

To commemorate 65 years of singing and tradition, the Yale Alley Cats proudly present *Ghost of Chance*.

It was during a fall night in 1943 that four Yale undergraduates climbed to the top of Saybrook Tower and began to sing Henry Carey's 18th-century ballad "Sally in Our Alley." Their rendition awoke the College Master, who ran to the base of the tower and commanded them to descend and go back to bed. The young men relented, but not before laying the foundation of a group that would go on to encompass hundreds of Yale alumni all over the world. Today, the Yale Alley Cats continue to sing "Sally in Our Alley" at the beginning of their concerts, awakening a sense of tradition in every performance.

The Alley Cats consist of freshman, sophomores, and juniors at Yale College. Seniors who have sung with the group for three years often go on to spend their final year singing with the Whiffenpoofs, the oldest college *a capella* group in the world, whose alumni include the great Cole Porter. Yet the three-year experience of the Alley Cats allows the group to develop a unique resonance. Amidst an ever-evolving roster of singers--as new freshman arrive and juniors advance--the warm "shoe sound" (named for the physical shape of the ensemble) has become a hallmark of Alley Cat performances.





Jazz remains the group's deepest and most cherished tradition, with every arrangement produced by members and past-members during their time at Yale. A few of these charts, such as "You Go to My Head" and "How High the Moon," have been in continuous performance over the past thirty years. All the arrangements are held in the "Pitch Files," a chest of scores passed down each year to the incoming music director at the start of his tenure. The files are a treasure trove in that they show not only a lineage of arranging talent in the group, but also immediacy in championing newly popular songs. Several of the arrangements featured on Ghost of a Chance date back to the 60's, and 70's, when many of these now standard songs were only a few years old. "This Masquerade" and "Haven't We Met," to name a few, were arranged within a year of their respective original compositions. Today, the group blends an array of styles, incorporating everything from English Spirituals and Bulgarian folk songs to Motown and Bossa Nova.

The Alley Cats debut their new material (as well as resurrect forgotten gems) at Champagne Jamboree, the group's classic February concert series attended by the Yale community and a myriad of alumni. For some of the singers, the Alley Cats is also their first chance to see the world, as the group embarks on a yearly series of world tours throughout Europe, Asia, and the Americas.

With each successive year, the tradition of the Alley Cats grows both musically and vocationally, as the group develops its repertoire and finds new audiences around the globe. What is perhaps most important, however, is the quality of friendship and camaraderie the experience entails. The voices and songs on this record are not individually the work of seasoned professionals, but rather the uniting of friends and scholars from many disciplines--music, theater, philosophy, science, politics, business, and history--in a common desire to explore the power of voice and harmony. It is this element of a common experience, bridging many different personalities and backgrounds in the bonds of comradeship, which instills a singular exuberance into the Alley Cats sound.
