

Barwo Homestead has two Registered Nurses who oversee the care provided by the wonderful care team. The members of the care team at Barwo are all qualified, they are caring and friendly, and are selected for their commitment to providing the very best of care for each resident.

At Barwo, the residents are very well provided for. Their clothes are washed, their beds are made and they get help with showering if needed. Each room has its own en-suite shower and toilet. The individual wants and needs of each resident are taken into account to endeavour to provide each with the best care possible.

As well as providing for the needs of long term residents, Barwo Homestead also provides high quality accommodation for short term "respite care".

Perhaps the most appealing feature of Barwo Homestead is the co-operative friendly atmosphere that is evident throughout the whole complex. Residents have opportunities to reconnect with old friends or form new friendships.

The people who work at Barwo are diligent in executing their duties. They are caring and co-operative, creating a welcoming and pleasant atmosphere for all. Everyone including the administrator and nursing staff, care staff, kitchen staff, cleaners and gardener - all enjoy working in this friendly and harmonious environment. Right now there are opportunities to join this wonderful team, as a number of vacancies exist across different categories. All facilities at Barwo are kept scrupulously clean. The shared facilities are attractively decorated, while the residents' individual rooms can reflect the preferences of each individual. Outside, the residents can wander or simply relax in a very pleasant and well-manicured garden. Residents can go further and venture into the town.

During most days at Barwo there are organized activities provided by the staff. Visiting entertainers from the community also come fairly regularly, although this has been curtailed somewhat in recent times due to Covid. Residents can choose which activities to participate in.

Regarding Covid, protocols and practices are in place to protect against the possibility of an outbreak in the facility.

Right now, there are several vacancies for residents at Barwo.

Barwo Homestead is a non-profit entity partially funded by the federal government. The Committee of Management comprises members of the local community and they are all volunteers. The cost for residents takes into account the resident's assets and their pension. Many residents and their families have found that the cost is considerably less than they thought it would be.





National Tree Day at Nathalia & District Preschool

ational Tree Day started in 1996 and has grown into Australia's largest community tree-planting and nature care event.







It's a call to action for all Australians to get their hands dirty and give back to the community.

The Seedling Bank program launched in 2019 with the central goal of supplying native seedlings to schools and community groups around Australia. Nathalia Preschool was successful with a grant application for \$250.00 from The Seedling Bank to purchase native plants for preschool and our community.

Australia is home to many species of edible plants and yet we do not grow them within our own gardens. To reconnect to the land, we have planted indigenous bush tucker seedlings which we will be able to harvest the fruits and roots to cook with in the future.

The children's natural fascination of their natural environment and their desire to seek out their learning builds upon the connections of the land and the traditional owners. This became the connection between National Tree Day and National Aboriginal Torres Strait Islander Children's Day.
