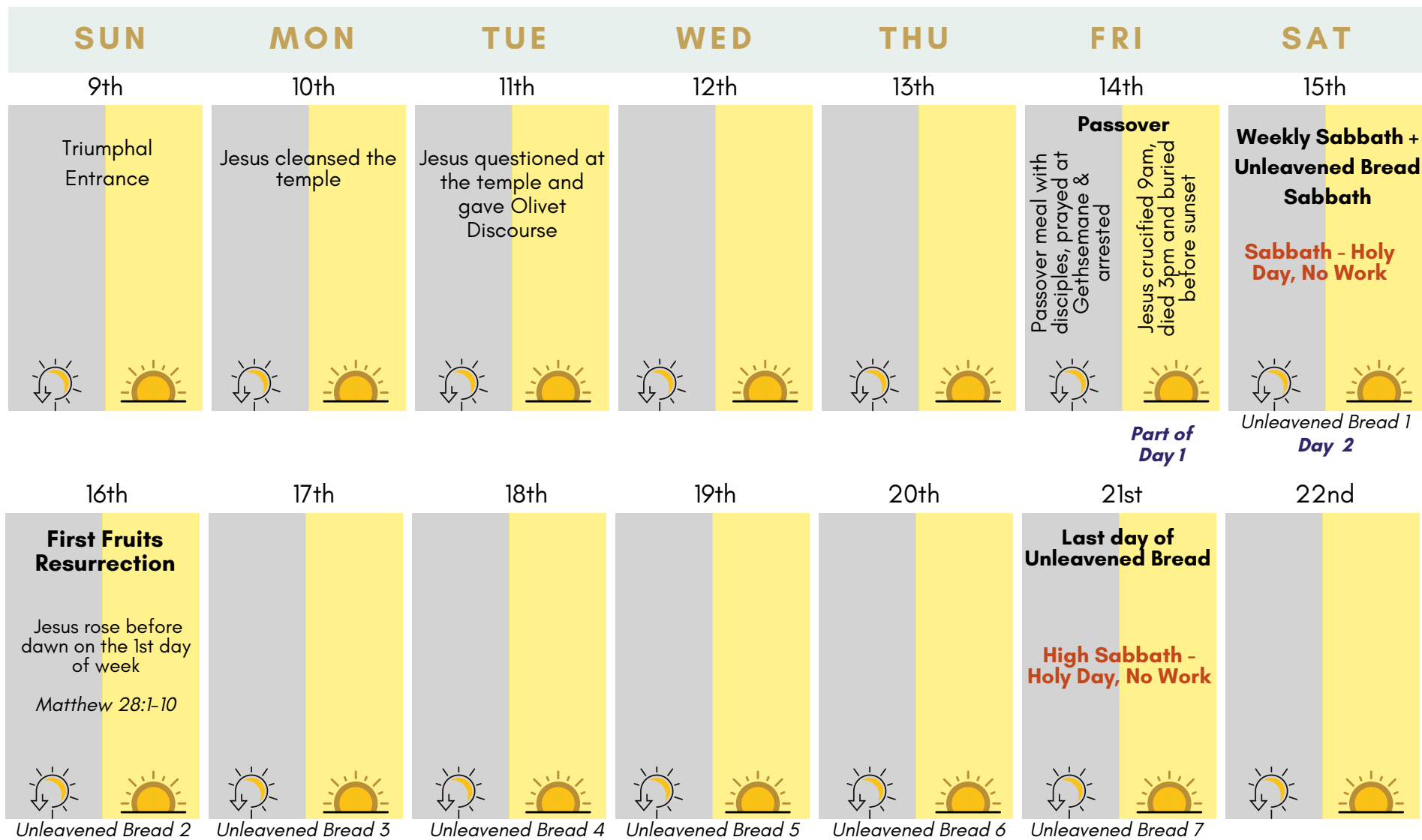
Notes:

- Jesus in the heart of the earth 3 days and 3 nights - Literal translation **Ref: Matthew 12:40**
- A Thursday crucifixion would mean there were two Sabbath days back-to-back. A festival Sabbath and the weekly Sabbath.
- Passover has to occur on the 14th of the month. So, whenever Jesus celebrates Passover with the disciples, we can determine that's the 14th of Abib/Nisan.
- During Jesus' day, the Jewish people would lump the Passover Feast and Feast of Unleavened Bread into one festival, calling all 8 days the Feast of Unleavened Bread or Feast of Passover. However, Passover is first, followed immediately by 7 days of Unleavened Bread. **Ref: Exodus 12:1-20, Leviticus 23:1-8, Matthew 26:17 and Mark 14:12**



Option 2: Friday Crucifixion and One Sabbath - Figurative 3 days & 3 nights (Jewish Idiom)

MONTH: ABIB (NISAN) / MARCH-APRIL Jewish Days begin at sunset (6pm) & end at sunset (6pm) the next day

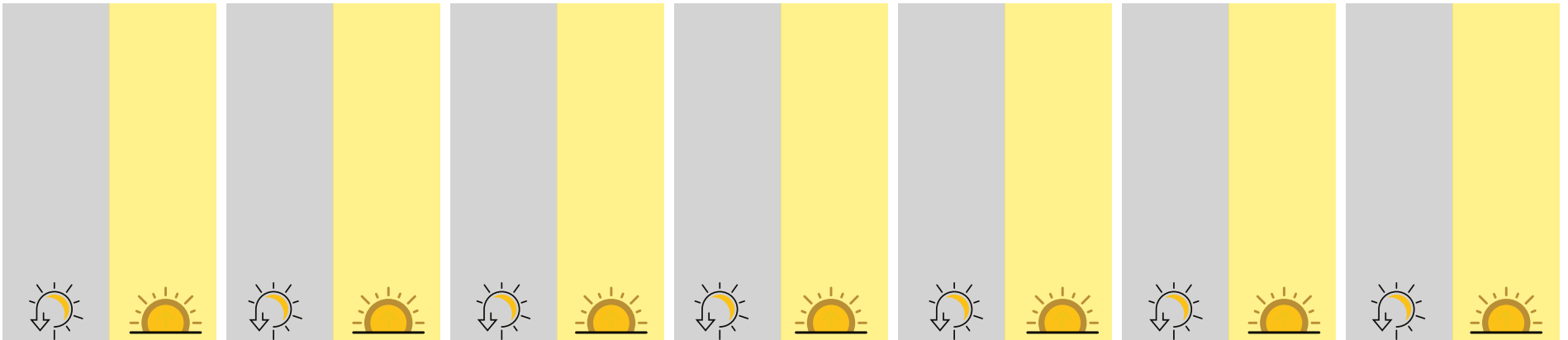
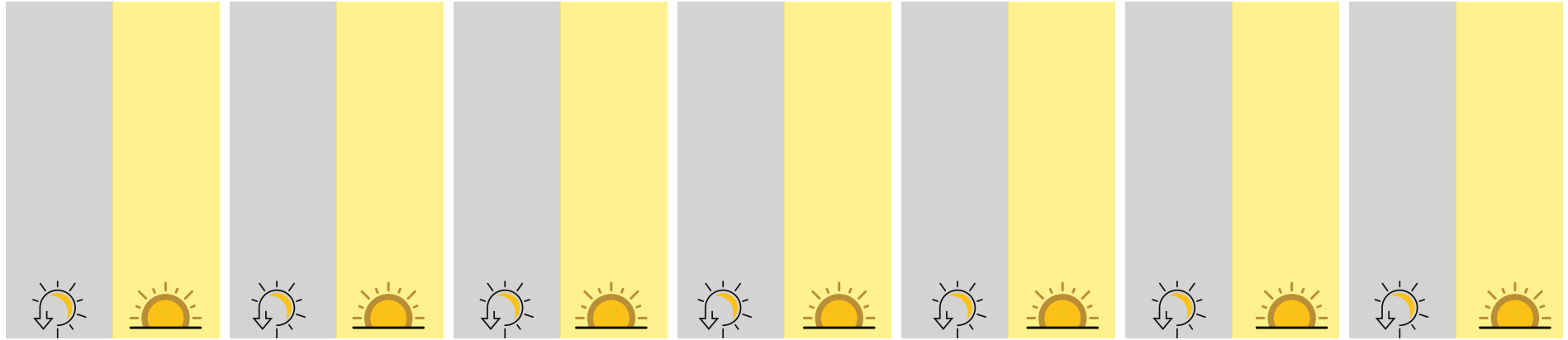
- Jesus in the heart of the earth 3 days and 3 nights = Jewish Idiom, not literal, but counts any part of a day as a whole day.
- Not sure what happened on the Wednesday and Thursday in this scenario. Traditions say silent Wednesday and Last Supper Thursday, but scripture shows the Last Supper and crucifixion happen in one Jewish day sunset to sunset.
- Passover has to occur on the 14th of the month. So, whenever Jesus celebrates Passover with the disciples, we can determine that's the 14th of Abib/Nisan.
- During Jesus' day, the Jewish people would lump the Passover Feast and Feast of Unleavened Bread into one festival, calling all 8 days the Feast of Unleavened Bread. However, Passover is first, followed immediately by 7 days of unleavened bread. **Ref: Exodus 12:1-20, Leviticus 23:1-8, Matthew 26:17 and Mark 14:12**
