Applications open for nursing scholarship

pplications are now open for Moira Shire Council's 2022 Post Graduate Scholarship Program.

This post graduate study will lead to the qualification of a Maternal and Child Health Nurse.

Mayor Libro Mustica said the scholarship program valued at \$4,000 was available to registered midwives who undertake a Post Graduate Diploma of Nursing Science in Child Family and Community at an accredited tertiary institution.

"Maternal and Child Health (MCH) nurses play a vital role in our community," Cr Mustica said.

"In particular, the team of MCH nurses at Council are highly professional health practitioners who give information, support and advice on a variety of topics including parenting, development and learning, child health, family health and wellbeing, immunisation, breastfeeding, nutrition and family planning."

Selection for the program will be based on the following criteria -Australia citizenship or permanent residency status; a resident of Moira Shire or surrounding municipality; currently registered as a registered nurse and midwife with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia; enrolment in tertiary courses; and the intention to complete the course within two years.

"Students currently receiving funding from another scholarship are still eligible to apply and unsuccessful applicants from previous rounds are encouraged to reapply," he said.

"These awards will be a wonderful way to recognise the exceptional contribution for the people and groups in our community who inspire us



Let's talk about thunderstorm asthma

Grass pollen season is here.

This time of year brings an increased chance of thunderstorm asthma.

It can be sudden, serious and even life threatening for people with asthma or hay fever.

If you've ever had asthma – talk to your doctor about what you need to do to protect yourself this pollen season.

Some ways to reduce your risk of thunderstorm asthma include:

- Close doors and windows before a storm arrives. If you have your air conditioner on, turn it to recirculate.
- Follow your asthma action plan, if you haven't got an action plan, make an appointment with your doctor to make one.
- Learn or revisit the 4 steps of asthma first aid.
- Take an asthma preventer as directed to prevent asthma.

If you do have asthma, the sooner you get it under control the sooner you'll feel better - and the faster you can help reduce your risk of thunderstorm asthma.

Remember to get a COVID-19 test if:

- your symptoms are new
- your symptoms are different than usual
- your symptoms have restarted after a period of absence
- · you are unsure.



Museum Moments...



I was recently given a copy of an old book (pictured above) called "New Standard Cookery, Illustrated". It is quite a thick book and was printed in 1933 in Great Britain. Even though it was written in Britain the index shows it was targeted at the Australian housewife, with one chapter devoted to the Australian

The contents of this book seem so different to the life we live today, so lets take a peek at how life was for our grandparents.

Brought to you by Jeanette Holland on behalf of the Nathalia & District Historical Society.

It is interesting to look back at what featured in a book like this. It was not only full of recipes but also contained chapters on diet for health, putting on weight or cutting down weight, foods suitable for invalids, household management, the washing up, the laundry, household linen, and first aid, just to name a few.

Within the chapter called 'The Meat Course' are recipes for Stewed Bandicoot, Roasted Island Blue Geese, several recipes on how to cook Kangaroo, or Mallee Hen, Roast Black Swan or Bush Turkey, Boiled Murray Cod and Roast

Household Hints include; -

- Stew apple peelings with a little sugar to make Apple Juice.
- To make a cheap Baby's Cot Mattress—take a strong piece of sheeting and fill evenly with fresh, sweet hay. Using fine white string, draw it through the mattress at regular intervals and tie off to keep the hay in place.
- Fill a pair of socks with sawdust and stitch closed. When shoes are taken off, insert the sock and it will hold the shape of the shoe and remove
- To keep bread fresh, wash and dry a large potato and put it in the bottom of the bread container.
- To extinguish the fire in a chimney, throw a couple of handfuls of salt onto the fire.
- To cure chilblains, bathe the affected area with water in which celery has been boiled, or rub the chilblain with plain lemon water.

oira Shire Council is getting Linto the festive spirit by launching a shire-wide Christmas decorations competition and we want the community to involved.

A total of \$4,500 worth of Why Leave Town (WLT) cards are up for grabs if you can impress the judges with your creative and sustainable flair.



Mayor Libro Mustica said entries open Monday 1 November and he couldn't wait to see the entries start coming in.

"Our businesses and communities have been impacted by two years of COVID-19 restrictions, both financially and emotionally, and we are wanting to help lift their spirits by holding competitions that families and workmates can enter, work on and, most importantly, have fun together,"

"We are encouraging businesses to jazz up their shop windows and residents their front gates or driveway entrances with a Christmas theme, bringing a fabulous festive atmosphere into our communities plus supporting our retailers by shopping locally."

There are four main categories with a \$1,000 WLT card for each winner. The categories are Best Shop/Business Window Display; Best Sustainably Decorated Front Entrance - Urban; Best Sustainably Decorated Front Entrance – Rural; and Best Sustainably Decorated Small Town Entrance.

"The runner up for Best Shop/Window Display will win a \$500 WLT card," Cr Mustica said.

"Entrants for these awards must complete the online form and submit photos of their decorations via our website.

"A map displaying all the entries will be available on our website and on

our socials so you can tour the shire and take in the festive spirit."

Community organisations in the shire's small towns are also encouraged to hold a festive picnic or barbecue, COVID restrictions permitting, with a grant of \$2,000 per small town; this grant must be applied for via SmartyGrants on our website.

"In addition, there will be a fun People's Choice Award, where people can vote for their favourite display via our Facebook page; simply send a pic of your front entrance or window, which we will upload to our Facebook feed, then people can 'like' their favourite photo from the list and the pic with the most reactions wins," Cr Mustica said.

"This award is for the glory only, no monetary prize is attached."



Amazing Insects

Response from Ken Harris - Author of a Victorian book of Lacewings.

Anne Timm's Question: Is this a Lacewing? That is not a lacewing, it is in the order Mecoptera known as Scorpion Flies. This one is in the family Bittacidae which are known as Hanging Flies. It is in the Genus Harpobittacus and is probably Harpobittacus australis.

They are found in eucalypt woodland in south eastern Australia during wetter climatic conditions.

Forensic entomology can make use of the Scorpion Fly order's habit of feeding on human corpses for timing purposes. They can be the first to arrive and live off the corpse for a set time. Their presence, therefore, indicates that a body must be fresh.

It is the male which uses its 'sting', but only as a clasper for mating.

Catching prey: They hang from their front legs and use their back legs to catch prey. They are the only insects to catch prey with an opposable claws positioned on their back legs. *See photo left*.

They can, for example, catch a bee this way and not be stung. They bring the prey up to their beak-like mouth, impale it repeatedly and inject it - it will die within about 30 seconds. See photos Brisbane Insects website.





My Aged Care Face-to-Face Service in Shepparton

hepparton will become one of the first locations in Australia to receive a new My Aged Care face-to-face service that will be dedicated to supporting senior Australians to access and navigate the aged care system.

From Monday, senior Australians will be able to talk directly to a My Aged Care specialist officer at Shepparton's Services Australia facility on Maude Street.

Federal Member for Nicholls, Damian Drum, said the service forms part of the Federal Government's commitment to helping senior Australians and their families connect to the aged care system and get access to the best personalised support and care available.

"The addition of face-to-face services in Shepparton is great news for the local community," Mr Drum said.

"Shepparton is one of 15 Services Australia sites that will initially offer the aged care specialist face-to-face service, which will expand to 80 sites by the end of next year.

"At that point, there will be 10 aged care specialist officers providing outreach support to senior Australians in rural and remote areas.

"Appointments to see an aged care specialist officer can be made by visiting the Shepparton facility on Maude Street or by phoning 1800 227

The new service offering is part of the Federal Government's \$17.7 billion aged care reform package in response to the Royal Commission.

Million dollar funding announced to fight Queensland Fruit Fly

oira Shire Council has been successful in securing a Victorian State Government Fruit Fly Strategy grant to the value of \$1,040,629.

This funding will be used to support the Goulburn Murray Valley Regional Fruit Fly Group which brings

together members of the local horticulture industry associations, agronomists, local government, Agriculture Victoria, government agencies, and the community for an integrated approach to control Queensland Fruit Fly (QFF).

Mayor Libro Mustica said QFF was a constant threat to the region's annual production of hundreds of thousands of tonnes of fruit and vegetables that can act as hosts for the insect.

"The programs initiated by the Regional Fruit Fly Group have achieved a 60% reduction in QFF populations in recent years and they continue to design innovative approaches to manage QFF," he said.

"Continued effective QFF control via these programs help prevent a major environmental threat to horticulture through education and host tree removal and monitoring.

"This also helps the environment in limiting chemical control measures.

"A notable innovation by the Regional Fruit Fly Group was to undertake a Sterile Insect Technique trial where sterile male fruit flies were released in the Cobram area.

"This trial was incredibly successful and continues today."

Cr Mustica said it was absolutely critical the QFF program continues as it

actively protects the region's \$762.5 million fruit and vegetable industry which supports approximately 5,000 jobs.



Pesky Pelicans

After weeks of lockdowns, we are now back socialising and enjoying our outdoor spaces — one particular creature is happy to see us return to waterside picnics and that is the ever present and ever hungry pelican.



General Manager Community Sally Rice said pelicans can cause a bit of trouble if they see food laying around and decide they want it.

"While well-meaning people may be tempted to feed these wild animals, doing so can harm them, and also encourage their aggressive behaviour towards people enjoying a meal," Ms Rice said.

"To help curb our pelicans' new-found anti-social behaviour, we are asking residents and tourists to not feed them, both for public safety and the health and safety of the birds themselves.

"Pelicans are highly capable fish catchers and need to hunt for their own food – feeding these wild animals can make them dependant on humans which makes it harder for them to survive in the wild."

Ms Rice said there were a few tips on what to do and not do if a Pelican comes into your personal space.

Do:

- Remove yourself and those in your care from the situation.
- Make yourself intimidating to the pelican by standing tall, making noise by clapping your hands and/or raising your voice in a determined manner at the bird, and if handy, use a towel or similar item and flap it towards the bird until the bird moves out of your personal space.

Don't

- Harm, touch or feed the Pelican in any way.
- "We encourage you to take photographs and admire these wonderful creatures from a distance," Ms Rice said.

"Pelicans are wild animals so please give them space and if possible, stay at least three metres from them at all times."

Federal Funding For Stronger Communities

The Liberal and Nationals Government is providing a further \$150,000 in federal funding for small-scale upgrades and new equipment that community groups in Nicholls need and deserve.

Expressions of interest opened October 26 for Round 7 of the Stronger Communities Programme, which gives local governing bodies and community groups an opportunity to nominate projects for grants of up to \$20,000.

Federal Member for Nicholls, Damian Drum, said more funding for Nicholls would deliver the infrastructure and equipment our communities need to be successful and grow.

"This latest funding injection will support up to 20 projects across our communities, supporting jobs and delivering an economic boost to drive our recovery on the other side of the COVID-19 pandemic," Mr Drum said.

"This type of investment brings people together by strengthening social connections, building community participation and delivering a brighter and more vibrant future for communities."

Mr Drum said 17 groups in Nicholls received funding in Round 6 of the SCP. These included the Tongala Development Group, Kyabram Youth Club, Gunbower Bowls Club, Rushworth Cricket Club, and Seymour Railway Heritage Centre.

"I strongly encourage interested organisations to contact my office regarding projects important to them and our community," Mr Drum said.

"Grants from \$2500 up to \$20,000 are available to cover up to 100 per cent of eligible project costs, or up to 50 per cent of eligible project costs for local governing bodies."
