

Museum Moments...

An article taken from the Nathalia Herald dated 9/2/1897, written by J. Ned..

Many farmers and horsebreeders have expressed their disapproval of the bicycle, on the grounds that it interferes with the sale of horses, but, notwithstanding, a few of the local farmers have adopted it as a means of locomotion. No doubt this mode of transit is infinitely preferable to the hiring of some of the horses that are— or were— in Nathalia. The bicycle, though, has its drawbacks, and one not infrequently hears of a rider, through breakage of his machine, having to walk a number of miles to complete his journey, and having, also, to carry his 'bike' with him. In such a case a horse would certainly be better of the two, as, no doubt, it would not be so liable to puncture and break as the bicycle.

This bicycle was bought by Augie Dohnt in England in 1905/06 for his sister Minnie.

When the chain guard broke Augie made a new one out of tin. The wheels were eventually replaced as the spokes fell out of the original ones.

Minnie rode her bike until approx 1971. Minnie died in 1976 at the age of 87 and her bike is now at the Nathalia Historical Society Museum.



Chinese New Year!

T t brings in the Year of the Rabbit.

Sunday, 22nd January and the Chinese Guardian Lions danced to loud music (cymbals, gongs and drums) up and down Melbourne's Little Bourke Street and surrounds throughout the day.

It's a free family event full of joy and colour.

The loud music and the setting off of fireworks at the end of each dance session are meant to scare any evil spirits away.

The mythological Chinese Lions symbolise power and wisdom in Chinese culture. They danced (each supported by two dancers) on this day to chase away harmful influences and bring good luck to the year. It's a stunning spectacle regularly repeated during the day.

The enormous, brightly coloured Chinese Dragon followed on along the street to bring good luck and protection. It is not feared, but admired and welcomed; it does not breathe fire like the Western Dragon, but clouds and water-related substances. Many pat it for luck.

Though the street is crowded, goodwill abounds. A lunch of pork buns and Peking Duck pancakes, easily purchased in the surrounding shops, is not to be missed. Traditional dancing and music featured as well, with stalls full of enticing puppets and good luck items for purchase.

This is an annual, public event, well worth knowing about, for those in the Nathalia community who would like to be caught up in such a wonderfully joyful, traditional, Chinese celebration.



Vic beekeepers can apply to move hives from NSW

rom Monday 23 January, beekeepers with Victorian registered hives can apply for a permit to move their hives from New South Wales (NSW) into Victoria.

In a milestone for the national varroa mite eradication response, there is now national acceptance that the state of NSW is free from the pest, apart from those areas within a 25 km radius of an infected hive.

Acting Chief Plant Health Officer Dr Stephen Dibley said this national decision has been made following extensive surveillance showing with 99.99 per cent confidence that varroa mite is not present in the NSW 'blue zone'.

"Victoria welcomes this announcement, and we can now begin assessing permit applications to move hives from NSW into Victoria that were unable to cross the border prior to the national acceptance of area freedom in NSW's blue zone," Dr Dibley said.

"Initially, only Victorian registered hives in the blue zone that can demonstrate compliance with testing and traceability requirements will be able to be moved," Dr Dibley said.

In the coming weeks, non-Victorian registered hives will also be able to apply for a permit to enter Victoria.

"While hives in the blue zone are of low risk, Victoria is maintaining a cautious and staged approach to welcoming hives from NSW to ensure that biosecurity risks can be appropriately managed."

"There will also be an increased testing regime required for all hives moving into Victoria."

It is every beekeeper's responsibility to ensure they are up to date with current movement requirements before moving their bees and related items.

All movement requests will be subject to strict permit conditions and active compliance checks.

Beekeepers are reminded that a <u>health certificate</u> must be obtained for all movements of bees, bee products and used fittings (beekeeping equipment) into Victoria.

Only in Nathalia.





