

Museum Moments...

Apologies —the heading was omitted from the top of the story featured in last edition about the drowning of Daniel McCarry. It should have began with— LONG TERM MEMORY CAN PLAY TRICKS!

This weeks article shows A CASE OF MISTAKEN IDENTITY

Thanks to Lyn Franklin for her research.

An enquiry was made to our local Historical Society by a Butler family descendant regarding the timing of Victor Butler winning the beautifully inscribed trophy cup pictured at left. There is no recipient's name mentioned on the cup and it expressly mentions "Season 1892" so the cup was not for just one greyhound coursing race but for the whole year.

Research in the Nathalia Herald dated 7th April, 1892 under the heading "Nathalia Coursing Club" revealed the following: *Mr. Stirling, on behalf of Mrs. McLean, of the Court House Hotel, presented to the winner of the All-aged Stake, a cup of the value of £5.5s. to be added to the stake. A vote of thanks was passed to Mrs. McLean on the motion of Messrs. Kinsella and Spencer, for the liberal donation.* The write-up included a list of committee members for the coming season naming E.Hutchinson (Edwin) as one of the members, but no Butlers mentioned. Edwin had occupied several roles in the club over a number of years, often including that of "slipper", a very trusted position. A previous write-up on 10th September 1891 for the final 1891 season included the names of Mr. E.Hutchinson, Miss Hutchinson and her dog "Lass". Further research revealed that Victor Claude Butler born in 1911, was the son of Henry Butler a butcher and Ellen Elizabeth Hutchinson, so he was too young to have won the cup. Revealingly, his mother Ellen, was the "Miss Hutchinson" the daughter of Edwin Hutchinson!

There was no write-up for the overall winner of the cup for the 1892 season but E.Hutchinson was the winner for the first meeting of that year. Seeing that the cup is now in the hands of the Butler family it would be fairly safe to assume that Edwin Hutchinson was the winner for the 1892 season and



that the cup had come down through the Hutchinson line not the Butler line. The sequence of ownership was: Edwin Hutchinson, his daughter Ellen who married Henry Butler, then Victor Butler, their son!

Barwo Homestead Farewell

B arwo Homestead recently held an event to say farewell and thank you to staff, committee members and supporters for their work at Barwo.

All in attendance were encouraged to be proud of their achievements. Barwo has had 30 years of caring for its residents, employing many locals, and earning a reputation for high standards. That reputation is all about people – their commitment, care, compassion, and their relationships, respect and resourcefulness.

The implementation of government policy was acknowledged, along with the difficulties that imposes on small communities. The Aged Care Standards address the big picture and bring big changes for aged care across the nation. That has impacts on small communities like Nathalia and district where we are unable to recruit the qualified staff that are now required, despite the quality of care that Barwo had previously provided.

In looking to the future, an update was presented on the ongoing work to develop Barwo into independent housing for older residents. Barwo's continuing purpose is to serve the community by providing accommodation to the aged. The Committee of Management and a Working Group are developing plans for converting the existing building to independent living, and for building units on the surrounding land. All will be constructed specifically for older residents.


The evening included presentations of flowers and Barwo's history book to staff, life members and founding committee members. Two staff members who have provided many years of service were recognised with trees for their gardens.

Everyone enjoyed food and refreshments together while sharing stories of their involvement with Barwo. It was very pleasing to hear of the new employment many staff have gained since leaving Barwo.

Noel Braun commenced his working life as a country schoolteacher before moving into a corporate career, which took him from Melbourne to Perth and Sydney. He has had a lifelong passion for writing and wrote the first words of his novels fifty years ago. After a busy career and raising a family of four, he has found the time in retirement to fulfil long-held ambition to

Noel has published two novels: Friend and Philosopher and Whistler Street. He has published a memoir. No Way to Behave at a Funeral which describes his grief journey following the death by suicide of his wife Maris. and three explorations of the Camino de Santiago de Compostela: The Day was Made for Walking, I Guess I'll Just Keep on Walking and Keep Pressing On. Brother.

Over the years it has grown and many services are provided there: access point to Centrelink and Medicare, Foodshare, Community Car Service, Adult Learning Programs (RSA, First Aid, Basic Computers), Emergency Relief, Community Garden, etc.

We were told about the work that was being done outside the house in Blake Street and also that the "Chatty Café" will be coming soon. President Loula thanked Edwina for her informative and interesting talk and presented her with flowers, in appreciation.

A few days later, on 25th, we joined RC Numurkah members at the Numurkah Golf and Bowls Club. Here we had a meeting with District Governor Neta Kirby who is a member of Tatura Rotary (since 1997 when she became the second woman inducted into the club). The DG has four adult children, eight grandchildren, is an aunty

in aboriginal community, is an educator and therapist and works as a Sandplay Therapist in Tatura and with Goulburn Valley Centre Against Sexual Assault in Shepparton. Mode of transport? A three-wheeler Can Am Spyder is what the DG rides whenever possible...driving a car only when she must, for safety (e.g. on dusk when kangaroos are about). Our DG has two projects that she is asking support for: "Life's Little Treasures Foundation" is Australia's foremost charity dedicated to providing support, friendship and information, specifically tailored for families of premature or sick babies. This is now a RAWCS (Rotary Australia World Community Service) project and aims to raise \$50,000, with Rotary clubs in District 9790 asked to donate to this cause.

The second project is "Say No to Domestic Violence" and there will be a function or walk in early December to raise awareness in the community and not be silent. "Yes" to respectful relationships. There is sure to be more information about function/walk later in the year.

Our next meeting, on 4th October, was held in town. Our AGM and board meeting are scheduled for October 11th, also at Nathalia.

Raffle tickets are selling well, and we thank all buyers. We hope to continue being successful each time we are out selling tickets in the Rotary Community Raffle so please support this fund raiser. We are "moving with the times" and have a ZELLER machine enabling us to accept card payments from those who prefer not to use cash.


Hearings held into amendments to the MDBP

Water buybacks rip the economic heart out of our region - I get it. But it's hard to get some people in Canberra to understand. The Senate will hold an inquiry about changes to the Murray Darling Basin Plan but there will only be two hearings, and both of those will be held in Canberra. This is incredibly disrespectful to Basin communities whose economic future is on the line. This week a Coalition Committee held hearings in Shepparton about changes to the plan. Basin Coalition MPs and myself listened to major processors, farmers and community leaders about how water buybacks and taking away an extra 450GL of water would devastate regions like ours. This was the first leg of a tour, listening to Basin communities. We will take the damning findings back to the Senate Committee to ensure the voices of the Basin are heard. I encourage people to also make a written submission; it doesn't matter how short, to help me in the fight to protect our precious food bowl.
