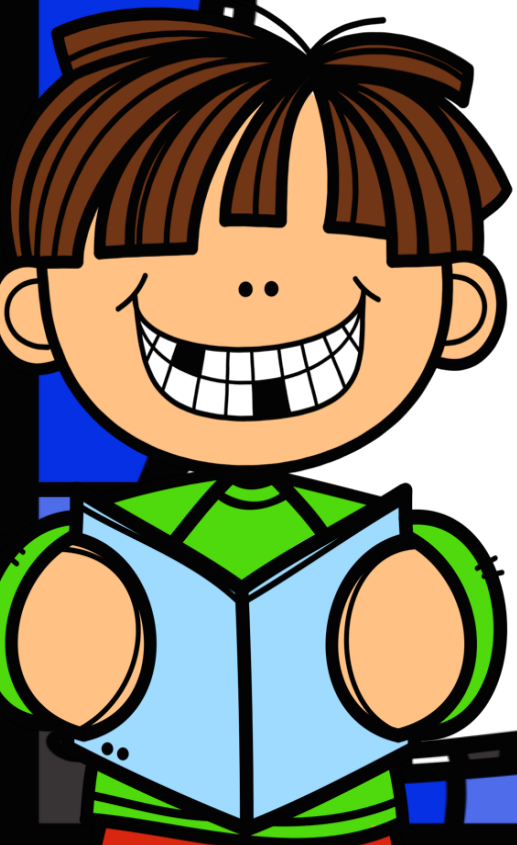

### Narrative Writing Checklist

ELA.W.3.3

*The purpose of a narrative piece is to share real or imagined experiences or events with your audience.*



- Establish the setting or situation for the tale.
- Introduce the narrator and/or characters.
- Organize a logical event sequence.
- Use dialogue and descriptions of actions, thoughts, and feelings to develop events or experiences
- Show the response of characters to their situations.
- Use temporal words and phrases to show the order of events. (Try words like: first, then, meanwhile, suddenly, as soon as, before long, finally)
- Provide a sense of closure that makes the writing sound complete.

**Think about a time you had a vacation. What happened? Write a narrative about the experience.**
