Rate notices in the mail

he 2022/23 rate notices are in the mail and people will be receiving them in their letterboxes in coming davs.



Chief Financial Officer Matt Jarvis said there were multiple ways available to pay your rates including direct debit options.

Mr Jarvis said the suite of options were to give property owners the flexibility to pay their rates in a way which best suited their needs.

"As well as the lump sum, quarterly and 10 instalments options, you can organise to have weekly or fortnightly payments direct debited from your bank account," Mr Jarvis said.

"Simply fill out the direct debit form on our website or you can send an email requesting this direct debit function."

Mr Jarvis said the community generally wanted to know three things when their rate notice arrived.

"What am I getting for my rates, how much have they increased and how rates are calculated are by far the most common questions we receive," he said.

"Every single day people across our shire rely on Council to provide services to help them work, live, travel and play.

"From footpaths and roads to maternal and child health, from parks, gardens, and libraries to rubbish collection and landfills – our ratepayers fund more than 50 different corporate, infrastructure and community services."

Mr Jarvis said the modest rate cap of 1.75%, as set by the Victorian Government, will help preserve Council's ongoing financial sustainability. 'We encourage anyone who would like to know more about our payment options or rebates they may be entitled to, to give us a call or drop into our Customer Service Centres in Cobram or Yarrawonga," he said.

"Any ratepayers experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to make contact with Council to discuss all the available options."

Further information about the rates, fees, charges and payment options is included with the rate notice or go to our website.

The History of 'APRONS'

I don't think our kids know what an apron is. The principle use of Grandma's apron was to protect the dress underneath because she only had a few. It was also because it was easier to wash aprons than dresses and aprons used less material. But along with that, it served as a potholder for removing hot pans from the oven.

It was wonderful for drying children's tears, and on occasion was even used for cleaning out dirty faces.

From the chicken coop, the apron was used for carrying eggs, fussy chicks, and sometimes half-hatched eggs to be finished in the warming oven.

When company came, those aprons were ideal hiding places for shy kids.

And when the weather was cold, Grandma wrapped it around her arms.

Those big old aprons wiped many a perspiring brow, bent over the hot wood stove.

Kindling wood were brought into the kitchen in that apron.

From the garden, it carried all sorts of vegetables. After the peas had been shelled, it carried out the hulls.

The apron was used to bring in apples that had fallen from the trees.

When unexpected company drove up the road, it was surprising how much furniture that old apron could dust in a matter of seconds.

When dinner was ready, Grandma walked out onto the porch, waved her apron, and the men folk knew it was time to come in from the fields to dinner.

It will be a long time before someone invents something that will replace that 'old-time apron' that served so purposes.

REMEMBER:

Grandma used to set her hot baked apple pies on the window sill to cool. Her granddaughters set theirs on the window sill to thaw.

They would go crazy now trying to figure out how many germs were on that apron.

I don't think I ever caught anything from an apron - but love

Hard work pays off

Recently our local Triathlete Regan Hollioake competed in the Port Macquarie Ironman held on the 1st of May. The Ironman triathlon consists of a 3.8km swim, a 180km bike ride and a 42.2km run.

This was Regan's First Ironman and her 4th attempt at getting to the start line in three years due to the covid restrictions and border lockdowns. Regan had continued to train for that entire period while waiting for the go ahead from the government and Ironman Australia. There are now only three Ironman held in Australia and these are Busselton in WA, Cairn's in Qld and Port Macquarie in NSW.

The Ironman are held once a year so timing the training program and being in your best form for the day is hard to do let alone when they get cancelled with very little notice. 'Port Mac' is the Australian Championship race and is very popular with triathletes from all over the world. Regan placed on the podium in Third place in the Female 30 to 34 years with an exceptional 'first timers' time of 10 hours, 28 minutes and 26 seconds. This time was extra special due to the fact that Regan had the flu that was going around at that time and was severely affected by it in the lead up and on the day. Regan had to ride very cautiously to keep her heart rate down to save herself for the marathon, (Regan is a very strong and competitive rider so this was hard to do) Regan was in second place until half way through the marathon and the other Ladies in her age group finished only minutes in front which is very exciting showing Regan can match it with the best in Australia, if not the world. Regan was the 5th fastest Female on the day out of 180, showing how competitive her age group is. She was also placed 143rd out of 1,060 athletes that finished that day.

In Ironman triathlon the age groups of the 35 to 50-year-old men and woman are the strongest as it is an endurance event and maturity of the body and also the mind contributes to this age bracket being the fastest.

Each course in Australia and overseas also brings different challenges. Some are hot and windy; some are very hilly. Some have very rough or lovely hot mix roads, the swim can be a fresh water lake or open choppy ocean. Depending on the time of year athletes can finish in the dark (as Regan did, albeit with a very respectable time). The cut off to complete an Ironman is 16 hours and as Regan and Wade watched Port Mac until 1130 at night, it made a very long day for the athletes involved!

Regan Become Nathalia's Fourth Ironman as our little town has had a few athletes complete triathlons biggest race.

Some locals may remember Lindsay Hooper. He started Triathlon when the race itself was in its infancy in the late 80s, with limited technology in bikes, for example Regan's new triathlon specific bike has electronically shifting gears, the athletes at this time were certainly without

GPS watches which give constant feedback on times, km splits and heart rate zones at a glance. Lindsay competed in many Ironman triathlon races and his best time was at Forster in 1992 which was then the Australian Championship race, Lindsay laid down a spectacular time of 10 hours 12 minutes and 59 seconds in the male 45 to 49 age group placing him in 3rd place out of 32.

Wade Hicks competed in Ironman New Zealand at Lake Taupo in the North Island in March 2013 in a time of 11 hours and 23 minutes 34 seconds placing 4th out of 20 in the age group of 18 to 24 years.

Paul McCallum has had a long interest with Triathlon and competed on and off starting in high school, he decided to take on the big race and competed in Busselton in December in 2016 and placed 43rd out of 68 with a time of 11 hours 43 minutes and 21 seconds in the male 25 to 29 age group. Spectators like Paul's parents could watch the

swim leg of this race very closely as the athletes swam to the end of the famous wooden Jetty, then back again.

Cody Delaney very recently competed in the Cairns Ironman on the 12th of June, Making him Nathalia's 5th Ironman. Cody has recently taken an interest in Triathlon as many will remember his athletic prowess as a junior 200m to 400m runner at the Nathalia Little athletics club. Cody finished 75th out of 105 athletes in his very competitive age group of 35 to 39 years in a fantastic time of 12 hours and 12 minutes 52 seconds.

Two other special mentions that competed in Cairns that day with Cody were brothers Shane and Ryan Kervin, both men played football and worked around and in Nathalia a few years ago and now reside in Echuca-Moama. Ryan and Shane have a very strong interest in Ironman triathlon and they travel regularly in Australia and around the world. Ryan was also out on course with Regan in Port Mac this year. Ryan is the epitome of Ironman racing and consistently stays fit all year round to compete in the Ironman races and his times reflect that, very rarely taking longer than 11 and a half hours. Ryan has completed 12 Ironman distance races. Not to let his brother have all the glory Shane trains just as hard and has travelled to Cairns now for the third time. Shane has completed the full distance 9 times over the years in Australian events.




