

Do you know who invented Milo??

An Australian industrial chemist named Thomas Mayne, who was working at Nestle, came up with the formula for a drink flavouring in 1934. He combined malt extract (made from malted barley) with full cream milk powder, cocoa, sugar, mineral salts, iron and vitamins in an attempt to develop a completely balanced food drink. It was intended to help children to obtain enough nutrients in their diet.

"The first batch was the sweetest thing I've ever tasted," he said. Mayne worked for four years, often up to 80 hours per we ek to develop the formula. The name 'MILO' comes for a character in Greek mythology 'Milon' who was a champion athlete famous for his strength.

Nestle launched the new product at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in 1934. Nestle had taken ownership of a milk processing plant in Smithtown, NSW in 1921 and started producing milo from there soon after the launch.

Milo has since become a household name with the Smithtown factory producing more than 13,000 tonnes of Milo a year by 2021, for distribution in

Australia and New Zealand. Milo is distributed across more than 30 countries around the world with some slight variations to the formula depending on availability of ingredients. Since 2021, Nestle has also produced a dairy-free plant-based version. It also comes as a cereal and a snack bar today.

Thomas Mayne was born in December 1901 in Fosterville Victoria. He is said to have enjoyed a drink of hot milo every night until his death in 1995 in Sydney at the age of 93.

The one thing that really bugged Tom Mayne about Milo was its tendency to float to the top of the milk. Even though the product he invented would in time become a household name, the man behind it spent years trying to overcome this problem.

Mr Mayne's children were no different from generations of Australians: "My brother and I just liked it floating on the top of the milk and eating it with a spoon," his daughter said.

One of my favourite ways to 'eat' Milo is to sprinkle it on ice-cream.

itizen of the Year: Murray Blair

Murray has served as a volunteer with CFA for over 36 years. Born and bred in Swan Hill he spent 8 years in the army before re-settling in Swan Hill running his own Learn to Drive School. He also served in the Swan Hill Urban Brigade and has attended over 3,000 fire calls.

Murray has had extensive experience during fire and flood emergencies in his service to the CFA.

Murray and his wife moved to Barmah in 2013 and purchased a home of their own in 2020. Murray has served as the Captain of Barmah CFA Brigade and is currently the First Lieutenant.

At the start of Barmah's flood crisis Murray was the co-ordinator for all the agencies involved thus providing clarity and continuity in a highly charged and dynamic situation. He organised deliveries of sand bags. Organised food provisions for agency staff. Dealt directly with the Incident Control Centre in Shepparton and organised what assistance and material were needed for Barmah.

He organised ADF personnel to come and sandbag the telephone towers and exchange as communications were vital at this time.

He also directed Parks Victoria and Fisheries & Wildlife crews where sandbags and pumps were required.

Murray's dedication and experience resulted in rapid response times to changing situations and was the contact between the community and the Emergency Services personnel. He was able to get pump equipment to pump out water from various properties and arrange for 24-hour crews to refuel the pumps. He only ceased his attendance for a well-earned rest on Saturday 26 November. He was also available to any community member to provide reassurance, information and or assistance.

Ky-lee Adams was runner up for Citizen of the Year. She was nominated for all her hard work during the floods.













In Late January Barmah CFA received an ultra light 400L tanker to support their main tanker in fire emergencies.

It is part of the Volunteer Emergency Service equipment scheme.

The vehicle is worth approximately \$150 000—\$160 000. The Barmah Brigade raised \$22 500 and the rest was funded by State Government and CFA. It took 5 years of applications before it was approved.

The ultra light vehicle's primary response is for small fires from camp fires and

lightning strikes, particularly in the National Parks.

Nathalia Bowling Club Inc is a Lawn Bowls Club in Nathalia providing sport and social commitment to the whole community of Nathalia to

participate in. The club represents Nathalia in Pennant and Tournaments. The bowling greens are available to schools for students to enjoy Physical Education, for Barefoot Bowls, individual groups, and local clubs for meetings — Nathalia Rotary Australia meet in the club rooms. The Darts club meets fortnightly for Dart nights and the club provides a gathering venue for social interaction in a safe environment for all the local community, of which, all is run by dedicated club volunteers.

The Bowling club was established in 1905 and is independently owned by the Members, who raise funds to finance the club and has provided ongoing sporting and social amenity to the Nathalia community and to the surrounding areas with Pennant and Tournaments being played on a regular basis since the club opened 117 years ago. It is an integral part of the fabric of Nathalia.

### ommunity Event of the Year Winner: Nathalia & District Preschool Early Childhood Road Safety Program

Nathalia & District Preschool is a stand alone, not for profit community-based preschool who are a part of the Goulburn Region Preschool Association (GRPSA) cluster management. Nathalia Preschool employ a bachelor trained teacher and 4 co-educators and offer government funded 3 - and 4-year-old preschool programs over 5 days a week.

Nathalia Preschool are noted for their active community involvement and working with community groups.

In 2022 Nathalia Preschool were successful with their application to Victoria's Early Childhood Road Safety Program, Starting Out Safely, with their inquiry question; How can we build on and promote the children's cycling and scooter skills with the children in our town Nathalia? Through research on children's knowledge and their bicycle/scooter riding skills and in-depth bicycle/scooter program was developed for the children to enhance their road safety knowledge and practical skills. Being active out in community, the children counted traffic that moves through town, practiced being a safe pedestrian, learnt about road and community signs, then embarked on riding their bikes/scooters in community. This included

following all road rules, bike/scooter rules and being a safe bicycle/scooter

rider along side c o m m u n i t y members. This was a l s o a n opportunity to educate our community in relation to children being safe and knowledgeable bicycle/scooter riders.

C o m m u n i t y engagements as the children ride their bicycles/ scooter through our town educates our community

that children are able and capable safe cyclists/scooters. That children can work collaboratively, follow rules, and demonstrate their skills. Feedback from families and community informs us that our program is well planned, children are focussed and learning new skills out in community – real life skills. At the completion of the program, we delivered our presentation in Melbourne to Early Learning Association Australia, Transport Accident Commission, Victoria Police, Early Childhood Professionals and to eight early childhood centres from Victoria. This put our community on a platform.

Nathalia & District Preschool welcomed Ambulance Victoria and Victorian Police into the inquiry program to support the children's learning on being a safe bicycle/scooter rider in community and how they can help themselves and each other in times of need. The program presented the children an opportunity to travel to the Elmore Field Days with their bikes to demonstrate to ELAA (who have a site to promote road safety) and the general public how their skills have developed to being able to ride around the Elmore Field Days site in a safe and responsible manner. This created a lot of interest from people far and wide and promoted the children's learning opportunities and our town Nathalia.

### Community Event of the Year Nomination: Nathalia Night Watch (CWA) – October 2022 Floods

The Country Women's Association Nathalia Night Watch branch (NNWCWA) is an organisation group formed September 2013.

The former Nathalia CWA day branch recognised that their dwindling numbers meant they were unable to continue providing service to the community. It was decided to start an evening branch instead, to attract interested women who were not able to attend the daytime meetings – hence the name Nathalia Night Watch. The new branch was formed and had continued to operate successfully since. The members provide good friendship and support to each other and other women, families, and children in the local community.

During the October 2022 floods the NNWCWA ladies organised a flood recovery group to supply meals/cakes/slices etc to the volunteers filling/laying sandbags for threatened homes and levee banks.

NNWCWA wanted to use the Nathalia Community Centre, the Moira Shire also wanted it as a flood relief centre for victims. The CWA ladies were asked to co-ordinate the supply of meals for the relied centre which they did happily. This saw them feeding displaced flood victims alongside emergency and shire staff. 200-300 meals were fed out most days. Ten people put in 8 hours per day for 2 weeks.






























### **Loch Garry Update**

he Loch Garry Flood Protection District Committee

Met for the second time since the new committee was established on the 11<sup>th</sup> Jan 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The first meeting held on the 15<sup>th</sup> Jan formalised the roles within the committee, Jim Grinter was elected chairman and Roland Huber secretary, Ian and Stuart Grinter will setup a facebook group to assist the Red Gum Courier in providing updates as necessary. The terms of the GMwater Reference group was discussed and a list of members willing to nominate endorsed.

The second meeting held on the 5<sup>th</sup> Feb. revolved around concerns regarding the cost to repair the damaged levee banks, current operating rules and the need to change the rules to reflect the shorter time it takes for the bubble to reach Loch Garry in a major flood event. The 2022 flood was a true indicator of the speed at which the bubble had reached the Loch Garry structure as water was already pouring over the structure after 24 hours of the gauge in Shepparton reaching 10.36m

#### Why the service is being reviewed

It is standard protocol for GMW to review operating procedures after major flood events such as the one experienced in October 2022.

GMW will subsequently be working with Loch Garry Flood Protection customers and relevant agencies to undertake a review of the Loch Garry infrastructure and operating rules.

#### How will the review work?

The Loch Garry Reference Committee will guide the review of the Loch Garry infrastructure and operating rules. The committee is comprised of various stakeholders, customers, and interested community members who will meet regularly to help determine future operations at the loch. There will also be opportunities for people outside the committee to influence the review and have their say on the committee's proposals.

#### Loch Garry operations during the October 2022 floods

The current operating rules require GMW to commence operation of the Loch Garry structure when the Goulburn River reaches 10.36m at Shepparton. The operating rules require progressive removal of the bars (25 bars removed for every 31mm increase in river height) at Loch Garry 24 hours after the river height exceeds 10.36m on the Goulburn River's Shepparton gauge. All bars are to be removed from the structure 24 hours after the river height reaches 10.96m.

The Goulburn River reached 10.36m at the Shepparton Gauge at 12pm on Saturday, 15 October and GMW staff began removing bars from Loch Garry at 12pm on Sunday, 16 October.

Given the magnitude of this flood event staff were able to remove approximately half of the bars at the Loch before the rising water level meant it was physically impossible and unsafe for them to continue.

#### **Background**

Situated at Bunbartha, the Loch Garry flood regulator is a 48 bay structure made up of 8" and 8.5" drop bars. It is operated to achieve the intent of the agreement (1925) between landholders and the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (now GMW), to allow the same proportion out of the lake as flowed into the lake prior to the inception of the levees once the Goulburn River rose to 34ft on the new gauge at Shepparton.

Did you know that Loch Garry has a total discharge capacity of 40 Gigalitres per day through its structure, so at full capacity it would only take 12.5 days to discharge the entire volume of water n Sydney Harbour? A Sydharb is a unit of volume used in Australia for water, especially in dams and harbours. One sydharb (or sydarb), also called a Sydney Harbour, is the amount of water in the Sydney Harbour (Port Jackson): approximately 500 gigalitres (410,000 acre-ft) - en.wikipedia.org






