Museum Moments...

A recent visitor to our property at Narioka, south of Picola, created some interest. At about 9.30 am one morning recently I found a wombat ambling up our driveway. When it saw my dogs it made a dash for our old shed. The wombat was a beautiful chocolate brown colour and was in very good condition.

When we investigated the shed we found a large mound of soil from a burrow dug in the back corner of the shed and another place in the shed where he had started to dig then changed his mind. The wombat had obviously been living there for at least a few days.

I set up a trail camera to record any activity in and out of the shed, and captured an image of the wombat leaving the shed at about 4.30 am the next morning. I left the camera in position for the next few nights but saw no further activity. I think he may have moved on to a quieter place.

This is the second only sighting of a wombat at Narioka in the time we have lived there. We saw one in about 2009-10 when it took up residence under our shearing shed but again did not stay long.

A section of the farm which Keith owned on the Barmah Shepparton Road had an area of undulation which was never changed, even by cultivation. It was a series of hollows and mounds which had an unusual formation. Keith recalls a conversation he had with local identity, the late Maurice Dohnt who claimed they had once been wombat burrows. This could be understandable when you studied the mounds as the soil seemed to be disturbed in a directional manner consistent with a large digging animal that moved sub-soil to the surface in a single direction. The hollows were never functional burrows while Keith owned the land and he never saw a wombat in that area. Maurice believed the burrows were flooded out in the floods of possibly either 1870's or 1916.


We wonder if the wombat we saw recently was forced into our area by flood water on the Loch Garry floodplain. We were land-locked by flood water for a period of time so perhaps the wombat was forced to stick around longer than he



they need to cross a small stream. I would be interested to hear from anyone who has stories of wombats in this area as it is a rare sighting.

Were wombats once a more common thing to see throughout the Deep Creek or Kotupna area or maybe further across towards Shepparton?

The photograph pictured left is not 'my' wombat because it was too quick for me to get a camera when I found him in daylight, but pictured right is the back end of 'my' wombat taken with infra-red light as he wandered away during the night.

And so the stories flowed, each different, each reflecting the unique character of Howie, each connecting us across all our varying areas of experience.

A delicious afternoon tea followed and the chatting, it seemed, would never stop; remembering Howie had instigated such a meeting of old and new friends. 
