Sparrows of Kabul

Fred Smith touring show on Australia in Afghanistan
On Saturday 20th May, The G.R.A.I.N. Store will be hosting a concert from award-winning songwriter and musician Fred Smith about the experience of Australia in Afghanistan.

An extraordinary song cycle, Sparrows of Kabul has been described as a "a beautiful retelling of Australia's Afghanistan experience...", "utterly beguiling" and "a must see."

Fred Smith is seen by many as the unofficial storyteller of Australia's involvement in Afghanistan. The lyrics to his song Sapper's Lullaby are engraved in marble at the Australian plot in the centuries old British War Cemetery in Kabul.

He was the first Australian diplomat to be sent to work alongside Australian soldiers in Uruzgan Province in 2009 and the last to leave in 2013. While there he wrote songs and put on regular concerts playing with bands comprising Australian, US and Dutch soldiers and Afghan interpreters.

Returning to Australia, he released these songs on the album Dust of Uruzgan. The title track was covered by Lee Kernaghan on his top selling Spirit of the Anzacs album. The CD received rave reviews and earned him comparisons to the great Australian balladeers Eric Bogle, Don Walker, and John Schumann.

Smith also wrote a book called *The Dust of Uruzgan* described by Channel 10 Political Editor Hugh Riminton as "as convincing a picture as we will ever have of the tragedy, hope, oddness and courage of Australia's Uruzgan enterprise...an astonishingly vibrant piece of reportage from the heart of our longest war."

In 2020, Smith went back to Afghanistan and when Kabul fell under Taliban control, he worked from Kabul International Airport (KIA) on Australia's mission to evacuate passport and visa holders. He wrote his song "Gates of KIA" after returning home from working on the evacuation of Kabul International Airport in August 2021 about his experiences at the human logjams at the gates of the airport. "Seeing the desperation with my own eyes struck me to the core" said Smith.

Since returning, Fred has blended his stories and songs from the evacuation into the *Dust of Uruzgan* stage show he toured to 80 theatres between 2014-18. Called Sparrows of Kabul, the new show offers a vivid



personal account of Australia's 20 year involvement in Afghanistan, and marks the culmination of what, for Smith, has been a remarkably sustained piece of storytelling on Australia's longest war.

"Despite the many challenges during evacuation mission, the Australian team managed to get 4100 people out, most of whom are now living in Australia. Their girls and boys are going to school and having swimming lessons. We've changed people's lives," said Smith.

"This is a story worth telling".

Fred Smith was named Solo Artist of the Year at the Australian Folk Music Awards in 2022.

The local community also has the rare opportunity to work with Fred Smith in Storytelling with Songwriting Workshop on Sunday May 21st, 10am -11:30am.




Rotary News



Loch Garry Reference Committee holds third meeting

ommunity Update: The Loch Garry Reference Committee held its third meeting on Thursday 27 April. The committee was formed in January 2023, to review the service requirements of the Loch Garry Flood Protection District infrastructure and its operating rules.







The meeting included a site visit to the regulator at Loch Garry and the nearby levee breaches.

At the meeting, the committee discussed revisions to the operating rules, which dictate when the regulator is operated by Goulburn-Murray Water (GMW), and when Loch Garry Flood Protection District ratepayers are notified the regulator will be operated.

The committee was also informed that partial funding had been confirmed to help GMW meet its ongoing obligations to the Loch Garry Flood Protection Service following the October 2022 floods.

The funds will assist GMW with the immediate repair works at Loch Garry. The organisation is also committing over the next two years, to undertake a broad ranging review of its assets within Loch Garry Flood Protection District and how they are managed into the future.

GMWs Loch Garry Reference Committee Member Linton Ryan said the funding was welcome news.

"It's a very positive outcome and is a very timely one too," he said. "The funding will help provide us ratepayers with greater security as we head into the colder months."

The next committee meeting will be held in mid-May.

Vale Dr Bill O'Hare

r William (Bill) O'Hare came to Nathalia in February 1960 after completing his medical degree (MBBS) in Sydney NSW and joined the medical practice of Dr Noel Harbison. Dr Bill's grandfather was on original selector at Barwo and he had a number of family members who lived locally.

The 1960s was a busy time for both doctors, with almost every illness and disease handled at a local level. Waiting for police and ambulances to arrive from other towns was a worry, with many road traumas caused by alcohol, speed and no seat belts. After 15-18 years of medical pressure, seat belts became compulsory, and .05 alcohol limits helped to reduce the trauma so frequently seen by these doctors. Local football matches were another frequent cause of casualties; the footballers usually arrived 6.30-7pm after several ales for Dr Bill to stich up or mend the broken bone. As time passed

Dr Bill decided it would be better to treat them at the game, and he gradually became one of their most one-eyed supporters. He also became an avid local cricket supporter for the same

reason, quite often treating injuries while watching the local games, albeit not as many as the football generated. Sometimes his enjoyment of the local sport was interrupted by a birth, which were also carried out at our local hospital at that time.

Dr Bill took an active part in other activities within the local community, being a Rotarian in our local Rotary Club for many years. Dr Harbison retired in 1977 and Dr Peter Poon partnered with Dr Bill to ensure ongoing care to the people of Nathalia. But after 30 years of practice in Nathalia, our community farewelled this dedicated and popular doctor when Dr Bill and his wife Maree retired in April 1990. The couple initially moved to Queensland and eventually returned to Shepparton. Dr Bill passed away on Friday 12th May 2023. Our community remember him with grateful thanks for his many years of dedication to the people of Nathalia. Rest in peace, Dr Bill.



This website is managed by the National Library of Australia and provides searchable newspapers from years gone by. The following articles has been taken from Trove and they provide an insight into a snapshot of time in Nathalia's past.

Numurkah Leader Fri 5 April 1901

"A dust storm of phenomenal severity raged over the town and district on Friday afternoon last. Volumes of dust whirled through the air in such density that in early afternoon it became quite dark, and at times the pepper trees in the Blake street plantation were invisible. The doors of business

places are to be kept closed, and as violent was the storm that telephonic communications between Nathalia and Picola was interrupted, and the wire connecting Messrs Kilpatrick and Co's head office with the grain office at the railway station was completely severed. The roof of Messrs Muntz Bros' large stack of wheat in the station yard was carried away, and also was the verandah on the Elizabeth street frontage of Leishman's refreshment rooms. In the evening a few drops of rain fell, but not sufficient to lay the dust,"

Numurkah Leader Fri 30 January 1903

"The fast diminishing water supply between water towers and the old time weirs has given grand opportunity to fish hunters to capture some of the finny tribe. Recently some fine fish have been captured, some of the cod species turning the scale at 15 lbs. The creek now between the town water supply and the old weir is practically dry, and millions of young fish have perished, creating an abominable stench. If the Nathalia water supply is as good as has been asserted by the trust engineer, why was not the creek through the town kept full which would have saved this heavy stock of cod, bream, perch, and blackfish without injuring anyone, and jeopardizing our water supply. That is if the opinion expressed by the trust's engineer some time ago is of any value. However, the fish are dead, the stench arises, and the one time sheet of flowing water is now a typhoid fever-breeding incubator."

Fred Smith & 'Sparrows of Kabul' this Weekend



Fred Smith & Sparrows of Kabul 20 May; Songwriting Workshop Sunday 21 May 10-11.30

n the plane to Afghanistan in 2009, Fred Smith wrote himself a kind of manifesto. Having just landed a job as an Australian diplomat, he diarised 'Write that you may see and see that you may write'.

Staying true to the brief, Smith has written a lot about Afghanistan and its tenuous relationship with democracy, his observations as a diplomat inspiring him to pen songs such as 'Live Like an Afghan'.

Whilst diplomat and songwriter seem an unusual combination, for Fred Smith, 'both roles involve reporting on what one observes and sees'. And Smith has seen a lot.

Speaking with the SMOTA Year 10 Journalism crew in a phone interview on the 12th of May, he talked about his work in 1996 with the diplomatic core in The Solomon Islands and Bougainville. Whilst most diplomats 'take jobs in capital cities around the world, I developed an interest in conflict zones.' Smith told us.

In 2009, the international community felt that Afghanistan needed to employ diplomats to help deepen the understanding of the Afghanistan context and to facilitate cooperation with the provisional governments. Sent to Uruzgan province, alongside a contingent of 1100 Australian troops, Smith was charged with the job of talking to the tribal warlords and provincial government officials to try and understand what was going on with the people there. The challenges were significant, with illiteracy levels at 95% and a very conservative population.

This experience has contributed to a collection of songs that capture the beauty of a place that poets have immortalised in words. Contrasting the former glory of Kabul, where 'one could not count the moons that shimmer on her roofs nor the thousand splendid suns that hide behind her walls' with the destructiveness of war, Smith wonders ', Why did this struggle begin, when will this war ever end?'

As a modern-day war poet, Smith's lyrics have a dirge-like quality, recurrent ramp ceremonies an unsettling backdrop to a land where the dust becomes a metaphor for life. You just have to listen to tracks such as 'The Dust of Uruzgan', (also the title of his memoir) to understand the cost of war. The grittiness of the lyrics relays the experience of a member

of the Battalion of the Big 1 RAR and the ever-present danger of IED devices and anti-personnel mines. The legacy of service reverberates in each verse, and having a foot blown off is only one of the many immeasurable costs of war.

For the uninitiated Smith, 'The first thing I did when I arrived was attend a ramp ceremony for Ben Ranaudo who had been killed by an IED'. Deeply moved by the experience, Smith told us of the ramp funeral he attended on the 27th of August 2010. Thinking 'I should write a song about this guy', Smith sat with the idea for two years until he received an email from Crash's friend who explained the story.

Finally, Smith had his song. 'I realised I had a pair of eyes from which to write the song.' he said. The result was 'Derapet'. Asked about his songwriting, Smith explained that the voices of those who appear in his songs are sometimes fictional, sometimes the voices of people he has encountered or known about, and sometimes his own. The song 'Christmas in Kandahar' is very evidently autobiographical. As you listen to the lyrics, you can feel the loneliness of the ex-pat who hears 'Planes take off in the night, on missions unknown.' and turns away to 'face the night all alone.'

Touring with his show 'Sparrows of Kabul', Smith and his band will be playing at the Uniting Church Hall in Nathalia on Saturday 20th May. You can get your tickets at the GRAIN Store or through Trybooking. com
