"She has worked tirelessly for the betterment of all residents in Moira Shire and I wish Marie all the best in her future endeavours."

### Organic waste anniversary – win a Foodcube

ouncil's kerbside organic waste removal is turning seven years old and we are celebrating by holding a competition to reduce food waste.

Mayor Libro Mustica said the prize was a Foodcube wicking garden bed plus soil and vegetable seeds to get you started.

"We would love to know what you are doing to reduce your household food waste, whether it be preserving, freezing, cooking or storing," Cr Mustica said.

Cr Mustica said by excluding organic waste from landfill, you could reduce greenhouse emissions, leachate generation and have a considerable reduction in vermin.

"Organic waste makes up a large proportion of our household waste and when added to landfill is broken down and creates methane, one of our worst greenhouse gases," he said.

"The average Victorian household throws out approximately \$2,200 worth of food each year.

"Once your organic waste is collected, it is transported to a state-or-theart organics processing facility located just north of Shepparton where it is processed in a highly controlled environment with zero emissions, and results in a fully certified compost.

"What better way to divert organic waste from landfill than to recycle it into a valuable product."

### 16 Days of Activism - orange the world!

oira Shire Council is participating in 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence, an annual campaign that began on 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, and ends 10 December, Human Rights Day.

This year's theme is *Orange the world: end violence against women now!* Mayor Libro Mustica said the statistics were alarming.

"For the year ending June 2021, in Moira Shire alone there were 495 domestic violence incidents, which is an increase of 8.3%," Cr Mustica said.

Cr Mustica urged residents to register their interest in an online Family Violence Webinar, hosted by Council with support from Victoria Police, Women with Disabilities Victoria, Department of Families, Fairness and Housing, and Women's Health Goulburn North East.

"This free webinar will be held on Wednesday 1 December beginning at 11am and will go for one hour," he said.

"There will also be an opportunity to ask questions of the panel of four guest speakers.

"Councillors will be wearing orange ribbons at the November council meeting, and many of our iconic buildings throughout the shire will be illuminated orange to raise the community's awareness of this issue.

"We also encourage community members to wear something orange on 26 November and share it on social media platforms with the hashtag #moira16days to help promote this campaign."

## Accessible internet during a disaster

oira Shire Council has been successful in a bid for 30 NBN sites where the community can access data in an emergency within the Federal Government's STAND project (Strengthening Telecommunications Against Natural Disasters).

Mayor Libro Mustica said this vital project would ensure no communities in Moira Shire would be left behind during emergencies. "Approval has been given for 30 NBN satellite dishes to be installed to aid the community in accessing the internet during a natural disaster," Cr Mustica said.

"The Federal Government is completely funding this project at a cost of \$21,000 per site, \$630,000 in total.

"The satellites are being installed on various buildings which normally would be used during a natural disaster and other emergencies.

"They will provide constant free access to data, allowing residents to link in with services and family members, but will be accessible only during an emergency event."



### Museum Moments...

#### Can You help???

We are trying to locate a street named **Bouverie Street** within Nathalia township. It was mentioned in an article in the Nathalia Herald from March 1898 and we are unsure of its location. If you know the whereabouts or the story behind the name we would love to hear from you.

The following writing is the article as it appeared in the Nathalia Herald......

"FIRE IN NATHALIA—A four-roomed weatherboard cottage, situated in Bouverie Street, was discovered to be in flames at about 9.50p.m. on Tuesday. Nothing could be done to save the property, which was unoccupied at the time, and in half an hour the building was completely destroyed. The house was formerly occupied by the late Mr Jas A. Greive, solicitor, and contained a large number of his books, documents etc., also a quantity of furniture belonging to Mrs Greive, who has but recently removed to Numurkah.

Mr Rogers had been, during the day, occupied in painting and paper hanging, and some 500 feet of lining boards, paint brushes, 3 step ladders, buckets and other articles, amounting in value to between £6 and £7, were consumed. Fears were entertained at one stage that the surrounding tenements would also catch fire, but a few well directed blows levelled the connecting fences, and prevented the danger. Mr Rogers left the premises at 7 p.m. and noticed no possibility of a disaster.

At about 8 o'clock a man who has hung about the town as an 'odd-jobber' for a few weeks past, and who claimed to be an Alaskan, and who, despite his present poverty and imbecility, seems to have been at one time well educated, and was constantly, muttering about Russian affairs, was observed to enter the dwelling. It was feared that he had been burnt also, as his coat was found outside in the yard, but a careful search among the debris failed to reveal any human remains. The man's whereabouts are still unknown.

The origin of the fire remains a mystery. The building which was owned by Mrs H. M. Muntz was insured."

A review of the Rate Books for the late 1890's shows two entries for the name Greive ...

- 1. Grieve Mary F. A householder who owned her dwelling and the description and situation of the dwelling just listed 'Creek Frontage'.
- 2. Greive James A. No occupation given. Property owned by Thomas Blake and located in Kostadt Street.

The children have been really enjoying our new small scooters, which have helped hugely on coordination and spatial awareness and communication of what and who is around them.


With the work being done to the bigger yard the toddlers are really acknowledging the change within their environment and what has moved or disappeared and what is new,
