SOLAR BAT TENNIS SPECIFIC SUNGLASSES:

"HOUSEKEEPING TIPS".

It's recommended not to drive when wearing these sunglasses due to the lenses' colour muting (red traffic light arrows, for example); warm, soapy water is good for cleaning the lenses after play; I also suggest rinsing the temples; the lenses' ability to resist scratching is excellent but it's worth taking the precaution of keeping the pouch and case inside your tennis bag when you're on court playing (on clay or synthetic grass) as wind could blow particles into them and, when you thrust the sunglasses back in, the particles could scrape on the lenses.

The sunglasses should always be taken off with both hands moving forwards rather than with one hand moving sideways. That's because, although there is some flexibility in the frame, using one hand moving sideways can, over time, gradually weaken the join where the temples are screwed into the lenses. For the same reason, it's better not to place the sunglasses on top of your head or cap. Hope that makes sense!

To adjust the nose pads, squeeze them closer together to have the lenses sit further away from your eyes; flatten them out to have them sit closer to your eyes. Take your time with this so you end up with the most comfortable fit.
