

Moira Shire Messages

Japanese encephalitis protect yourself against mosquito bites

here are now multiple confirmed cases of the Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV) in Victoria and Moira Shire Council is calling on all members of the community to be aware but not alarmed.

Mayor Libro Mustica said JEV was a rare but potentially serious infection of the brain caused by a virus spread to humans through mosquito bites.

"Council has been informed JEV has been detected in pigs in Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland," Cr Mustica said.

"While the majority of people infected with JEV will not develop any symptoms at all, the small percentage who do will experience severe infection with symptoms including headache, vomiting, disorientation, seizures, and coma.

"In the most serious of cases there may be permanent neurological complications and death."

Cr Mustica said the Department of Health messaging indicated people living along the Murray River may have an increased risk.

"People who go camping, work or spend time outdoors need to be mindful," he said.

"People who work with or are in contact with pigs may also be at increased risk of infection.

"But there are easy steps to take to minimise any risks.

"These steps include – wear long, loose fitting clothes outdoors; use effective mosquito repellents containing picaridin or DEET on all exposed skin; mosquito coils can be effective in small outdoor areas; and try to limit outdoor activity if large numbers of mosquitoes are present."



Residents have been able to move freely around the facility and grounds, enjoying the beautiful gardens and each others company. Family and friends have been able to visit, the requirements changing according to Covid impact in the community and in line with government legislation.

Rotary clubs (including ours) across the nation support Operation Cleft Australia, which has been going for over 17 years. Cleft births occur in about 700 across the globe in Australia, Europe, Africa, Bangladesh. Despite the amount of research, there is no clear understanding why Cleft births happen. It is the fourth most common birth defect all over the world. In fact, it is estimated that a child somewhere in the world is born with a cleft every 3 minutes. This year Operation Cleft Australia's mission is to provide free, cleft repair surgeries for the underprivileged children of Bangladesh...providing hope and an

opportunity to live normal and meaningful lives. There may be more written about this cause in a future column.

Growing the careers of Victoria's young farmers

Young farmers across the state can now apply for the 2022 Upskill and Invest Young Farmers Scholarships to help their



careers grow and support their contribution to Victoria's vibrant agriculture sector.

Launching this year's scholarship program today, Agriculture Victoria's Acting Executive Director of Agriculture Policy, Dr Julie Simons encourages young farmers to apply for the scholarships that will allow them to take the next steps in their agricultural careers.

"In an industry that is undergoing constant evolution, fostering our young talent and giving them tools to thrive and succeed is vital," said Dr Simons.

Under the program, which has awarded 89 scholarships since 2015, eligible young farmers can boost their skills and careers with up to \$10,000 each to *upskill* through training or education, and to *invest* onfarm or for further professional development.

In 2021, thirteen young farmers were awarded scholarships covering the breadth of Victoria's agriculture regions and industries including beef, sheep, cropping, horticulture, dairy, viticulture and aquaculture.

The scholarship program has supported these farmers to upskill in topics such as agribusiness, livestock management, and farm business management. Following on, scholarship recipients often invest in professional development or business planning, or in on-farm initiatives such as electronic ID tags, digital scales or consultant support.

Applications for this year's round of scholarships are open to farmers aged 35 or under who have been working in farm businesses for at least three days a week for the past three months, with at least two years total experience on-farm.

The Victorian Government is continuing to modernise the agriculture industry, undertaking work to deliver the agriculture skills for the future through initiatives like the Young Farmers Scholarship Program, and the Young Farmer Business Bootcamps, Young Farmer and New Entrant Mentoring Program and the Young Farmers Advisory Council.

Priestly warns of misinformation in Nicholls campaign

Independent candidate for Nicholls Rob Priestly has today warned voters to be ready for the major parties to unleash a barrage of campaign misinformation in the lead up to the federal election.

The warning follows multiple polls indicating that the contest is already tight, and momentum building for Mr Priestly two months from polling day.

"They're certainly very worried about losing Nicholls, and will become increasingly desperate as the campaign gets into full swing."

"The Coalition won't be letting go of this seat lightly, and I'm expecting them to pull out a campaign of misinformation like we've never seen before in Nicholls. They are masters of negative campaigning and will reach deep into the bag of dirty tricks to get the result they want."

He flagged two issues on which the misinformation would be most prominent.

"People will be told that I'm a Labor stooge and that I'm being financially supported by groups like Climate 200 or GetUp. These things aren't true, but the Coalition will hope that if they throw enough mud at least some of it will stick."

"The truth is that I'm the son of dairy farmers from Katandra and a businessman, and I'm running because I want to change the way this region is represented in Canberra."

"I'm also not taking money from people or groups outside the electorate. My supporters live here and run businesses here, and they are motivated for change. It's a real grassroots movement."

Mr Priestly acknowledged that political misinformation is part of modern political campaigning, but wouldn't be buying into the same approach.

"In business, you can't tell lies to consumers or the ACCC will come after you. Unfortunately, there are no such restrictions in politics. The major parties will say whatever they think they need to in order to win the election."

"I want to bring a higher standard to politics. Our approach will be to talk about the positive things that can come from voting for a credible alternative to the major parties. This region is full of opportunity, but we need to have our voice heard in Canberra if we're going to be able to seize those opportunities."

"Voting for a well-qualified independent candidate is the only way government is going to get the message."
