Loch Garry Flood Protection District Meeting

large crowd of 100 turned out Wednesday evening, 11th of January to the Kaarimba Hall concerned about the future operations of the Loch Garry Flood protection scheme and costs to repair the levee banks destroyed by the recent floods.

Jim Grinter was unanimously appointed to chair the meeting. Thoughts were given to those whom have lost their homes and the tragic drowning of one of the local residents.

The recent flood was similar to that of 1974. 740 meters of levee banks were destroyed in total, of which 340m are at Loch Garry, who will pay for the repairs? Will LGFPD rate payers be consulted prior to repairs?

Mackenzie Craig spoke of the GM-Water Reference Committee with nominations closing on the 20th January and the importance of it being represented by Loch Garry fee rate payers with the right qualifications to

be accepted by GM-Water. The new Loch Garry Flood Protection District (LGFPD) Committee will assist.





COVID Testing Changes at NCN Health

The Department of Health closed state run PCR COVID testing sites from December 31. PCR COVID testing is the swab test which is taken and sent away for analysis. This means PCR COVID tests will no longer be available at NCN Health after this date.

Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) are currently available free of charge from front reception at each campus, there are no eligibility requirements and you do not have to make an appointment to collect these. If you have COVID symptoms please call ahead to reception to organise a COVID safe pick up of RATs.

Moving forward, the Department of Health together with local governments will increase availability of free RATs to include libraries and customer service centres. Free RATs are expected to be available to all Victorians until June 2023.

To access a PCR COVID test after December 31, you will need to see your GP for a referral. PCR COVID testing will be reserved for people who are at high risk of becoming very unwell from COVID, and/or those who will need anti-viral medication.

Don't Wing It - Beat the Bite

Warm and wet weather means more mosquito biting and breeding, including the ones that can carry diseases that make you sick.

The best protection against mosquitoes and the diseases they can carry is to avoid mozzie a bites.

- Mozzies can bite through tight clothing. Cover up - wear long, loose-fitting clothing.
- Use mosquito repellents containing Picaridin or DEET on all exposed skin.
- Limit outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are about.
- Remove stagnant water where mosquitoes can breed around your home or campsite.
- On holidays make sure your accommodation is fitted with mosquito netting or screens.
- Use 'knockdown' fly spray, mosquito coils or plug-in repellent where you gather to sit or eat outdoors.
- Don't forget the kids always check the

insect repellent label. On babies you might need to spray or rub repellent on their clothes instead of their skin. Avoid applying repellent to the hands of babies or young children.

The best protection against mosquitoes carrying diseases is to avoid bites in the first place.



Wear long, loose-fitting light-coloured clothing and covered shoes outdoors.



Use mosquito repellents containing picaridin or DEET on all exposed skin

Museum Moments...

BUILDING 3rd McCOY'S BRIDGE, 1939-1942

The Country Roads Board was in charge but who actually built it?

Research has shown that the old bridge building firm of Hardys Ltd of Wagga, NSW won the contract. An ancestor, Mr. Charles Hardy had begun bridge building in 1856 and it was his descendant, another Charles Hardy, who was the principal of Hardy Davis Pty Ltd in 1939. At the same time (1939) Hardy Davis Pty Ltd won the contract to build a concrete and steel bridge over the Murray River at Nyah near Swan Hill.

Mr. Syd Limbrick, a worker on the erection of McCoy's Bridge, when interviewed by the Nathalia & District Historical Society circa 2001, made the assertion that Mr. Hardy was taken to court over the hire of plant, that he lost the case and had to pay by instalments because he had lost a lot of money with the floods. Syd also spoke of "the Contractor" in relation to the cutting of red gum suckers for scaffolding, whi ch showed local knowledge was the key factor in acquiring the suckers...something which was unlikely to be attributed to a Wagga person.

In the family legends of Mr. Don Spence of Waaia was the story that his grandfather Mr. Carl Albert Spence was a bridge builder and built McCoy's Bridge. The family had no extant written material to confirm this feat. The obituary in the Daily Advertiser for the grandfather, who died at Wagga in June 1943, not long after the bridge was finished, did not mention any bridge building but did mention that the grandfather had worked for

Hardys Ltd for many years. Don and his wife, Jenny, approached the Historical Society to see what information was held by the Society and were directed to the book "McCoy's Bridge Goulburn River Kotupna" recently revised by the author, Lyn Franklin which attributes the bridge building to the Country Roads Board.

The family began to think grandfather Spence was just one of the workers alongside Syd Limbrick, Bert Carland and others on the building project rather than being In charge but not Don, he was adamant that his grandfather did build the bridge. It became a constant topic in the Spence household.

Unfortunately all those men who were involved in the bridge works had passed on so Jenny asked the Historical Society to do further research. In our card index system under "Spence" Don's story was vindicated. There was a small four line entry in the Nathalia Herald dated 13th July 1943:

"Mr C.A. Spence, who recently completed the building of McCoy's bridge over the Goulburn river, died suddenly at Wagga recently.'

Mr. C.A. Spence would have been the Overseer!

Carl Albert Spence was born at Wangaratta and was married at Dongarra, Western Australia to Miss Blanche Criddle. His children at the time of his death were: William (prisoner of war), Harold (Wagga), Constable Carl Spence (Albury), Kenneth (A.I.F.), Ewart (Tocumwal) and Mrs. R. A. Connors (Tumbarumba).

It is this same bridge which has been the subject of much discussion in the news lately being closed off during the floods and afterwards because of possible flood damage.

This bridge was built during the war years when many restrictions were in place. There was no fanfare for its 1942 opening like there had been for the opening of the second McCoy's Bridge in 1903 when the general public was invited to witness the cutting of the ribbon followed by a banquet attended by about fifty gentlemen held in a large marquee at the Wyuna end of the bridge to celebrate the opening.

Such was the thought at the time the old 1903 bridge was left in place as an emergency measure for the duration of the war and wasn't demolished until sometime after March 1945.

Andy Griffiths attending "Juvenilia" exhibition launch at Shepparton Library

hat did Graeme Base, Andy Griffiths or Alison Lester draw when they were kids? An exhibition coming to the Shepparton Library from 19th January to 23rd February will help answer that question. The exhibition, titled Juvenilia, displays works created by these and other notable Australian children's authors and illustrators when they were voung.



Children's Author

Curated by Aimee Chan, this exhibition Andy Griffiths - Australian showcases the juvenilia of Australian

children's authors and illustrators and their early attempts at storytelling. Even the most prominent creators of children's books started as children, dreaming about telling their story through word or art and maybe one day publishing them to share with the world. The works in this collection have kindly been lent for display by their makers, who all want this generation of dreamers to know that everyone has to start somewhere.

The exhibition includes contributions from Andy Griffiths, Alison Lester, Ursula Dubosarsky, Graeme Base, Hazel Edwards, Danny Katz, Kylie Howarth, Aimee Chan, Tim Harris, Oliver Phommavanh, Chris Kennett, Jeremy Lachlan, Trent Roberts, Dianne Wolfer, Craig Sheather, Pinky Wittingslow. The pieces they have contributed vary greatly, depending on the age of the individual at the time. Some of the pieces reflect quite clearly the author or illustrator they have become. Others show mere glimpses, having been created when the artist was much younger.

Curator and author Aimee Chan said "This is a rare and intimate insight into the mind of some of Australia's best children's authors and illustrators. It's so exciting to be able to get a glimpse into the creative process and I'm honoured they have trusted me with these precious pieces."

The Shepparton Library is the first venue Juvenilia will be seen by the public. To celebrate, a launch is planned for 6pm on Thursday 19th January. Andy Griffiths, a major supporter of the exhibition, has agreed to speak at the launch and will be available to sign books during the launch event. Andy Griffiths' Treehouse series has sold millions of books worldwide and is hugely popular with young readers across Australia. Curator and author Aimee Chan will also be present to speak about the exhibition and answer questions. This is a great opportunity to not only see the exhibition on the opening day but find out more about the bookmaking process directly from an author. Everyone is welcome at the launch but if you can't make it, take the time to drop in and browse the

exhibition before it moves to its next location on 23rd February. Entry to Juvenilia is free for viewing during regular library open hours.

Managing Victoria's bushfire risk during wetter seasons and beyond

n open letter from Chris Hardman, Chief Fire Officer, Forest Fire Management Victoria

This year, many Victorians have experienced extreme weather with heavy rain and flooding. Our changing climate means these events are becoming more frequent and extreme.

The recent State of the Climate report by the Bureau of Meteorology and CSIRO confirms that changes to weather and climate extremes are happening at an increased pace across Australia. In the coming decades, we will see an increase in the number of dangerous fire weather days and a longer fire season for southern and eastern Australia.

Even though conditions have been wetter through most of the state this year, Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) has continued to take action to manage bushfire risk.

Victoria is Australia's most bushfire prone state. By investing in prevention, we aim to protect people, property and the environment by reducing the risk and impact of major bushfires. We look for opportunities year-round to conduct planned burns that will protect people, and our environment – including forests, their wildlife and biodiversity – from bushfires this summer and in the drier years to come.

We burn to the conditions, not the calendar. Some burns that were planned for spring may take place this summer if conditions are right and it's safe to do so. Others could take place in autumn next year.

Although we don't expect many long -running or large forest fires this summer, areas across the north and west of the state may see increasing fire potential from mid-summer, especially in areas of high grass growth.

Drier forests, woodlands and heathlands are also at risk of fires with the onset of hot and dry weather conditions.

Going forward, we will prioritise planned burns in places with increased risk.

The wetter weather has presented opportunities

for different types of burning. In some areas, the higher levels of moisture in the soil and natural gullies have allowed our crews to conduct lower intensity burns. The gullies act as natural boundaries for the fire, which is not always possible during drier conditions.

Past events show us that planned burning can reduce the loss and destruction caused by bushfires.

As a world leader in bushfire risk management, we have many different tools in our toolbox. Planned burning is not the only way we manage bushfire risk and reduce fuel like grass, leaf litter, twigs, bark and vegetation. We've increased our use of mowing, slashing and mulching this year.

We've also expanded our network of strategic fuel breaks to better protect against bushfires. These strips of land are in the highest priority locations — close to towns, water catchments and sensitive environments.

We have also upgraded our infrastructure, including forest roads, fire dams and fire lookout towers.

In addition to our bushfire risk management program, FFMVic, together with Country Fire Authority (CFA), is continuing to support Traditional Owners to use cultural fire on Country. Over 200 cultural burns are planned over the next three years.

We work with CFA, Fire Rescue Victoria (FRV), local government and communities to deliver the best local approaches to bushfire risk management in Victoria.

The combination of our actions helps communities and our environment to become more resilient.

Our crews will continue to keep communities safe all year by reducing the risk and impact of bushfires on Victoria's parks, forests and other public land.

While FFMVic does a vital job managing bushfire risk, I encourage all Victorians to ensure they have the right information, tools and actions to prepare for fires.

This means familiarising yourself with the new Australian Fire Danger Rating System. This system is the same across Australia, so you can assess risk and take action if needed, wherever you are.

If you live on or near land that is at bushfire risk, make sure to follow the Fire Ready Kit from CFA. If you're camping this summer, do not leave campfires unattended and make sure the ashes are cool to touch before you leave.

You can find out when planned burns are happening in your area by signing up at plannedburns.ffm.vic.gov.au and make sure you have the VicEmergency app on your phone.

- The **2023** Leadership Program will provide women with support to participate in training and study that accelerates their development as leaders. Participants will also work closely as a group to explore issues impacting rural women, learn from subject matter experts, and connect with other rural women from across Victoria.
- The **2023 Mentoring Program** will pair rural women together for a peer-to-peer exchange of skills and experience. Working with skilled facilitators, participants will identify individual, career or business goals and work to implement change with the support and accountability of

their mentoring partner.

Agriculture Victoria Executive Director, Policy and Programs, Sarah-Jane McCormack said the programs recognise the value of women in our growing agriculture sector.

"Women are essential to our sector's success however Victorian women remain underrepresented in leadership and decision-making roles," said Ms McCormack.

"Today's programs help address that gap by equipping rural women with the skills and confidence to participate in more leadership and decision-making positions."

Since 2017, the Victorian Rural Women's Network has supported 44 women to access best practice leadership development training.

The Network was established in 1986 as a forum for women to share skills, resources and

information for collective benefit. In May this year, the Victorian Government committed a further \$1.38 million so the Network can continue delivering programs.

Participant in the 2022 Leadership Program, Leanne Mulcahy knows first-hand the benefit of the programs.

"Networking and collaboration between rural women leaders is important; it supports development and sustainability for rural industries and communities," said Ms Mulcahy.

Applications for both programs close 5pm on 13 February 2023.







The 2022 70.3 Ironman World Championship

athalia's Regan Hollioake recently competed on the world stage at the 70.3 Ironman World championships in St George, Utah, USA. Regan placed 8th out of 252, in her age group of 30-34 year old Woman and 54th out of 1,843 woman that competed on the day. Regan Qualified for this event back in February 2022 in Geelong, to Qualify you have to win your respective age group overall at an Ironman organised event. The 70.3 consists of a 1.9km swim, a 90km

ride and a 21.1km run, it is called a 70.3 due to the total distance in miles being 70.3.

Regan had suffered a hamstring injury in the months prior, leading to an inability to complete any running prior to race day and limited her capacity and power on the bike. Considering this, the aim of the day was just to enjoy the opportunity and soak up the experience of racing on the world stage. Which was evident as all her race photos show her with a big grin.

Race day started at 4am, where athletes and spectators were ferried to the swim start at Sand Hallow reserve, some 15kms out of town via big Yellow American school buses. The morning of the race was very, very cold with temperatures dipping below freezing as Utah, at an elevation of 900m, was experiencing its first sign of winter with the surrounding mountains covered in Snow. The athletes were trying everything to stay warm including emergency silver blankets which were all handed out to each athlete before the swim start. The race started around 7am with the sun rising shortly after as Regan wave's entered the water.

Regan positioned herself modestly about 30 women back from the front at the swim start, as groups of 5 girls were released every 10 seconds until all were in the water. Regan came out of the water in 4th position, she had swam through those girls and most of the age group in front of that. This is a huge effort as it

is not easy chasing packs and then going past them in the water. Regan's swim had set up her whole day.

The bike course was hilly and was suited to the strong riders. Regan's electronic gears were damaged by the bag handlers when the bike case was searched at customs. It was beyond my ability to fix and the bike shop in Utah seemed to struggle with it as well. Despite salvaging a few gears the day before, the electronics cut completely on race day, leaving her without any functioning gears (a big blow considering the mountains she had to climb up) Regan held on to 5th place after the bike leg and was happy to have the sun giving some warmth for the run leg. The highlight of the bike course included riding up Snow Canyon, where riders were welcomed by traditional Indian dancers, music and smoking ceremony as they whizzed by.

The run course was very spectator friendly, with the athletes coming past a central part of the course 8 times. Regan looked great on the run and hid her injury very well considering the pain she must have been in. She finished the race in a time of 4:46:55 only mere seconds from 7th and 6th place and 9 minutes from the French Winner. Regan had no idea what place she was in and was totally shocked when I yelled to her that she finished in 8th place. With other athletes young and old all competing at the same time it is very

hard to know vour position during the race without outside help. The ironman website crashing with so many people checking it I could not update her with her progress. Regan was the second Australian across the line and a girl she actually beat in Geelong was in 6th place, and the first Aussie home. She spoke with Regan and was happy to get one back on

her after the Geelong race as she lives in Melbourne and had to win a race in Queensland to qualify for the worlds.

Regan and I then enjoyed a fantastic holiday in the States visiting 4 major national parks including Yosemite, Zion, Bryce Canyon and the Grand Canyon, also the Hoover dam and the cities of Las Vegas, Los Angeles and San Francisco, we hired a car and drove to these places which was fantastic. Regan has not stopped training since Utah and is slowly getting on top of her injury, and with her being so close to the pointy end of the field she has decided to go for it again and is looking forward to racing Geelong injury free this February to see if maybe she can qualify for the worlds again.

You may see Regan out on the road on her bike, remember to give plenty of room and be considerate if you see a cyclist, you never know, it could be a potential world champion.
