
# Jake Can't Fake It!


**Directions:** Help Jake finish his homework with words that rhyme with his name! Come up with five words and then draw a picture of that word in the box next to it.














Solve. Write the sum or difference.

### Discussion

Discuss with the class the definition of responsibility, and come up with some ideas as a class of what a responsible person would look like. It may be fun to draw a large person on either the board or a large piece of paper, and as a class come up with the different parts of a responsible person. You can make it relevant to your classroom. Here is an example:



Eyes: Watch out for younger brother or sister.

Mouth: Speak nice words.

Arms: Carry out the trash.

Hands: Help out around the house.

Legs: Walk the dog.

Next, create a class discussion about who the students think is the most responsible person in their own life. Have them write a small paragraph about who the person is and why they are the most responsible.

To further this assignment to a take-home activity, have each student bring in a picture of the person that they wrote about. You can create a class mural of the pictures that they brought in, and add the pictures to the responsible person drawing previously created. This will be fun for the students to have in the classroom.
