



Auseum Moments...

Brought to you by Jeanette Holland on behalf of the Nathalia & District Historical Society.

Recent investigations by our researcher Lyn Franklin has found the location of two brickyards in early Nathalia. Thank you Lyn for this information. 1. The first brickyard was located on Richardson Street between North Street and the Creek. This was before Richardson Street had even been planned. A notice in the Nathalia Herald dated 15/09/1887 stated "BRICKS! BRICKS!! BRICKS!! Having purchased the Brickyard lately occupied by Mr A. Minchin, we are now prepared to supply well burned bricks in any quantity on the shortest notice. Neeld Bros."

Again in the Nathalia Herald 15/03/1888 - "Humberstone & Trethowan, acting under instruction of Mr A. Minchin (who is leaving the colony to move to NSW) will sell the whole of his property in Nathalia. Gigantic Clearing Sale—20 township allotments, Shop in Blake St., Cottages in Kostadt St., Saleyards, Brickyards, Horses, Buggies, Furniture etc. Details—66 feet of Creek frontage on which are the Nathalia Brickyards, together with 20,000

A report in the Nathalia Herald 19/09/1889—"Mr Frederick Neeld has had his brickyard flooded and upward of 40,000 bricks ruined. He had erected a four foot bank around the yard, but early yesterday morning the floods broke through, and in a few hours all was desolution and ruin."

Mr Frederick Neeld, brickmaker, arrived in Nathalia in 1885. An obituary printed in the Nathalia Herald 16/06/1925 tells the story of one of Frederick Neeld's sons. Joseph George Neeld, second son of Frederick and Mrs Eliza Neeld was born at Dunolly 68 years ago (1857). After moving to Nathalia in 1885 as a builder and contractor Joseph left his mark on Nathalia. His first work was the erection of the Enterprise Flour Mill for Mr E. Richardson. Following this he built the Roman Catholic Church, took part in the building of several banks, did town channeling and built many fine country residences. When Rev. Morrison was met with building difficulties on a project to build the Parish Hall in Nathalia, Joseph Neeld came to his rescue. Though he had not laid a brick for many years, Joseph ensured

the hall was quickly built and remains today a monument in his memory. He left a wife and daughter to mourn his death. Pictured above - Harry Neeld, E. A. Neeld, Frederick Neeld, George W. Neeld and Joseph G. Neeld, and the hut in which they lived at Wyalong. This would be similar to their hut at the brickyards in Nathalia.

2. The local Rate records from 1896 show Mr John Bennet, 'brickmaker' paying rates on a dwelling and brickyard (owner listed as Muntz Bros, Auctioneers). By 1898 Bennett is listed as the owner and ratepayer of this dwelling and brickyard. This brickyard was located in Weir Street, north west of Bourke Road. There was a pit dug for extracting clay located on the site. Mr John Henry Bennett, bricklayer, was born in Fitzroy Melbourne in 1870. He and his wife Isabella, nee Russell, had six children born in Barwo, Nathalia. One of his daughters died at 4 months of age from pneumonia. John Bennett had died by 1902. His brickyard had moved into the ownership of Ritchie Bros by 1905 as an advert in the Numurkah Leader 23/06/1905 shows "Wanted 'Two Good Moulders', Apply to Ritchie Bros. Brickvards, Nathalia."

On to the rotational moulding ovens where the tanks are made, and into the purpose-built warehouse where 6000 different parts are kept. These are used by the assembly team for the manufacture of weed sprayers, fire-fighters, diesel tanks and dust-

suppression units.
