t NCELC we put a lot of time and effort into practising sustainability within our curriculum. Some of the ways in which we do this is through our Compost Bins. Leftovers from our meals and scraps from the kitchen go into here daily.

Our other scraps go to our chickens, which the children love to feed, water and care for. NCELC do have eggs available to buy for \$3.50 if anyone in the community would like to purchase fresh eggs.











We have a large variety of Vegetables which we grow in our garden. The children will pick these when they are ready and then are given to Jodi our cook who will use them in our meals. The children also love to pick the herbs to use in their home corner play or to put with play dough for a sensory experience.

We have worm farms which the children will feed the worms scraps, we then use the worm juice on our vegetables and garden. Again, this can be purchased from the centre for a small fee

We have a beautiful big yard here at NCELC which the provides the children with so many learning opportunities, we are very lucky!



It is interesting to look at the historic levels of flood water at Echuca Wharf.

During the current episode of flooding, the water level peaked at 94.97m. on 27/10/2022 making it the third largest flood on record. Flood levels of this magnitude have not been seen since the 1870's.

There is still plenty of flood water around and the current level of the Murray River at Echuca is 94.57m. on 6/11/2022. This level still represents a Major Flood Level.

The impact of flooding is far-reaching and long-lasting in our district.




Murray Valley Highway closed between Nathalia and Echuca-Mooroopna Road due to flooding and damage to McCoys Bridge.


Men's Shed at the Nathalia Show



Howie Marshal O.A.M.

Commemorative Exhibition at the G.R.A.I.N. Store

athalia Wildflower Group wished to honour Howie Marshall and the legacy of local flora and general environmental knowledge he bequeathed to Nathalia and the wider community.

It is 100 years since Howie's birth in 1922. Therefore, in partnership with the G.R.A.I.N. Store Art Gallery in Blake Street, Nathalia, we are holding a two week exhibition commemorating his life.

The exhibition will be held in the Community Gallery at the G.R.A.I.N. Store, beginning on Thursday, December 1st and concluding on Sunday, December 11th, Howie's birthdate.

We will mark that Sunday as a special occasion; on that day, the last day of the exhibition, you are all invited to enjoy afternoon tea and join us in some reminiscences about Howie's unique life.

Howie began a study of the local flora when he became an agricultural student at Dookie College in the 1940's. Over the following decades he sent about 300 local flora plants to the National Herbarium in the Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne. The Herbarium still retains a collection of Howie's local flora specimens.

Most of those plants were identified by Neville Walsh. Neville Walsh was the Senior Conservation Botanist at the Herbarium, until his retirement this year. Neville was the co-editor of the 4 Volume Flora of Victoria, now available as a resource on-line for free public access.

Howie was a self-sufficient man. The skills he learnt at Dookie upheld him all his life. He built his own house and made most of the tools that he needed, having his own forge and wood-working lathe. He grew his own vegetables and fruits and raised the stock and birds he needed for meat and eggs. His autobiography, The Way it Was (2010) describes how he lived his life; It is fascinating reading. His book, along with items that he made, will be on display.

Howie worked at Lloyd and Joan Harding's farm at Llanwreath farm for decades, enjoying a lifelong friendship. Howie was also a great friend of the Barmah Forest cattlemen. He was also sought after by botanists coming into this area; because he had a photographic memory, he could take them into the bush to find the local flora plants they needed.

Howie was a founder of both the Numurkah Field Naturalists Group and the Nathalia Wildflower Group. He was our expert guide in the development of the three local flora field guides that we have published.

Howie received his O.A.M. (Order of Australia Medal) in 2003 for his lifelong dedication to the conservation and recording of the local flora.

Howie's legacy of knowledge lives on in all of us and it has been expressed by many members of the Nathalia Wildflower Group through photography, art and poetry. The exhibition will include a range of creative works inspired by our love of the environment.
