBREVIATIONS

st = stitch

sc = single crochet

slst = slip stitch

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

hdc = half double crochet

st(s) = stitch(es)rnd(s) = round(s)





i If necessary, you can fix the the threads of the open ends of yarn by holding them carefully to an open flame to melt the fibers. This should only be done by an adult either outdoors or over a fireproof surface. Be aware of glowing and/or smoldering fibers that could fall down.
