



Beat the bite – protect yourself

Despite the slowly cooling temperatures in Autumn, mosquitoes are still breeding and biting across Moira Shire, including the ones barbouring diseases such as

the ones harbouring diseases such as Ross River Fever and Japanese encephalitis.

Your only protection against mosquitoes and the diseases they can carry is to avoid mozzie bites.

Mozzies can bite through tight clothes so cover up with long, loose-fitting clothing.

Use mosquito repellents containing picardin or DEET and limit outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are around.

Local Government Monitor welcomed

 $\ensuremath{\bigotimes}$ tatement from CEO Clare Keenan and Mayor Libro Mustica - 8 April 2022

We welcome the news from the Minister for Local Government that a Monitor will be appointed to Moira Shire Council.

CEO Clare Keenan wrote to the Minister last week and raised concerns about the safety of her staff and Councillors because of the behaviour of one Councillor, particularly after correspondence from the Mayor to the Councillor did not rectify the potential breaches of Code of Conduct.

The CEO raised concerns with the Minister that she was unable to fulfil her statutory responsibility to provide safety in the workplace.

She sought urgent assistance from the Minister to advise and exercise powers, particularly in the area of Councillor Code of Conduct.

CEO Clare Keenan and Mayor Libro Mustica thank the Minister for taking their concerns seriously and acting so promptly.





Museum Moments...

An article taken from the Nathalia Herald, 27/04/1954 *"Barmah's Gift Nearly Went to Lions....*

Barmah's Gift, which won the Torrumbarry Handicap at Echuca on Easter Saturday is probably the cheapest good horse ever sold in the district. It was purchased for £3 and then sold to a Nathalia trainer (Mr Lloyd Pell) for £5.

In the noted Barmah muster those horses which can be mustered from the Barmah Common are often offered for auction by Mr H. Adams, local breeder.

Some are well bred, some are brumbies, and at a muster a couple of years ago one went on to the block, bred from a first Grattan mare by Heroic Voyage, a district sire.

A Melbourne horse dealer seeking suitable nourishment for the lions at the Melbourne Zoo, bought the horse for £3, but another local fancier, Mr G. A. Bates, scenting that the blood lines deserved something better than a lion's lunch, bought the steed back at the original price of £3. He offered it to Nathalia trainer, Mr Lloyd Pell for £5, and the latter, in accepting, aptly named the horse Barmah's Gift.

Since then Barmah's Gift has lost his brumby ways, and recently won at Mooroopna. His win at Echuca on Saturday was no fluke, for he paced a 2.15 mile and beat a big field, which included several very good performers.

The winner was backed from 8/1 to 4/1 and to give the tale a happy ending, all those concerned shared in the win, including Messrs Bates and Adams. The win completed a double for Mr Pell, a Nathalia carrier and shearer, who prepares a small team as a sideline.

Mr Adams recommends buyers to the Barmah muster in a few weeks time, stating that there are plenty of other good trotters on the Common—if they can be caught for the muster. He also bred and sold Barmah King, holder of a Melbourne Showgrounds record, and twice winner this year of first class races against the best of the blue bloods."

Kevin Whelan's Life on the Railways



evin Whelan started on the Railways in February 1948 at 18 years. He started as an engine cleaner at North Melbourne loco depot. He then progressed to a fireman, on goods and passenger trains. Then he was selected as a commissioner's fireman, which meant driving as fireman for them, around the state to do their inspection of all facilities and deputations, of towns people and farmers.

Kevin was also a fireman on the Royal Tour in 1954, when the Queen and Duke of Edinburgh came to Australia. They travelled for 6 days around Victoria. When the tour finished Kevin and driver were presented to the Queen and Duke. The driver at that time was Frank Myers (whose father came from Nathalia, many years ago.)

Kevin had progressed to driver in 1953, but was invited back as fireman with Fran Myers, for the Royal Tour. They had worked together for several years from 1954 on. Kevin drove trains to many country places. Later in 1988 as driver on a Royal Train, Kevin drove for the Queen and



Duke to Geelong to open the Wool Museum. On return to Melbourne Kevin and his loco assistant were presented to the Queen and Duke.

The railways were originally run by three commissioners. The organisation was changed to be run by a board, in about the seventies. Some time later Kevin was employed as the driver for the board members.

The train of knowledge was a school camp on wheels for children in grades 5 & 6. 90 children and 6 teachers, Monday to Friday. The children came from different schools, would meet in Melbourne, then go by train to different areas like Ballarat, Bendigo, Ararat etc. during the day, then back to the train to sleep and eat.

Kevin was the train driver for many of these trips. There was a dining car on the train where children had breakfast and evening meal. Some children were allowed to go through the loco. This was enjoyed by the children and teachers and I'm sure by the drivers.

So time ago Kevin participated in T.V. adverts. One being he had to drive a train through an imitation brick wall to smash for an advert - to pick up parcels on time! There is a similar mural at Broken Hill Station, we saw about a year ago.

He also did an advert for Carlton United Brewery. The drovers were loading cattle on the train, then they went to a make shift station, to have a beer. Kevin was the driver for that advertisement.

Kevin retired in December 1989, but still travels to Melbourne and other places to meet with his old mates, has done this for many years.



Recently he travelled on an old steam train from Castlemaine to Maldon. This was driven by his assistant of many years before. This was organised by Ray Bardon who has just published a book for his Railway friends and has donated all his memorabilia to Malden Station. Many railway friends were on the train that day.

Kevin was photographed in the drivers seat on the loco that day (with his driver's hat on) (pictured above). He gave the hat to Steve Devision who was his assistant of many years before. A happy day was had by all. Kevin is now 92 years of age and still going strong.


