



Judy Ormond is the author of the book "WEIRS" Numurkah, Nathalia, Barmah 1880-2023 and said that her fascination to water stems back to her childhood growing up along Verney Road in Shepparton. The family home was surrounded by large drainage and irrigation channels where she went fishing, caught yabbies and learnt to swim. Judy married Rex Ormond in 1970 and there began an interest into the new and old weirs dotted along the Broken Creek. Her interest and photography skills started a massive journey into the writing of this very informative historical book. Thank you for sharing this story with us .

On the 10<sup>th</sup> of April a trip was organized to Seymour with a stop at Nagambie for coffee and to see the statue of the famous racing horse Black Caviar and then unto Seymour to visit the Vietnam Veterans Commemorative Walk. This site is dedicated to all the servicemen and servicewomen and tracker dogs who served in South Vietnam from 1962-1975. This walk opened in 2013 is the only one of its kind in Australia and 60,000 names who served in the conflict are listed. Margaret Liddell was proud to show us all the photo of her late



husband Jim and her brother John Kool. Everyone was very impressed by the walk. Afterwards a lovely lunch was served at the Seymour Club which was enjoyed by everyone. We left for home at 2.00 pm arriving at 3.30pm. A very enjoyable day. Thanks Maryse and Trish.



## Museum Moments...

Pictured at left is a famous painting called 'Menin Gate at Midnight'. A framed print of this painting hangs at the Nathalia Museum. Here is its story....

William Longstaff was born in 1871 and educated at Ballarat. He joined the military and served in the Boer War as a member of the South African Light Horse. He enlisted in the Australian Imperial Forces at the outbreak of World War 1, and was injured in the Gallipoli campaign. He served in France and Egypt before being evacuated to England.

Longstaff was appointed as an official war artist in 1918. After the war he remained in England and returned to the battlefield to paint.

His most famous painting 'Menin Gate at Midnight' was painted after Longstaff attended the unveiling of the Menin Gate Memorial at Ypres in Belgium in 1927.

The Memorial commemorates those men of the British Empire, including Australia, who died in the battles of WW1 and have no known grave.

Longstaff was said to have seen a "vision of steel-helmeted spirits rising from the moonlit cornfields around him". Returning to London, Longstaff was reported to have painted the work in a single session, while "still under the psychic influence".

The painting was immediately popular. It was purchased by Lord Woolavington (a British businessman and philanthropist) in 1928 and presented to the Australian Government. After a royal command viewing at Buckingham Palace for King George V and the royal family, the painting was displayed in Manchester and Glasgow. It was then taken around Australia, where record crowds paid to view the work.

Longstaff oversaw the making of 2000 prints, and 400 of those were given to the Australian War Memorial to sell to raise funds.

The painting is in oil on canvas and measures 137 x 170 cm. Longstaff died in England in 1953.

A framed print of this famous painting is hanging at the local Museum. It used to hang in the Nathalia Public Hall and when the hall closed in the 1970's, the Shire gave the print to the Museum.

There is a connection between this artist and a local family....... William Longstaff had a sister, Sarah Jane, who married Thomas Newell Muntz, a connection to the local Muntz family. They lived in Shepparton.

It is well worth a visit to the Museum sometime to view the print.

## ANZAC Day in Barmah

The Anzac Day Parade and Service at Barmah continues to grow in numbers year by year. It is encouraging that the event is so well supported not only by our small community but also from others who come from near and far to this annual event.

The theme for this year was the essential provision of clean drinking war during time of war not only for the comfort of the men and their horses but also for good health. Up until WWII this was a major cause of sickness among the men. The drinking water was

carried in water carts pulled by horses or donkeys or transported in jerry cans.

As usual the march from the pub to the War Memorial was led by 2 vintage cars. Tony Murphy brought his 1914 Buick Roadster and transported Colonel Gerry Clifton aged 93, a veteran who served in Malaya, Germany and Vietnam.

Bill Draper from Leeton was in a vintage Mercedes. Bill is the great nephew of Alex Draper of Nathalia who died in South Africa during the Boer War. The Boer War pedestal at the Nathalia War Memorial is dedicated to him.

Bill attended both the Dawn Service and the service at Barmah and was able to catch up with some of his Lubke relatives and Jill Galloway (daughter of Stitcher Pearce - Albert William) of the20th Light Horse and reminisced about days gone by.

As usual Kerry Bruce organised the largest contingent of horses we've ever had (about 20 riders on horseback and Max Ryder's 2 horses pulling a cart) from the Indi Light Horse as well as the Nathalia Pony Club and the Barmah Muster.

The Flag Marshalls were young Henry Mansfield (assisted by his Dad, Duane) and Paullie Sherer-Richards. Both boys did a great job. We welcome young people as part of our service. They are the future.

We were privileged to have Naomi Concy who sang the New Zealand National Anthem. Naomi & her partner Josef have recently moved to Nathalia and we are very grateful they have decided to join our community at Nathalia/Picola RSL.

There have been problems in the past with sound and Kim Kneebone very kindly provided her PA system for the event and this was a great improvement. Mick Dowlan performed Tenterfield Sadler and It Still Call Australia Home by Peter Allen. Both very appropriate for Anzac Day.

The ladies of Barmah excelled themselves again and every morsel of food was quickly devoured.

The Barmah Social Club and the Nathalia Op Shop provided generous donations and this has enabled us to continue to provide free

morning tea as well as purchase equipment to assist with the smooth running of the event.

This event would not be possible without our whole small community and they continue to support us wholeheartedly every year.
