Yarrawonga to Burramine Adventure Trail officially opened

The Yarrawonga to Burramine Adventure Trail officially opened in December with key contractors and project partners, adjoining residents, students from Yarrawonga College P-12 as well as Federal Member for Nicholls Damian Drum attending the ceremony.

Mayor Libro Mustica said the opening of the trail was the culmination and celebration of a great team effort.

"We now have an awesome new community asset that will benefit visitors and locals alike," Cr Mustica said.

"This trail is the first stage in the large Murray River Adventure Trail, designed to invite a whole new population to experience and appreciate the Murray River environs.

"The trail connects from the Murray Valley Highway onto the magnificent Murray River where you will be able to walk and cycle through beautiful River Red Gum state forests."

Cr Mustica said \$618,000 of funding was provided through the Australian Government under the Murray-Darling Basin Economic Development Program with the total cost of the build more than \$1.27 million.

"These initial works include 13.5km of sealed cycling/walking tracks constructed along the Murray Valley Highway, heading west of Yarrawonga to Burramine," he said.

"In addition, the already existing road and trail networks within the Murray River Park have been highlighted and promoted with signage installed at various key points.

"This trail offers an expanded tourism product for existing users of the Murray River Park and will benefit the various tourism businesses along the trail, as well as the neighbouring and connecting townships, through extending the length of stay with the flow-on boost to the economy and employment.

Museum Moments...

How things have changed......

Upon reading through "Nathalia's History in Print", a book compiled by the Nathalia Genealogy Group, I found a listing of the Kotupna Hotels. Not one, but four Hotels once stood in the Kotupna area.

According to the "Pioneers of Nathalia and District, Book 4", William McCoy was one of the first settlers to select land at Kotupna in the early 1870's. In the early days of settlement there was a punt at the river crossing beside McCoy's selection, connecting Echuca and Kyabram with Nathalia, Numurkah and Cobram. In 1886 Mr. J.K. Taylor erected a bridge over the Goulburn River at this point and the punt became obsolete. The bridge had a lift section in the centre as at the time paddle steamers used the Goulburn River to carry stores to the settlers, and the wool, wheat and other produce to Echuca to the rail head.

A punt or bridge meant the convergence of travellers at one point and so what better place to build a hotel (or wine palace) to provide refreshments or accommodation for weary travellers. William McCoy had excised from his holding one and half acres for the establishment of a Rural Inn.

On the same day in March 1878 two men applied for and were granted licenses for a hotel each at McCoys Bridge, one belonging to William McCoy named the 'Bridge Hotel' and the other to William Ruler carrying the name of the 'Kotupna Hotel'. Mr Ruler also conducted a 'Rural Store' in conjunction with his hotel. Both hotels were situated on the east side of the Goulburn River, one on each side of the road.

By 1881 there were four licensed hotels at Kotupna.

- 1. William Hurndell had the <u>Commercial Hotel</u> near the present sites of the school and hall.
- 2. William McCoy still owned the Bridge Hotel.
- 3. Murdock McLennan had the Kotupna Hotel.
- 4. Timothy O'Hanlon had the Shamrock Hotel which was situated near the Deep Creek.

The Bridge Hotel was run by William McCoy until 1886 when it was taken over by D.S. McDonnell, with Jeremiah Ruler being the licencee from 1891 onwards. Janet Ruler purchased the Bridge Hotel in1894. Later the hotel was occupied as a private residence by Mr. J. Johns but was destroyed by fire in 1915.

The Kotupna Hotel at McCoys Bridge, which had been in the hands of William Ruler, was in 1881, passed to Murdock McLennan until it changed hands again in 1887 to John Doncon. Thomas Henneberg was the licensee from 1890 and J.D. Ruler in 1893.

William Hurndell continued at the Commercial Hotel until 1890, when Joseph Cox became the licensee. William Hurndell was back again in 1893, finally relinquishing the hotel to Alexander Campbell in 1895.

The Shamrock Hotel seems to have operated for a short time only and the licence was not renewed after 1881.

Family connections...... William Ruler's wife Janet was the sister of Murdock McLennan.

Steve Brooks Endorsed As Liberal Candidate For Nicholls

obram Secondary College teacher, and local farmer 38 year old Stephen Brooks has been endorsed as the Liberal Party candidate for Nicholls in the upcoming Federal Election.

"I am determined to meet as many people as soon as possible, and I also want people to connect with me on social media. The election could be as early as March so there is no time to lose," he said.

undertaken by Ash at Nathalia Fert and Grain with the help of the Wazer Family.


Stripping was carried out by Dan Wiltshire and his crew with chaser and field bins included in a busy year, thanks Dan.



participation and sends you your own result via email each time you come along. There are 438 parkrun events in Australia, and more than 90 in Victoria, so wherever you go you can use the same barcode.




