# TREASURER REPORT

- Finally, a full season was played after 2 years of interruptions.
- From a financial perspective, the club has had a successful financial year, with income again being at an all-time high.
- The Profit & Loss reports shows a profit for the year of \$987. All payments for this season have been paid by the due date, with some minor creditors owing which are within our normal trading terms and will be offset in part by income due to be received. Note this report does not include any income from Warriors Lotto.
- As at 31/10/23, OCFNC position is as follows, which I have compared to 12 months ago and shows in improvement in the club's overall cash position and a sound position.

- Our overall cash position has improved predominately from the Warriors Lotto income, whilst also improving facilities within the club as detailed below.
- The result is achieved only through the great work of the many individual volunteers within the club who put in time and effort to ensure the club remains viable, of which there are too many to name individually.
- One of the keys to us maintaining a positive financial position has been the continued financial support from our sponsors who we cannot thank enough and we certainly appreciate their ongoing support. Please make sure as club members we support our sponsors whenever you are able.
- Commentary on key changes to this year's results are as follows
- Grants received this financial year were much higher than in prior years, offset by increased spending for those items. These are summarised as follows  
\$27,273 from Warrnambool City Council for new Netball Spectator Shelter & Seating which covered the full cost \$5,000 for new Fryers in Kitchen, noting we also purchased a new Oven. With installation, the total cost was \$13,150 \$3,000 towards Indigenous football jumpers which cost \$5,801. New netball dresses also purchased. \$1,500 for new laptop and printer which cost \$1,870.
- Bar and Income from Fundraising Events have increased. Given the improvements to the social rooms we have had numerous functions and room hire.
- Our expenses continue to gradually increase, in some cases without us being able to control it.
- Our costs are proposed to increase significantly for ground rental costs to Warrnambool City Council from 2023 onwards, which could include rent for use of our own social rooms. We have provided feedback on this to advise we believe the increase is too significant for a not-for-profit organisation, however we are unsure if we will be able to have any say or impact on the final decision.
- Ground rental to Council up \$3,363 almost a 50% increase. Part of this was due to a lower cost in 2022 coming out of COVID, however this is expected to continue to increase. Note it is likely that this will increase further in 2024 for lease of social rooms to be implemented. (Amount unknown).
- Two years Football Insurance payments to AFL Victoria as last years Invoice not received until after seasons end. Total costs \$5565, which should be half for the actual year. Other costs are likely to increase given current CPI pressures, ie Food, Utilities, Insurance etc
- We have merchandise stock on hand that is paid for, valued at approximately \$5,000 and Bar Stock of \$1,500.



- We have paid \$4,165 off our Deck Loan this year. Repayments will increase with recent interest rate rises with interest cost up \$1,737 YOY.
- Thank you to everyone who has supported the club either financially or through volunteering.

We have a total of 46 current sponsors. Majority of those donating money and several others donating goods for use at auctions to raise money for the club and at this stage majority of sponsors look set to continue their support.

The 2023 season kicked off with record numbers for juniors and seniors highlighting the work that has gone into strengthening our netball program and becoming the club of choice for junior netball to enable senior netball success in years to come.
