# Festive Funding - we want to hear from you

oira Shire Council is calling for feedback on the proposed Festive Funding Grants as well as plans to decorate the major towns in the shire during the festive period.

Mayor Libro Mustica said due to the shire's large size, it was not possible to deliver festive decorations across the whole area.

"Particularly decorations that would meet community expectations, in all locations, within a restricted budget," Cr Mustica said.

"What we are proposing is to decorate the main streets of the four major towns – Yarrawonga, Cobram, Numurkah and Nathalia – that will match community expectations of a suitably festive experience.

"In addition, community groups will have the opportunity to apply for funding for events or extra decorations up to \$1,000 for small towns, \$2,000 for major towns, and \$1,000 to recognise culturally significant days representative of the various faiths in our region.

"The overall purpose of the Festive Funding Grants is to empower communities to take ownership of the presentation of their town in the festive season, as well as celebrate and recognise culturally significant days."

# RV Friendly trial – tell us what you think

Moira Shire Council is calling for feedback on the success of the RV Friendly Trial that has been running in Numurkah for the past two years.

Mayor Libro Mustica said following the adoption

of the Recreational Vehicle (RV) Friendly Strategy, Council received a petition to make Numurkah RV friendly once again under the Caravan Motorhome Club of Australia (CMCA) accreditation scheme.

"In 2020, Council endorsed a two-year trial of two RV friendly overnight parking locations at the Lions Park and the Numurkah Showgrounds," Cr Mustica said.

"Historically, all four major towns – Yarrawonga, Cobram, Numurkah and Nathalia – were designated as RV friendly towns.

"The Strategy made the Shire RV friendly, however Numurkah's RV Friendly Town status was removed as there was no real provision for free or low cost overnight camping in close proximity to the town.

"A review of this trial has commenced and we are seeking the community's feedback on the success of the trial.

"At the same time, RV visitors to these two locations will be asked to complete an economic impact survey."

# **Rotary Report**

he weather gods were most kind...

last weekend, making for a very successful Show Day on Saturday. A few Rotary volunteers sold raffle tickets, on behalf of the New Years Eve Carnival committee, and were kept quite busy.

There is another raffle for NYE, but this is a Rotary one and our volunteers have started selling tickets outside IGA. We had a similar raffle earlier in the year and the Rotary Club of Mooroopna gave 60% of monies taken by us to our club (people may remember that we had the first prize on display at our Show and Shine in March). That time we received a very tidy sum from Mooroopna club, for our club and our community. We hope to have at least as much success this time so please support us. First prize is a Hyundai i30 Active worth over \$30,000; tickets are just \$5 each.

October's theme is Economic and Community Development, making it the perfect time to reflect on the importance of Rotary in communities throughout our region.

The story of Rotary is woven deeply into the fabric of our communities. You can see our story in the parks and playgrounds that beautify our towns; in the health centres, schools and community facilities operating with Rotary's support; and in all the other community services

and activities that benefit from Rotary's contribution. This little bit is part of a write up in the October edition of Rotary Down Under. More from this another time.

ARH (Australian Rotary Health) is one of Australia's largest non-government providers of mental illness research. ARH's broad vision is to improve the health and wellbeing of all Australians. ARH is supported by Rotary clubs and districts in Australia, and 100 per cent of donations are allocated to research grants, fellowships, and scholarships. October is Mental Health Month and ARH's Lift The Lid on Mental Illness campaign will see many fundraisers take place throughout the country. Our club will have its yearly Hat Day meeting and we'll donate to Australian Rotary Health through this. A few words and photos will be forwarded about this, to the Red Gum Courier.

World Polio Day is also in October, on the 24<sup>th</sup>. Eradicating polio is one of the most ambitious global health initiatives in history and polio cases have been reduced by more than 99.9 per cent worldwide since the program began over 30 years ago. Pakistan and Afghanistan remain the only two countries in the world, with circulating wild poliovirus. Over the past few months, new polio outbreaks have occurred in Israel, the United Kingdom and most recently in the New York City area of the United States.

These stories are frightening, but in every case, the response is clear: vaccines work, and if polio is spreading, we need to make sure the most-atrisk people have kept their vaccinations up to date. Most importantly, we need to eradicate this virus now. If polio exists anywhere, it can spread everywhere. Also from an article in October's RDU magazine.

Our next sausage sizzle is planned for Saturday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> and we hope to be busier than we were at our last one. We also hope that the weather gods will again be kind to volunteers and our customers.

### Museum Moments...

#### BANGERANG SITE NAMES SUBSTITUTED IN THE BARMAH FOREST!!!


The Bangerang, like other aboriginal tribes, did not have a written language so the early government authorities and squatters wrote the aboriginal words as they sounded to them hence the different spellings in the early days. When he selected his leases in his father's name of the Tongala Run in 1841, the Moira Run in 1842, the Cocoma Run 1843 and the Curawa Run in 1846 (collectively these Runs were later known as Lower Moira Run), Edward Micklethwaite Curr chose to use the Bangerang site names for the leases.

Many of these site names were endorsed by Alexander McDonell, the squatter on Upper Moira Run, and the Government Commissioner for "Settling Disputes Beyond the Settled Districts", William Firebrace Esq., when the Commissioner had to settle a boundary dispute between the Upper and Lower Moira Squatting runs as shown in his report in 1849.

Prior to 1870, during the development of the Barmah Forest timber industry, most of these site names were substituted for like sounding names in the English language which have no relevance to the Bangerang name nor the meaning and which remain to this day.

- Cocoma Creek became Cucumber Creek
- Curawa/Carawa Plain became Crow Plain (located on Picola- Barmah Road)
- Bongilbornia/Bungilborna became Budgee Creek (Bornia being Bangerang for creek)
- Bunchabunyah Creek became the Big Budgee Creek
- Bunnidgree Creek became Bunny Digger Creek
- Bunga Water Hole became Bunyip Water Hole
- Baala Creek became Broken Creek much earlier about 1849. The dual name was still in force as late as 1874.

If you know the Bangerang name of any other site in the forest that has had an unrelated but like-sounding English name substituted the Historical Society would like to hear from you.







oulburn Valley residents are **J** encouraged to learn about the world of water this month, with two of Goulburn Valley Water's sites open to the public for the first time since the pandemic.

Students across the Goulburn Valley have also been creating water-themed works of art during Term 3, challenging them to create a jigsaw puzzle artwork sharing their water story. Finalists will be announced during National Water Week.

Goulburn Valley Water Managing Director Steve Capewell said the tours during National Water

Week were a great opportunity for a rare insight behind the scenes at two of GVW's water treatment plants.

"National Water Week is a great opportunity to learn more about where your water comes from, and the process we go through to filter and treat it to high standards to ensure it's safe to drink," Dr Capewell said.

'It's also a great reminder of how important it is to be waterwise to conserve water for future generations to enjoy and how much we rely on water in our daily lives, from drinking and cooking to hygiene, cleaning and recreation."

Goulburn Valley Water Education Officer Kristy Elrington said she was thrilled to be able to welcome people back to in-person learning sessions for National Water Week.

"This year, we've also created a fun, interactive opportunity for students in our region to learn about the importance of water through in-class activities as part of our Water Week event schedule." she said.

An upgrade was completed at Tatura during the past couple of years, expanding the plant's capacity to treat 12 megalitres of water per day to

18ML, which will help meet future demand as the town grows. A new dissolved air floatation and filtration plant was also installed.

Shepparton's treatment plant also received upgrades on its filter systems in the past year to help improve the treatment process.

- Restore Main Bridge to original state, including lights
- Parking/Drop off planning at schools and childcare centre School crossing on Bromley Street
- More trees in town. Some streets well treed and others with virtually none, Eg. McDonnell st
- Social/Affordable public housing
- Sustainable Energy (Yackendandah) Power the town with 100% renewable energy
- Relocate Skate park. Move to a more public/visible area & more grown up activity area for teens
- Bike/Walking tracks Connect golf club to town (NB there is/was a track for that already), rail trail Picola to Numurkah

Some of the above projects may also be taken on as priority projects for the bank in a more direct nature. At this stage these will include services which the two towns have expressed as of high importance, such items include further services in health, children's services and job creation and/or services which may not be taken up by the private sector but were identified by you at these meetings as a gap in existing services more generally.
