


T24 52" CEILING FAN

FAN RATING AC 120V. 60Hz

QUICK ASSEMBLY NOTES:

- * Do not wire in fan while house wires are Live. Turn power off at breaker before installation begins.
- * Do not use any controls, wall or remote, other than those provided by Matthews Fan Company.
- * Please do not use any electric or battery powered tools in the assembly and installation of this or any other Matthews Fan Company product.

1. TOOLS AND MATERIALS REQUIRED

- Philips screwdriver
- Blade screwdriver
- 11 mm wrench
- Step ladder
- Wire cutters


2. PACKAGE CONTENTS

Unpack your fan and check the contents. You should have the following items:

- a. Blade set (3)
- b. Hanger bracket assembly
- c. Ball / down rod assembly
- d. Coupling cover
- e. Fan motor assembly
- f. Mounting plate
- g. LED Light kit
- h. Glass shade
- i. Wall switch + wall plate + 4 mounting screws + 4 wire nuts
- j. Package hardware
 - Mounting hardware: wood screws (2), screws (2), lock washers (2), washers (2), star washers (2), wire nuts (3)
 - 2) Blade attachment hardware: screws (10), lock washers (10), flat washers (10)

Please do not use any electric or battery powered tools in the assembly and installation of this or any Matthews Fan Company product.









3. SAFETY RULES

- 1. To reduce the risk of electric shock, insure electricity has been turned off at the circuit breaker or fuse box before beginning.
- 2. All wiring must be in accordance with the National Electrical Code and local electrical codes. Electrical installation should be performed by a qualified licensed electrician.
- 3. **WARNING:** To reduce the risk of electrical shock and fire, do not use this fan with any solid-state fan speed control device.
- 4. WARNING: To Reduce The Risk Of Fire, Electric Shock, Or Personal Injury, Mount To Outlet Box Marked Acceptable for Fan Support of 15.9 kg (35 lbs) or less And Use Mounting Screws Provided With The Outlet Box. Most outlet boxes commonly used for the support of lighting fixtures are not acceptable for fan support and may need to be replaced, consult a qualified electrician if in doubt.
- 5. The fan must be mounted with a minimum of 7 feet clearance from the trailing edge of the blades to the floor.
- 6. To operate the reverse function on this fan, press the reverse button while the fan is running.
- 7. Avoid placing objects in the path of the blades.

- 8. To avoid personal injury or damage to the fan and other items, be cautious when working around or cleaning the fan.
- 9. Do not use water or detergents when cleaning the fan or fan blades. A dry dust cloth or lightly dampened cloth will be suitable for most cleaning.
- 10. After marking electrical connections, spliced conductors should be turned upward and pushed carefully up into outlet box. The wires should be spread apart with the grounded conductor and the equipment -grounding conductor on one side of the outlet box.
- 11. Electrical diagrams are reference only. Light kit that are not packed with the fan must be UL Listed and marked suitable for use with the model fan you are installing. Switches must be UL General Use Switches. Refer to the Instructions packaged with the light kits and switches for proper assembly.

WARNING

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF PERSONAL INJURY, DO NOT BEND THE BLADE BRACKETS (ALSO REFERRED TO AS FLANGES) DURING ASSEMBLY OR AFTER INSTALLATION. DO NOT INSERT OBJECTS IN THE PATH OF THE BLADES.

NOTE SUITABLE FOR USE IN DAMP LOCATIONS!

4. MOUNTING OPTIONS

If there isn't an existing UL listed mounting box, then read the following instructions. Disconnect the power by removing fuses or turning off circuit breakers.


Secure the outlet box directly to the building structure. Use appropriate fasteners and building materials. The outlet box and its support must be able to fully support the moving weight of the fan 15.9 kgs (35lbs) or less. Do not use plastic outlet boxes.

Figures 1,2 and 3 are examples of different ways to mount the outlet box.

Note: The Fig. 3 are for use for downrod style only.

Note: You may need a longer downrod to maintain proper blade clearance when installing on a steep, sloped ceiling. (Fig. 3)

To hang your fan where there is an existing fixture but no ceiling joist, you may need an installation hanger bar as shown in Figure 4.



5. HANGING THE FAN

REMEMBER to turn off the power. Follow the steps below to hang your fan properly.

1. Remove the decorative canopy bottom cover from the canopy by turning the cover counter clockwise. (Fig. 5)

2. Remove the hanger bracket from the canopy by removing the 1 of 2 screws from the bottom of the hanger bracket and loosening the other one a half turn from the screw head. Next, turn the canopy counter clockwise to removing the hanger bracket from the canopy. (Fig. 5)

3. Secure the hanger bracket to the ceiling outlet box using screws and washers included with your outlet box. (Fig. 6)

4. Loosen the two set screws and remove the hitch pin and lock pin from the central shaft/top coupling of the motor assembly. Doing so will allow the down rod to enter the central shaft. (Fig. 7)

5. Route wires exiting from the top of the fan motor through the coupling cover, canopy cover and canopy and then through the ball/downrod. (Fig. 7)

6. Align the holes at the bottom of the downrod with the holes in the collar on top of the motor housing. Carefully insert the hitch pin through the holes in the collar and downrod. Be careful not to jam the pin against the wiring inside the downrod. Insert the lock pin through the hole near the end of the hitch pin until it snaps into its locked position. (Fig. 7)


Warning/Caution: Failure to properly install lock pin as noted in step 6 could result in fan loosening and possibly falling.

7. Tighten two set screws on top of the fan motor firmly.

8. Now lift the motor assembly into position and place the hanger ball into the hanger bracket. Rotate down rod until the "Check Tab" has dropped into the "Registration Slot" and the down rod and ball assembly seat firmly. The down rod and ball assembly should not rotate if this is done correctly. (Fig. 8)

9. An additional safety support is provided to prevent the fan from falling. Secure the safety cable to the ceiling joist with screw and washer. (Fig. 8).

6. MAKE THE ELECTRIC CONNECTIONS

WARNING: To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse box before wiring.

NOTE: Installation of this fan requires that a three-conductor cable with ground wire be run between ceiling and wall outlet box, or the light feature will not work.

If you feel you do not have enough electrical wiring knowledge or experience, have your fan installed by a licensed electrician.

 Disconnect the power and remove the existing wall plate and switch from the wall outlet box. (Fig. 9)

2. Set the knob on the wall switch to the 0 position.

3. Make wire connections as follows using the wire nuts.

a. Connecting the wires from the fan to the wires from the ceiling outlet box. (Fig. 10)

- 1. Connect the red wire form the ceiling outlet box to the blue wire from the ceiling fan.
- 2. Connect the black wire from the ceiling outlet box toe the black wire form the ceiling fan.
- 3. Connect the white wire from the ceiling outlet box to the white wire from the ceiling fan.
- 4. Connect the green wires from the bracket and down rod to the ground conductor wire on the ceiling box.

b. Connecting the wires from the switch to the wires from the wall outlet box. (Fig. 11)




- 1. Connect the red wire from the switch to the red wire from the wall outlet box.
- 2. Connect the brown wire form the switch to the black wire form the wall outlet box that feeds up to the fan.
- Connect the black wire from the switch to the black LINE VOLTAGE wire from the outlet box that feeds back to the main fuse box.
- 4. Connect the yellow / green striped wire form the switch to the ground terminal on the wall outlet box.



7. INSTALLING THE WALL SWITCH

1. Remove the existing wall plate and the old switch from the wall outlet box.

2. Carefully tuck the wire connections inside the outlet box. Secure the wall control with the two wall switch screws provided. (Fig. 12)

3. Attach the wall plate over the wall control and secure with the two wall plate screws provided.

Disclaimer: If a wall switch is to be used, for warranty to be valid, our included wall control needs to be installed to operate this fan.



8. FINISHING THE INSTALLATION

1. Tuck connections neatly into ceiling outlet box.

2. Slide the canopy up to hanger bracket and place the key hole on the canopy over the screw on the hanger bracket, turn canopy until it locks in place at the narrow section of the key holes. (Fig. 13)

3. Align the circular hole on canopy with the remaining hole on the hanger bracket, secure by tightening the two set screws. Note: Adjust the canopy screws as necessary until the canopy and canopy cover are snug.

Warning: Make sure tab at bottom of hanger bracket is properly seated in groove of hanger ball before attaching canopy to bracket. Failure to properly seat tab in groove could cause damage to electrical wiring.




9. ATTACHING THE FAN BLADES

1. Fasten blade to motor using the flat washers, lock washers and screws supplied. (Fig. 14)

2. Repeat process with other blades. Tighten each screw and make sure the blade is straight.





10. ATTACHING THE MOUNTING PLATE

Step 1. Remove the 1 of 3 screws from the mounting ring and keep it for future use. Loosen the other 2 screws. (Do not remove)

Step 2. Place the key holes on the mounting plate over the 2 screws previously loosened from the mounting ring, turn mounting plate until it locks in place at the narrow section of the key holes. Secure by tightening the 2 screws previously loosened and the one previously removed. (Fig. 15)



11. INSTALLING THE LIGHT KIT

REMEMBER: To disconnect the power.

1. Remove 1 of 3 screws from the mounting plate and loosen the other 2 screws. (Do not remove)

2. Raise and hold the LED light kit close to the mounting plate and proceed to do the wire connections. Make the 2-pin and 9-pin wire connections: (Fig. 16)

3. Place the key holes from the light kit over the 2 screws previously loosened from the mounting plate, turn the light kit until it locks in place at the narrow section of the key holes. Secure by tightening the 2 screws previously loosened and the one previously removed. (Fig. 16)

4. Raise glass shade up against bottom of fan housing and secure it to the fan by turning the glass shade clockwise until snug. DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN.



12. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Restore power to ceiling fan and test for proper operation.

The fan 4-speed control is used to set the fan speeds as follows:

0= Turns the fan off 1= High Speed 2= Medium Speed 3= Medium Low Speed 4= Low Speed

" 🌾 " Slide Button: This button control the light brightness.



Speed settings for warm or cool weather depend on factors such as the room size. Ceiling height, number of fans and so on.

The Reverse switch is located on the LED Light kit. Slide the switch to the Left for warm weather operation. Slide the switch to the Right for cool weather operation.

NOTE: Wait for fan to stop before changing the setting of the slide switch.

Warm weather - (Forward) A downward airflow creates a cooling effect as shown in Fig. 18 This allows you to set your air conditioner on a warmer setting without affecting your comfort.

Cool weather - (Reverse) An upward airflow moves warm air off the ceiling area as shown in Fig. 19. This allows you to set your heating unit on a cooler setting without affecting your comfort.



13. CARE OF YOUR FAN

Here are some suggestions to help you maintain your fan

- 1. Because of the fan's natural movement, some connections may become loose. Check the support connections, brackets, and blade attachments twice a year. Make sure they are secure. (It is not necessary to remove fan from ceiling.)
- 2. Clean your fan periodically to help maintain its new appearance over the years. Use only a soft brush or lint-free cloth to avoid scratching the finish. The plating is sealed with a lacquer to minimize discoloration or tarnishing. Do not use water when cleaning. This could damage the motor, or the wood, or possibly cause an electrical shock.
- 3. You can apply a light coat of furniture polish to the wood blades for additional protection and enhanced beauty. Cover small scratches with a light application of shoe polish.
- 4. There is no need to oil your fan. The motor has permanently lubricated bearings.

IMPORTANT: MAKE SURE THE POWER IS OFF AT THE ELECTRICAL PANEL BOX BEFORE YOU ATTEMPT ANY REPAIRS. REFER TO THE SECTION "MAKING ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS".

14. TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Solution
Fan will not start.	 Check circuit fuses or breakers. Check line wire connections to the fan and switch wire connections in the switch housing. CAUTION: Make sure main power is off.
Fan is noisy.	 Make sure all motor housing screws are snug. Make sure the screws that attach the fan blade bracket to the motor hub is tight. Make sure wire nut connections are not rubbing against each other or the interior wall of the switch housing. CAUTION: Make sure main power is off. Allow a 24-hour "breaking-in" period. Most noise associated with a new fan disappear during this time. Some fan motors are sensitive to signals from solid-state variable speed controls. If you have installed this type of control, choose and install another type of control. Make sure the upper canopy is a short distance from the ceiling. It should not touch the ceiling.
Fan wobble.	 Check that all blade and blade arm screws are secure. Most fan wobbling problems are caused when blade levels are unequal. Check this level by selecting a point on the ceiling above the tip of one of the blades. Measure this distance. Rotate the fan until the next blade is positioned for measurement. Repeat for each blade. The distance deviation should be equal within 1/8". If the blade wobble is still noticeable, interchanging two adjacent (side by side) blades can redistribute the weight and possibly result in smoother operation. WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF PERSONAL INJURY, DO NOT BEND THE BLADE ARM WHILE INSTALLING, BALANCING THE BLADES, OR CLEANING THE FAN. DO NOT INSERT FOREIGN OBJECTS BETWEEN ROTATING FAN BLADES.
