BROKEN RIB REVERSIBLE HAT AND COWL







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A super bulky, super quick knit to keep you warm on the coldest of days. If you weave in your ends neatly, both items will be comepletly reversible – offering two different textures! We recommend you knit the hat first, as it takes less than one ball of either yarn.

SKILL LEVEL:

Beginner

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Cowl: 35" (81cm) long x 9" (23cm) deep Hat: 20" (50cm) circumference x 10" (25cm) tall

MATERIALS

- 16" 9 mm circular knitting needles
- 9" 9 mm circular knitting needles or 9 mm double pointed needles.
- 14" 9 mm straight needles (optional, for cowl)
- 2 skeins of Estelle Alpaca Merino Bulky 60% Alpaca, 40 % Merino Wool Approx. 100g and 150m per skein Colour: Q61616 Bark OR
 3 balls of Cascade Lana Grande 100% Peruvian Wool Approx. 100g and 80m per ball Colour: 6040 Charcoal Grey
- Tapestry needle.
- 4 buttons of your choice, you may use 2 each of two different buttons for a more decorative effect.

GAUGE

10 sts and 14 rows = 4" in Broken Rib Pattern

ABBREVIATIONS

C/O - Cast On K - Knit P - Purl K2tog - Knit two stitches together

BROKEN RIB PATTERN

R1: Knit **R2:** (K1, P1) to end of row

INSTRUCTIONS

HAT

C/0 48 stitches. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist the stitches.

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Round 1: Knit

Round 2: * k1/P1*, repeat to the end of the round. Repeat Round 1 and 2 until your work measures 9", ending with round 2.

DECREASE ROUNDS

Note: change to either a 9" 9 mm circular needle or 9mm double points as required.

Round 1: *K6, K2tog*, repeat to end of round. (42 sts) Round 2: *K5, K2tog*, repeat to end of round. (36 sts) Round 3: *K4, K2tog*, repeat to end of round. (30 sts) Round 4: *K3, K2tog*, repeat to end of round. (24 sts) Round 5: *K2, K2tog*, repeat to end of round. (18 sts) Round 6: *K1, K2tog*, repeat to end of round. (6 sts) Round 7: *K2tog*, repeat to end of round. Cut yarn, leaving and 8" tail.

Thread tail through remaining 6 stitches and pull tight, weave in end. If you are careful and weave in the ends neatly, the hat may be worn with either side out. Fold hat up to the desired cuff length.

COWL

Using either 16" 9mm circular needle or 14" 9 mm straight needles, working in rows.

C/O 30 stitches **Row 1:** K **Row 2:** (K1, P1) to the end of the row. Repeat the above two rows until work measures approximately 35", ending with Row 2. Cast off using cable cast off method.

Fold ends of work over each other in whatever way pleases you and place one button on each side of the work and sew them together through work. Repeat with your next two buttons.

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
