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Introduction

The purpose of this study is to help mothers study God's Word and look at real-life biblical women for lessons in motherhood and marriage. We will start by spending a few lessons studying Proverbs 31 and what it means to be a virtuous woman. After understanding Proverbs 31, we will then dive into four key mothers of the Bible. We will look at Eve, Sarah, Hannah, and Mary.

Each of these women had different struggles in motherhood, whether it was the struggle of getting pregnant or rearing godly children. We will study their stories, learn from their experiences, and see how we can apply some of their lessons to our life. We will also reflect back and see what Proverbs 31 qualities each of these women had.

I hope this study is edifying to you as a mother and as a Christian woman. I hope you can draw closer to God and understand who He is as our Creator. I hope you remember that God chose you to be a mother for a reason. He will use you and equip you to raise the next generation. We need to remember to look back to God when facing parenting struggles, and I pray this study journal can help guide you there.

Before you begin...

We are going to study and learn about what it means to be a virtuous woman. Prepare your heart and mind to allow the Holy Spirit to teach you and equip you to understand what God's Word intends. Focus on the attitude behind the virtuous woman and not just the tasks she is accomplishing. Think of the "why" behind it. Whom is she trying to serve? Why is she doing it? What is her motivation? Think about God and His characteristics and what you can learn about Him through this passage.

I pray that You open my mind and heart as I begin to study Your Word. I pray that my assumptions and ideas of a virtuous woman are grounded in Your truth and not my own ideals. 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In Her Shoes

1. Proverbs 31 is actually written to men to help them understand what to look for in a wife. This Proverb is a mother speaking to her son, identifying the attitude and characteristics to look for in a wife. The first key attribute is trustworthiness. Can your husband fully trust and confide in you? How do you speak about your husband both privately and publicly?
2. A virtuous wife has an attitude that is delighted to serve her family (31:13). Delighted means "a high degree of gratification or pleasure." When your family needs you, are you delighted or irritated? How can you work toward serving them with delight?
Application
1. The virtuous woman uses her time wisely. What is one way you could improve your time management to make sure you are using it wisely for your household? What is a distraction that you should try to limit?
2. The virtuous woman is resourceful with her family's profits. She reinvests to profit their future. Are you a wise steward with your family's finances? What is one way you could improve your family's profits to provide a better future? (example: consider budgeting)

Summary of Proverbs 31

Many don't realize that Proverbs 31 is actually a mother giving her son, King Lemuel, advice on what to look for in a godly wife. She lists all the attributes and qualities of a virtuous woman who will do her son good *all the days of his life*. Isn't that what all mothers pray for, specifically those with sons? For a woman to treat her son well and honor him? Likewise, for our daughters to be loved and cherished by their husbands for their hard work?

As you read Proverbs 31, you can look at this chapter from two perspectives. The first is as a woman/wife/mother and learning how to glorify God by serving your family with a godly attitude. The second is through a generational lens by teaching our sons what to desire in a wife and teaching our daughters what an attitude should look like when serving her family.

This is not a woman's to-do list of things she must do to be a godly wife. This is the wisdom of how a woman's heart and attitude should be when serving her husband and family. A godly woman will grow and mature in her role as a wife and mother. This isn't something that will happen the moment you say "I do." These characteristics and qualities are nurtured and grown over time as a woman seeks to honor the Lord with her marriage and her household daily.

The first key attribute of the virtuous woman is **trustworthiness.** A woman with this virtue should be able to have the full trust of her husband. He should be able to confide in her, knowing she will not judge him but be his biggest cheerleader. A husband should be able to trust that his wife will use wisdom and sound judgment when making decisions. A wife gains her husband's trust by honoring him with her speech and actions. Speak well of your husband in public and in private. Don't call out his weaknesses and struggles for all to know. Don't gossip about your husband with family or friends. As a wife, you should protect and build up his reputation, not ruin it. Also, protect your marriage and be wise with how you interact with other men. Don't do anything that would dishonor your husband or marriage.

A second quality of the virtuous woman is **hardworking**. A virtuous woman is eager to work and provide for her family. She is not lazy. When she does her work, she does not complain about every task but instead does the work delightfully. Whether the task is mopping the floors or completing a presentation, do it all as if you are serving the Lord because that is who you are representing. God is the one who sees the work you are putting in and your heart behind it.

"Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve."

Colossians 3:23-24 (NASB)

Summary of Proverbs 31

A third quality of the virtuous woman is **resourcefulness**. The virtuous woman uses the talents and gifts God gave her to bring glory to Him. She is glorifying God whether she is making clothes for her family or using that skill to make items to sell for extra money. She is wise with her family's profits and invests them in ways that will be profitable for her whole family's future. She thinks ahead and makes sure her family's needs will be taken care of. She anticipates what is coming and plans accordingly. She smiles at the future because she has planned for it.

The fourth quality a virtuous woman has is **controlled speech.** A virtuous woman doesn't lash out and make unkind remarks. She thinks before she speaks and chooses her words wisely. She is not a gossip. She speaks in a manner that will bring honor to God. She doesn't lash out emotionally but will restrain her words by using wisdom. She speaks kindly to her husband and builds him up. She also speaks kindly to her children. She's thoughtful with the words she chooses for discipline and training. It is not a sign of weakness to not retaliate with your words. It actually shows strength that you know when to speak and when to hold your tongue. The closer we are to God, the more we can emulate Him in our words.

"He who restrains his words has knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding." Proverbs 17:27 (NASB)

Lastly, the most important quality of the virtuous woman is **fear of the Lord.** The virtuous woman's main goal is to grow closer to God and serve Him with her heart and attitude. She understands the heart of a woman is more important than her outward appearance. To fear the Lord, we need to learn about God, fear God, know God, and then imitate Him. Jesus was the best example of a servant leader. A virtuous woman can imitate Jesus by serving her husband, kids, and others. Those who fear the Lord have an awareness of who God is, deep respect for Him, and a commitment to obey His commands. Proverbs 31 gives us the knowledge to learn how to glorify God with our attitude by serving our husband and children. Pray, learn, and apply this instruction daily.

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction." Proverbs 1:7 (NASB)

When we serve our family well, we are a light to others looking in. We reflect God and His love with our servant attitudes. If we remember whom we are working for (God, not men), then our attitudes should reflect that. Jesus always put others' needs above His own. Keep your focus on God, and be a light for your family and the world.
