

Tips for getting the most out of your WIND CHIME

HANG IT FROM THE RING OR HOOK AT THE TOP OF THE CHIME

(don't add length with rope or wire, etc.)



If that is impossible because of the location, use an S hook.



The reason is that extra length can cause the entire chime to swing when the goal is to have only the striker move.

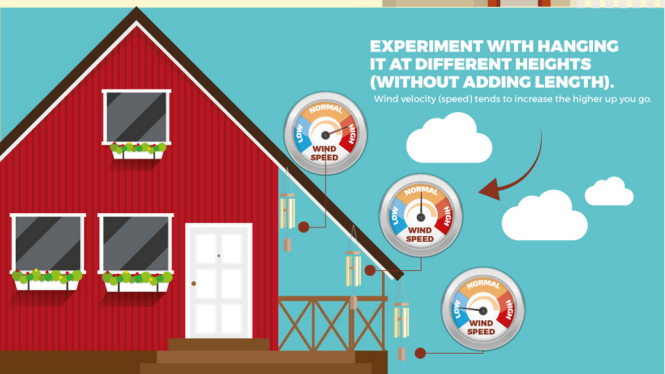
WHEN HANGING THE CHIME FROM A BUILDING OR SOMETHING SIMILAR, AIM TO HANG IT WHERE THE WIND CAN REACH IT EVEN IF IT SWITCHES DIRECTIONS.

For example, perhaps a corner would work best on your house.



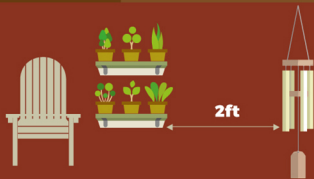
EXPERIMENT WITH HANGING IT AT DIFFERENT HEIGHTS (WITHOUT ADDING LENGTH).

Wind velocity (speed) tends to increase the higher up you go.



THOUGH NOT AS EASY AS THE FIRST THREE, TRY TO GET YOUR CHIME HANGING AT LEAST 2 FEET FROM A WALL OR THINGS LIKE LARGE HANGING PLANTS, TREES, FURNITURE, ETC.

They affect the breeze than one might think. Also, funny enough, screens like those on porches, might be enough to change the breeze.



SEASONAL WINDS DO SHIFT; YOUR CHIME MIGHT DO BETTER IN ONE SPOT DURING THE WINTER AND ANOTHER IN THE SUMMER.

Try hanging it in different locations during different times of the year.
