# Commission of Inquiry into Moira Shire Council

Frances O'Brien KC (Chair) and Mr John Tanner AM, handed their report to the Minister for Local Government who tabled it in parliament. It passed through both houses of parliament, where they accepted the commissioners recommendations; one of those recommendations is that all councillors be dismissed and an administrator/administrators be appointed for a period of up to 5 ½ years.

Roland spent many hours reading through the 179 page report rather than reading all the headlines in mainstream media to form an opinion. The Red Gum Courier (RGC) has decided to find a positive approach to the situation rather than post dramatic headlines, The RGC noted that many issues raised were of an historical nature and acknowledges the hard work and changes over the past 18 months that Moira Shire Council (MSC) CEO Clare Keenan has put into place to address the issues identified. The RGC also acknowledges the difficulty and pain that will be experienced when implementing employment agreements, protocols and procedures to comply with evolving standards and performance based employment.

Through its own experience Nathalia Printers was removed from the list of suppliers to the

n Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> March, Commissioners MS MSC after failing to comply to all the criteria set out in the tender process for printing, it was heart breaking to see how many local businesses went through the same experience, and were given no reason or support by the MSC. Recently Roland approached MSC CEO Clare Keenan who was unaware of what had happened and after a chain of emails assured Roland that changes were being put into place to provide extensive support to local MSC businesses to ensure that all businesses have the support to successfully complete tender processes and are fairly treated to supply goods and services to the MSC.

> The RGC is confident that the administrator/ administrators will encourage and assist with the development and training of good strong community leaders to bring the Moira Shire into a new era where it will continue to be a great place to live and work.

> The MSC has responded to the RGC's request for comment.

## **Barwo Update**

hank you to the community for attending the public meeting on 22 March, and for ideas and suggestions on the night and since. We had more than 130 people attend. A report on the meeting was in the last edition of the

Barwo's Committee of Management has been working on plans for Barwo's future for some time. We have three challenges - we need more residents, we need more staff, and we need funding to upgrade the building. And we need all three at the same time.

More people are now choosing to stay at home and access Home Care supports, rather than move into aged care. When residents move in they are older and require more support. We used to have people move in when in their 70's and stay with us for years. Now they move in in their late 80's and stay with us for months. Instead of needing two or three new residents each year we need to find 10 or 12 or even more a year.

The changes to aged care regulations will require us to have a Registered Nurse on site 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We have been advertising regularly in newspapers, on websites like Seek and through recruiting agencies, but without success.

Barwo Homestead is not equipped for higher care needs. Barwo is a not-for-profit 20 bed facility funded by the Commonwealth government. It was built to provide low care. The new regulations and government policy require that incoming residents are able to "age in place" meaning that they stay in the same facility as their needs increase. Building upgrades will be needed for Barwo to provide all levels of care.

Late 2021 we sought accounting and business advisory services from Price Waterhouse Cooper. Part of the process was a performance survey with StewartBrown. We received their joint report in March 2022. The report noted our difficulty maintaining occupancy levels due to COVID restrictions and decreasing demand for low care services as potential residents look to remain home and use home care services. It also noted our strong financial position. It assessed the number of aged care beds in our area and found there is one bed for every 6 people aged over 75.

We then employed a consultant, Cube Group, to help us assess in more detail options for Barwo. That process commenced in March 2022, followed by meetings and workshops. Their final report in November 2022 gave a recommendation to focus on higher care residents and developing shared services via partnerships with other providers.

In 2021 and 2022 we explored providing independent living accommodation. It would require more residents and more staff, as well as needing financial outlay that we feel may be better spent on upgrading the Homestead.

Throughout this time the number of residents has been declining and we had been unable to recruit Registered Nurses. When at the end of January 2023 we learnt that we would be losing two staff members, knew bluow easily



quickly replace them.

We sought advice from the Department of Health and Aging and from the peak body for aged care providers. We were advised to find other facilities to take all residents with higher care needs to ensure their safety. This was a sudden impact on our planning. It was and is upsetting for everyone involved.

The Committee is continuing to work on options for Barwo. We are investigating upgrading the building to meet high care needs and the requirement to "age in place", applying for the 12 month exemption to the RN staffing requirement, merging with another facility, providing NDIS services, and becoming a Supported Residential Service. We will reach out to community members for expertise and assistance as we work on these options and any other opportunities. All options will need sufficient residents to be viable, most will need more staff and some will need alterations to the building.

Although residents are moving out, and staff are finishing up, we can retain our registration as an aged care provider for 12 months. We will continue working on the next phase for Barwo.

### Museum Moments...

#### Brought to you by Jeanette Holland on behalf of the Nathalia & District Historical Society.

Looking back 100 years at an article in the *Shepparton Advertiser*, from March 1922. How times have changed.....

"NATHALIA ..... At a meeting of the progress association it was decided to hold a district demonstration with the object of urging the Railways Department to provide a daily train service in lieu of the present one of four days a week.

At the annual meeting of the Nathalia Agricultural Society the following officers were elected—President, Mr. W. Thompson; vice presidents,—Messrs J. Minchin and J. Thompson; treasurer, Mr. J.J. McCarron; auditors, Messrs W. Henley and T. Cocks. The profit for the year was £40. The date of the next show was fixed for October 12. The president, vice-presidents and Messrs G.J. and WJ.H. Tuckett and J. Ball were appointed delegates to the Farmers' Convention. A gold chain was presented to Mr. George Jackson who is leaving on a trip to England.

A public meeting, attended by between 300 and 400 leading citizens of the district and the principal townspeople, was held on Thursday to protest against the unsatisfactory train service from Numurkah to Picola. The president of the Shire of Numurkah (Cr. T. Thornton) presided. The following motion, moved by Mr. George Jackson, president of the Nathalia branch of the Farmers' Union, seconded by Mr. E.A. Neeld, president of the

National Federation, was agreed to unanimously:

"That a deputation from this large meeting, representing Nathalia, Picola, Waaia, Barmah, Kotupna, and Yalka, and the whole of the surrounding district, comprising about 400 square miles, interview the Premier (Mr Lawson) for the purpose of urging that the former train service of six days a week be reinstated instead of the present unsatisfactory service."

It was pointed out that the line was a paying one, but the farmers were leaving the district and settling elsewhere on account of the indifferent train service."

If for our Board Meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> March. All members were in attendance, as was Assistant Governor Lorraine Greenwood.

A number of items were talked about at this meeting: Show and Shine, Heart to Heart, 60<sup>th</sup> birthday, to name a few. The president, secretary and treasurer all gave their reports also.

Portsea Camp was something we supported for a good number of years then Covid reared its ugly head and put a stop to this for a few years. President Loula got word about a camp that will take place in April and once there is something more positive to report on this, it will be in the Rotary News.

In my last article I wrote that there were no immediate bookings at the heart house, after the 26<sup>th</sup> of February. Well that wasn't the case for too long; two bookings came in for March. First lot of guests are booked between 7<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> and the next lot will spend the last two nights of March at Barmah.

One of the reasons we had a special visitor was so that we could learn about the Emergency Services Foundation project called "Tony's Trek". ESF wants to raise awareness about the terrible toll emergency service work can take on the people...paid and volunteer...who are always ready to protect us. It is hoped that "Tony's Trek"...one step at a time, a solo walk of 1440km will do that.

Tony Pearce's volunteer role as ESF chair is profoundly personal as he has been in the sector for almost forty years. He has seen many of his colleagues suffer from trauma due to their role in emergency services/ management. Mental health injury is often the result of such trauma and it can have lasting impacts throughout their career and retirement.

Tony's walk starts today, 10<sup>th</sup> March, at the State Control Centre; the route was specifically chosen to cover much of the area where the Victorian Black Summer Bushfires occurred. Tony hopes this will acknowledge the horrible mental health impacts those fires had and continue to have on emergency workers, along with the community members themselves of these areas. The walk will take 50 days and will cover nearly 1440kms.

Our Rotary club will acknowledge the fantastic work of our State emergency services at our Show and Shine on March 19<sup>th</sup>. AG Lorraine has asked for a site and here she will arrange for a marquee to be set up with paraphernalia relevant to supporting our emergency services workers. She also hopes to have some emergency services personnel at the event and donations to "Tony's Trek", from visitors to the Show and Shine, will be most gratefully accepted.

Television advertising for the Show and Shine starts this weekend; there is plenty of other advertising being done too, in print form. Thank you to all involved. The raffle is another form of advertising and we thank everyone who has thus far supported us by purchasing tickets; hopefully tickets will continue to sell well, outside TJ's and at the event. We also hope that the day will be a great success so good profits can be made for community and other Rotary projects.


## Men's Shed News

X-Ray services will be unavailable at Nathalia Campus from Tuesday March 7. X-Ray services have been running at Nathalia for a half day on Tuesday afternoons with staff provided by GV Health. Unfortunately, due a shortage of Radiographers across the region, GV Health cannot currently support the service in Nathalia.

NCN Health is working to recruit more staff to secure X-Ray locally. Community members can access X-Ray at Numurkah Campus 1.5 days per week; on Monday (half day) and Thursday 9.30am – 2pm and at Cobram Campus 5 days a week (Monday to Friday).

X-Ray is also available through GV Health in Shepparton.




# Pride of the Murray Sinks in the Thomson River



The next challenge for SMOTA House Leaders - the Cross Country. Will St Elizabeth or St Francis captains get the chance to stake the podium at this





#### **Water Buybacks**

Last week, Water Minister, Tanya Plibersek, placed on record that the purchase of water will be needed to reach all targets.

However, I strongly believe most of the Murray Darling Basin plan can be completed without more buybacks which will further damage irrigation communities and push up prices of basic food for already struggling Australians. We can complete the plan over the next two years by investing in water saving projects.

The Albanese Government seems hellbent on meeting a June 2024 deadline by ripping apart regional communities by buying more than 60GL of water.

Around \$22 billion is produced at the farmgate across the Murray Basin which flows on to create around \$80 billion for our regional towns.

We cannot afford to lose this economic driver and i'm demanding the Labor Government start listening to the regions and take buybacks off the table.
