Teacher Tips:

All game cards are available in color and black/white, with 6 per page and 12 per page. Just print, laminate if desired, and cut apart. An optional decorative card back is included. An easy reference poster is at the end; print and post to help students play the game more independently.

CCSS Correlations:

2nd Grade - L.2.4.B - Determine the meaning of the new word formed when a known prefix is added to a known word (e.g., *happy/unhappy, tell/retell*).

3rd Grade - L.3.4.B - Determine the meaning of the new word formed when a known affix is added to a known word (e.g., *agreeable/disagreeable, comfortable/uncomfortable, care/careless, heat/preheat*).

4th Grade - L.4.4 - Determine or clarify the meaning of unknown and multiple-meaning words and phrases based on grade 4 reading and content, choosing flexibly from a range of strategies.
