Lifeguard shortage to impact final weeks of outdoor pool season

ue to lifeguard staffing issues, the operating hours at Moira Shire Council's outdoor swimming pools in Numurkah, Cobram, Nathalia, Strathmerton and Yarrawonga will be adjusted for the remaining four weeks of the pool season.

YMCA Manager Carien Hesselberg said staff levels were much lower than usual this season due to the ongoing challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.

"In addition, as schools and universities return for Semester 1, a number of younger staff will no longer be available to work, or will have a reduced capacity to do so, during the last weeks of the outdoor pool season," Ms Hesselberg said. "The staffing issue we are now experiencing, is also reflected in the wider aquatic and recreation industry at present.

"We are also working through the new Victorian Government third dose COVID-19 vaccination requirements and how that may further impact our service delivery."

Ms Hesselberg said operating hours at the outdoor pools would continue to be reviewed over the last four weeks of the season in line with available staff levels.

"Weekends, school and community events are still being planned however we are asking patrons to check regularly with their local pool for the latest changes," she said.

"If vacancies can be filled, more services may once again be offered.

"Water safety is always our highest priority, and we understand the expectation from our community for pools to be open as normal.

"The reality is, there isn't enough staff to operate seven days a week across all townships, and to do so safely."

Moira Shire Council CEO Clare Keenan said the decision to adjust pool opening hours was unfortunate but necessary.

"Our pools are much-loved and well-used by our community, and we'll continue to work in partnership with the YMCA to overcome the staffing issues if possible," Ms Keenan said.

Qualified lifeguards are welcome to apply for casual work to help support the local outdoor pools during the last weeks of the season.

Moira successful in retaining revenue from state government

The Victorian State Government will continue paying rates for social housing properties throughout Moira Shire, despite a proposed regulation that would require all councils to take over this cost.

Mayor Libro Mustica said Councillors and staff had strongly lobbied the state government and was pleased to see Moira Shire Council, along with several other regional and rural councils, now exempt from this proposed regulation.

"This is a big win for us," Cr Mustica said.

"If we had not fought for this exemption, it would have cost Council approximately \$3.5 million over ten years in lost revenue, which would have put a huge amount of pressure on our financial security.

"In addition, we are pleased the state government has also waived the 1.75 per cent Developer Levy for projects in Moira Shire, which means real estate developers will be encouraged to look at opportunities in our area instead of the metropolitan region."

CEO Clare Keenan said the new levy would have been required from all developers as of 2024 in new projects with three or more dwellings or three or more lot subdivisions, however through extensive lobbying, Moira Shire Council was now exempt.

"Developers still need to pay this levy for projects in metropolitan areas with the funds going to help finance social housing," Ms Keenan said.

"With these exemptions it is now imperative Council progresses its strategic planning and has suitability zoned land available throughout or shire for appropriate and sustainable development.


"Migration to Moira Shire increased by 42% between 2019 and 2021 and these exemptions make Moira Shire the destination place for developers outside of Metropolitan Melbourne."

everyone and that it would an interesting, challenging and rewarding profession for girls and



MELBA AND THE BENDIGO CHIMES.



The latest in young farmers news. We had our first gathering of the year on the first Friday of February by travelling over to Yarrawonga for a lovely relaxing evening fish and chips by the



lake, and long chats catching up on what everyone is up to these days. This led to a discussion of camping and another gathering in the making. On the weekend of February the 12th young farmers went out for couple nights to a lovely camp near Ulupna Island along the banks of the Murray river

Casting the fishing rods with no succession of any nibbles from fish, roasting some scrumptious lamb for dinner and enjoying a few yarns around the fire of the evenings. It was a great weekend had by the young farmers.

The Perfect Fruit Fly Season

The shortage of workers is making it hard to run a coffee shop, pick fruit in orchards, or meet the demand for tradies. These problems are serious; however, another major impact of labour shortages is the kick-along all that unpicked or fallen fruit is giving to a major orchard pest: the fruit fly. When there are sufficient pickers, there is not much fruit left on trees or on the ground. When there is a huge shortage of pickers however, there are tonnes of fruit left to over-ripen on the trees and fall to the ground.

All this fruit combined with the unusually humid year means we have all the right conditions for an explosion of fruit fly both now and in the next season.

Whether you have one fruit tree or an orchard, everyone is responsible for trying to eradicate the fruit fly. Unfortunately, however it is now more difficult than it once was to tackle insects and other pests. Where once some pesticides could be used to kill the fruit fly, many of these

chemicals are now banned as they are dangerous to human health or the environment. New control methods now have to be developed and the problem addressed in "area wide management plans".

The National Biosecurity Award presented to the Goulburn Murray Victoria Fruit Fly Program in 2021 acknowledged the superb area management work done locally to remove over 100,000 neglected fruit trees, and to raise awareness of fruit fly with over 3000 volunteers helping to spread the word. So, locals are doing a great job, but this season we face the

extra problem of tonnes of unpicked fruit and high humidity.

Let's all renew our efforts to dispose of fallen fruit, making sure that if it is already infested with fruit fly it is sealed into a plastic bag and left in the hottest places to kill the pests. And if the cockies and corellas are taking all your fruit anyway, reconsider if you really need to keep that old fruit tree out the back.

Help protect our waterways from harmful water hyacinth and salvinia

griculture Victoria has launched an advertising campaign targeting the online sale of water hyacinth and salvinia, two of Victoria's highest priority aquatic noxious weeds.

The two-month long campaign will raise awareness of the impact these weeds have on waterways and encourage reporting of detections so that Agriculture Victoria can remove infestations to prevent further spread and impacts to water quality and use.

Agriculture Victoria's Biosecurity Manager Angela Constantine said the sale of these aquatic State prohibited weeds creates the potential for them to spread throughout Victoria, which could have economic and environmental impacts on a large scale.

"These weeds may look attractive, but they quickly spread to cover and block waterways, which harms native plants and wildlife and reduces water quality for farming and recreation," Ms Constantine said.

Water hyacinth and salvinia are primarily spread by people buying and selling them as pretty water plants for ornamental ponds, dams and aquariums.

"It is illegal to buy, sell or give away water hyacinth or salvinia in Victoria, however in most cases home gardeners are unaware of potential harmful impacts of these weeds and are unknowingly growing it." Ms Constantine said.

The Victorian Government takes responsibility for the safe treatment, removal and disposal of State prohibited weeds such as water hyacinth and salvinia, at no cost to the landowner.

"Agriculture Victoria wants to work with the community to help protect our waterways and protect Victoria from emerging weed incursions," Ms Constantine said.

If you suspect you have water hyacinth or salvinia on your property, please take a photo of the suspect plant, and email it to weed.spotters@agriculture.vic.gov.au, or call the Customer Contact Centre on 136 186. The Spider that Weaves in Gold

Right now, if you are lucky, you might sight a large female Golden Orb Spider Nephila edulis on its web, the web glinting gold in the sunlight. You will need to see the Red Gum Courier photo in colour to see this photo of the shining golden web – such a large fairytale web for a scary - looking spider. The body of the spider is about the size of an olive.

Go to www.nbbt.org.au and select the Red Gum Courier to download this edition or click on the Quick Response Code in this edition.

The accompanying photos are of a Golden Orb Spider in our front yard. Although large and frightening looking, the spider is **not** aggressive and is reluctant to bite. It will shake its web if you come close, warning you to stay away. If you accidentally run into a web and are bitten, the bite is **not dangerous**. You don't need to panic.



These spiders are beneficial in the garden, getting rid of flies and insects that you may not want around. The insects may end up as

part of a food cache, a string of web-bound insects that the spider arranges to feed on at a later date. Photos: Lyn Loger

How long can they live? Around 12 months. The female spider stays on her web, unlike the Garden Orb Spider that consumes its web before dawn each day and then weaves it again at night time.

What does the male look like? It's tiny, no more than 6mm – for mating, it will stay around the perimeter of the web, waiting its chance to mate with the big female. Sexual cannibalism is generally uncommon with these females.

The web is a complex one; it has extra web lines positioned beyond the 'orb', the large main circle web. These lines are there as web barriers for birds and wasps that might come and eat or attack the spider. However, there is a wasp that, if it gets through the barrier, will tweak the perimeter of the web to mimic an insect struggling. When the spider comes to kill its prey, the tables are turned - the wasp has tricked it; it stings the spider and carries it off.

These spiders can be found all over Australia.

Nephila edulis – it's not a scientific name given randomly. The edulis does mean edible! In 1799, the French biologist, Jaques Labillardiere, saw native people eating these spiders in New Caledonia. ~ Lyn Loger


Regan Qualifies for World Championships
