October Scheduled Council Meeting - Cancelled

Due to the flood event the Scheduled Council Meeting which was to be held on 26 October 2022 has been cancelled. All items which were due to be considered in this meeting will be deferred to the Scheduled Council Meeting to be held on 23 November 2022.

The Mayoral Election which was due to be held on 9 November 2022 will also be postponed under the circumstances and will now be held on 30 November 2022.

Moira Shire Messages

Statement from Moira Shire Council CEO Clare Keenan regarding Commission of Inquiry

ayor Libro Mustica and I were informed on Thursday 27th October by the Executive Director of Local Government Victoria that the Municipal Monitor had been removed.

We were also informed that a Commissioner would be appointed, and that we would receive official confirmation and detail via a letter from the Minister for Local Government.

Earlier in the week I wrote to the Executive Director of Local Government to express concern about the cost to Council due to the Monitors appointment and my apprehension that the Terms of Reference were broadening without addressing the ongoing Workplace Health and Safety issue.

Today we received the official correspondence from the Minister that The Commission of Inquiry will commence on 28 October 2022 and report to the Minister for Local Government by 28 February 2023.

The Minister further informed us that the costs for the Commission of Inquiry will be met by the Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions following the concerns raised of the financial burden placed on Council. We welcome the inquiry and thank the Government for their ongoing support and concern, we understand that the additional authority of the Commissioner will result in a genuine resolution for Council.



Breast Cancer Awareness

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month and on October 26 staff were invited to dress in pink and bring morning tea to share. We shared resources and information during the week to raise awareness of prevention, treatment and support around breast cancer.



Finding breast cancer early provides the best chance for more treatment options.

Remember you don't need to be an expert or use a special technique to check your breasts. Changes to look for include:

- a new lump or lumpiness, especially if it's only in one breast.
- a change in the size or shape of your breasts.
- a change to the nipple, such as crusting, redness or inversion.
- a nipple discharge that occurs without squeezing.
- a change in the skin of your breast such as redness or dimpling.
- an unusual pain that doesn't go away.



Most changes aren't due to breast cancer but it's important to see your doctor without delay if you notice any changes that may be unusual to you.

But as the prevalence of female business leaders began to grow, and in response to the groundswell of demand for female admission, Rotary changed its legislation in 1989 to admit women. Today women represent approximately 17% of Rotary membership in Australia, yet leadership positions filled by women are well above this percentage. Women are welcome in Rotary, and we are desperately keen to increase

our female membership. Our club's first female members were welcomed in 2002.

Rotary is for old people

Some believe that one's age is just a number, and it's one's attitude that is important. So I guess that depends on at which age you believe "old" cuts in, but you can join Rotary at 18 or 118! Either way, Rotary welcomes "younger" members with open arms. We are depending on them to keep our organisation vibrant.

Our club's youngest member is in his 20's and the eldest is in his 80's. The club average is 65.

Rotary is a religious organisation or a secret society

Rotary is non-religious and non-political. We have no secret handshake, no secret meetings and no secret rituals. It is an open organisation of men and women who simply believe in helping others. Museum Moments...

Red Gum Courier, Friday November 4th, 2022

Nathalia & District Historical Society.

As part of a Country Education Project, the Nathalia & District Historical Society worked with students from the Nathalia High School to develop a Local History Student's Kit in 1989, to develop an awareness and interest in the development of Nathalia and District.

Students from the Year 11 Typing class typed ten pamphlets, the first one explaining the project and the remaining nine pages each covering a different topic relevant to our local history. Below is the story of **Coach Building in Nathalia**, taken from one of these pamphlets.

"It goes without saying that the majority of towns in the early days of settlement had its share of coach, buggy, gig and wagon builders; so it was with Nathalia. Around 1882 Mr R. Candy built a coach factory, assumed to be the first in the town, called the Nathalia Coach Factory. By 1889/90 he sold out to Francis Lloyd Doel, who also became an undertaker for the town.

In 1886, Mr John Schier had set up as a coach builder, wheelwright, and undertaker, and advertised as such. He was situated somewhere in the vicinity of the ex Anglican Parish Hall, on the corner of Elizabeth St. and Muntz Ave. in 1890 when he put his business up for sale. However it did not sell so John continued on, employing experienced men like Mr Cooke and Mr Doel. He made quite a name for himself with his carts and wagons etc. In 1891 he built a bakers cart for Mr R. Hosking, which for convenience and workmanship could not be excelled by anything outside of Melbourne. In the same year he built for Mr T. Galway of Picola, a twelve horse wagon capable of carrying 10 ton. It could be utilized for carrying wool or timber. Mr Schier finally sold his business in 1897."



"A.B. Binger arrived in Nathalia in June 1889. He bought one of Mr Kostadt's blocks on the corner of Elizabeth and Nicholson Street (west side), cleared the heavy timber and set up as a coachbuilder and blacksmith, and shortly afterwards as an undertaker also. He had been in the coach making business most of his life and his work was of very fine quality. He soon earned himself such a high reputation that orders came from near and far. In October 1890 he exhibited three buggies at the Nathalia Show and was awarded first prize. December 1890 saw a butcher's cart for Campbell & Tuck. The high quality of this work brought him much acclaim. He left Nathalia in 1915 with his sons staying to carry on the business.

As motor vehicles became the 'in thing' carts, wagons and buggies were on the way out. The original A.B. Binger building was demolished in 1984.

There is a Binger gig amongst the Nathalia & District Historical Society's wide collection of articles."

Teaching CPR at Nathalia Preschool



Teaching CPR to children has many benefits including the children sharing their knowledge with their parents, how to dial 000 in an emergency and have skills that one day may save a life. We know that the children would not be able to perform adequate CPR but rather they become familiar with the skills and timings.

Our curriculum, the Early Years Learning & Development Framework informs us that the children will learn

respect and compassion for others, people they know as well as those less familiar. They will become aware of others' rights and their own rights, and what other people do in the world around them. They'll learn how to comfort others and learn that what they say and do can affect how others feel. They'll learn how to be a good friend! How do we know the children are developing these skills? It becomes a part of their everyday play, it is embedded in their knowledge, the preschool program and

importantly their practice.

The catchments have received scattered rain over the past day resulting in slight increases to some river heights. Increases have been gradual how ever residents should be aware that there is further rain forecast over coming days so please be aware of warnings as they are updated.

Most rivers and catchments remain steady but water is expected to remain for some time. The area is saturated making it very difficult for water to dissipate.

Winds are expected over the coming days so please be aware of trees falling unexpectedly. Their roots are sodden making them very unstable. Never park or take shelter under a tree when it's windy.

Fighting for Nicholls

ederal Member for Nicholls, Sam Birrell MP, spent last week in the Nation's Capital fighting for the needs of flood affected communities.

After seeing the flood damage and meeting with residents, farmers and business owners firsthand on the ground in Rochester, Seymour, Mooroopna, Nagambie, Shepparton, Undera and Murchison, as well as hearing the needs of the Echuca and Moira Shire communities, Mr Birrell took the concerns to Parliament House.

Mr Birrell's advocacy and consistent meetings with Minister for Emergency Management, Murray Watt has seen Moira Shire now included in the list of local government areas eligible for the Australian Government's Disaster Recovery Payment.

Mr Birrell says he was pleased people in Moira Shire were now able to apply for immediate financial help.

"I won't let regional residents be left behind and miss out on this immediate, essential one-off

payment of funds." Mr Birrell said.

"Moira Shire residents who've had flood water cause major damage to their home or a major asset at their home are eligible for a \$1000 payment per adult and \$400 payment per child." he said.

Mr Birrell also call on the Labor Minister to

provide flood affected business owners and primary producers with funding grants to help with clean up and rebuild of their businesses," Mr Birrell said.

"The floods have ripped through communities across Nicholls and business owners need to be provided with financial relief to rebuild," Mr Birrell said.

"Small businesses and primary producers provide significant input into our local economies.

"They employee hundreds of locals, service the needs of our people and draw visitors to our

"They need to be supported in repairing damage to ensure they can return to service and help our region prosper following these devastating floods." Mr Birrell said.

Mr Birrell called on the Labor Government to provide the relief sooner rather than later.

The sitting week also included a number of speeches by Mr Birrell explaining the impact and scale of the damage, while also recognising the strength and generosity of the people of Nicholls.
