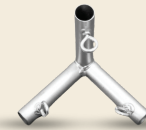

If you bought the full Sukkah bundle then it should come as 3 boxes:

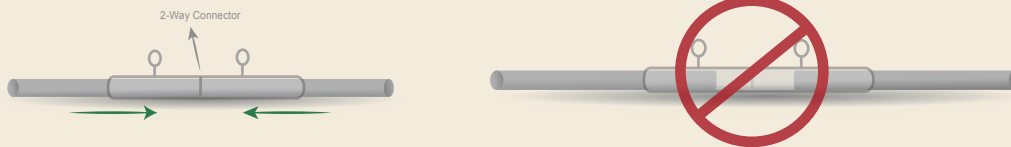
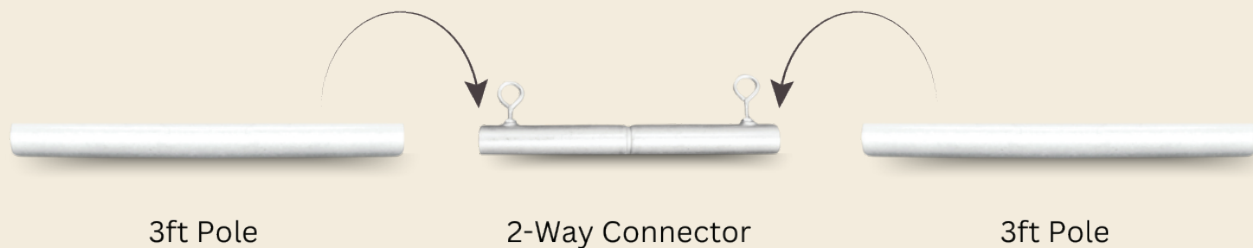

Step 1A

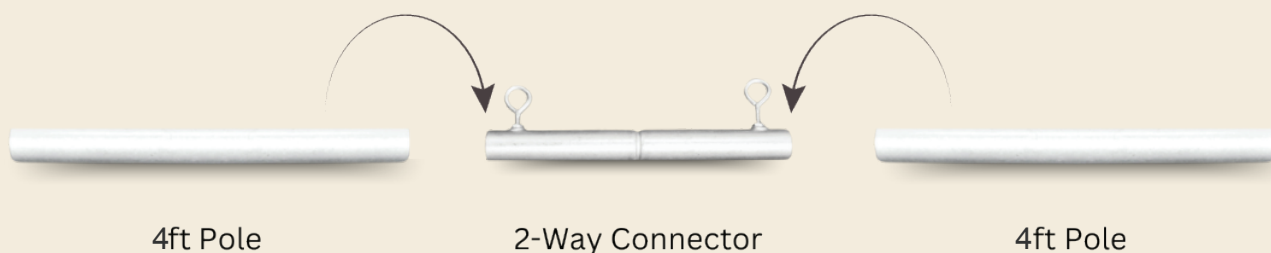
Create longer poles by connecting the following poles together, using the two-way connectors:

Attach a 3-foot pole to one side of the two-way connector, then attach the second 3-foot pole to the other side. This will create a 6-foot pole. Repeat this process until you have made five 6-foot poles for the Sukkah frame.



Make sure that the poles go all the way into the connectors so that they hit the end. You should hear the metal hit the end when fully inserted

Attach a 4-foot pole to one side of the two-way connector, then attach the second 4-foot pole to the other side. This will create an 8-foot pole. Repeat this process until you have made four 8-foot poles for the Sukkah frame.

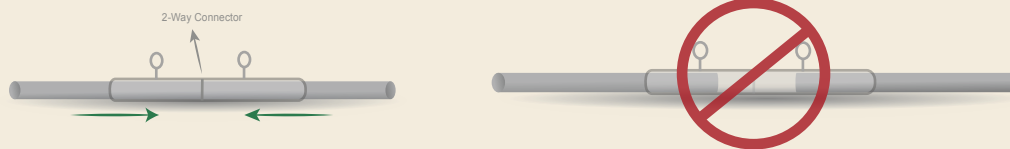
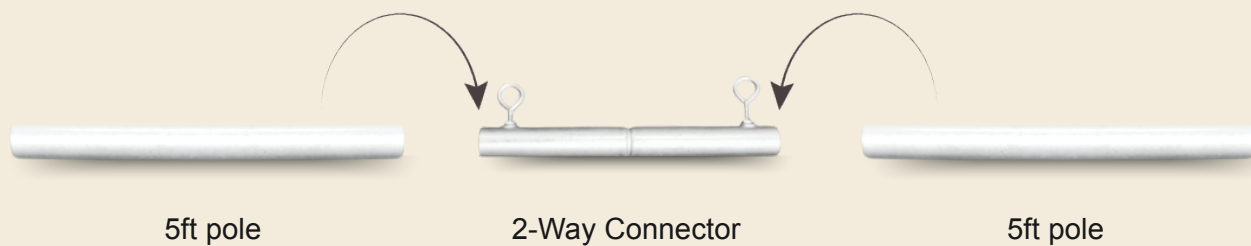




Step 1B

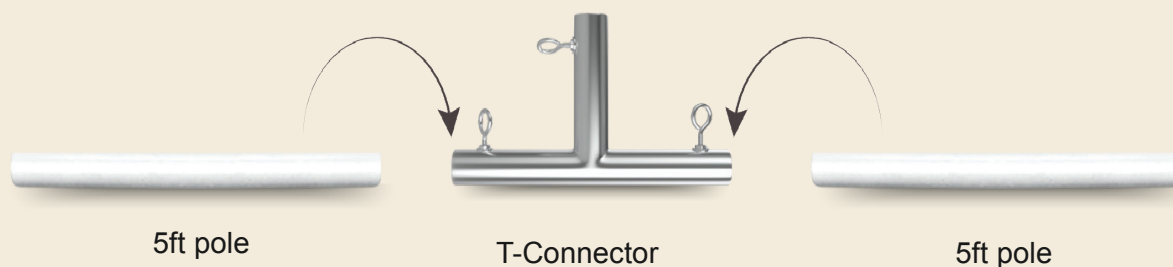
Create longer poles by connecting the following poles together, using the two-way connectors:

Attach a 5-foot pole to one side of the two-way connector, then attach the second 5-foot pole to the other side. This will create a 10-foot pole. Repeat this process until you have made one 10-foot pole for the Sukkah frame.



Make sure that the poles go all the way into the connectors so that they hit the end. You should hear the metal hit the end when fully inserted

Attach a 5-foot pole to one side of the T-connector, then attach a second 5-foot pole to the other side. This will create a 10-foot pole with T-connector in the middle. Repeat this process until you have made two 10-foot poles for the Sukkah frame.





Step 2

Lay out and connect the base of the Sukkah



Step 3

Connect the vertical poles



Be careful to make sure the poles are stabilized so they don't fall. If you are building the Sukkah by yourself, we advise to build one section at a time for the top of the frame



Step 4

Connect the 4 corners to the top of each pole.



Step 5

Add in the 5ft poles, with T-connectors, for the roof



Be careful to make sure the poles are stabilized so they don't fall. If you are building the Sukkah by yourself, we advise to build one section at a time for the top of the frame



Step 6

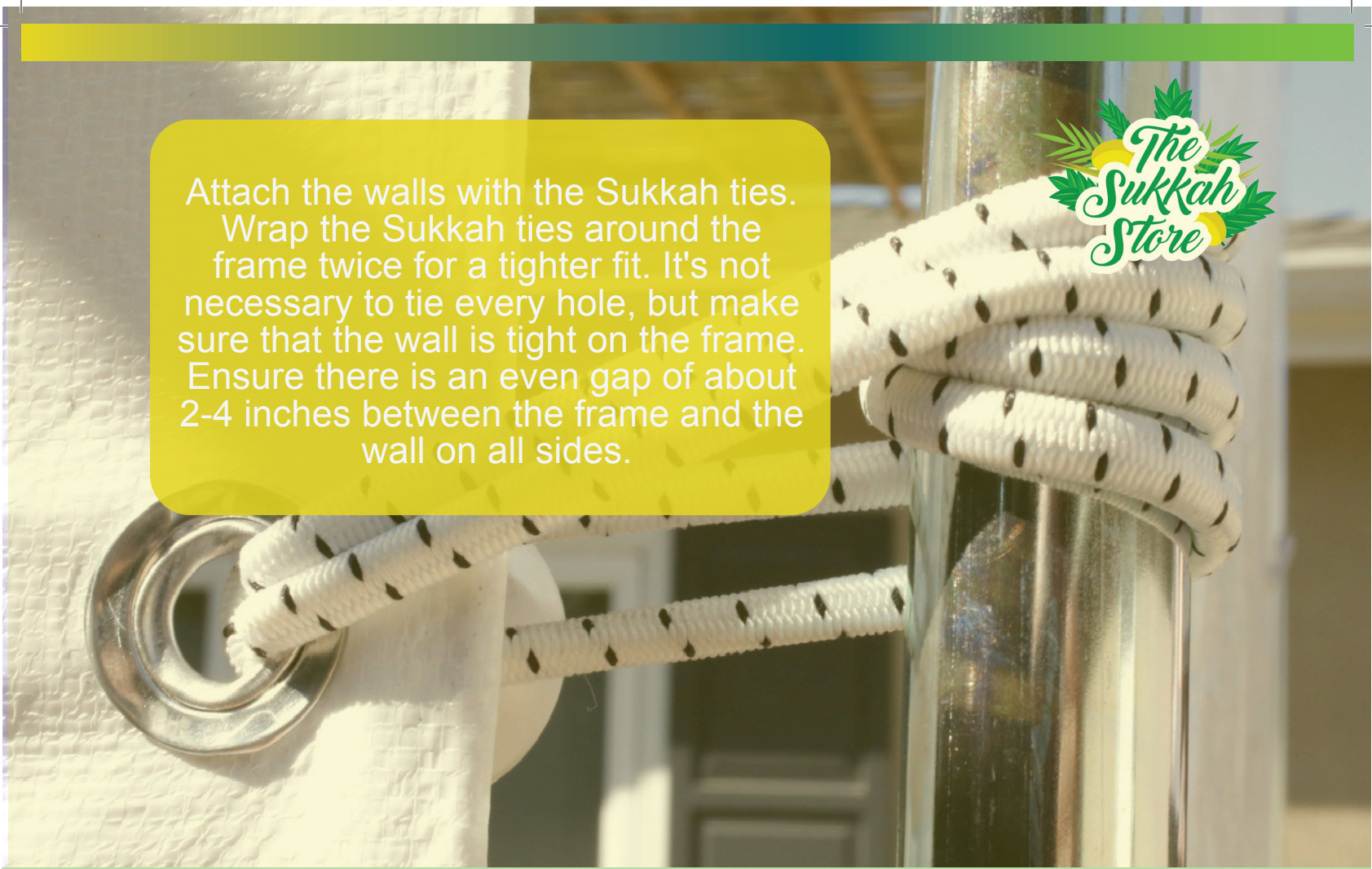
Add in the rest of the poles for the roof



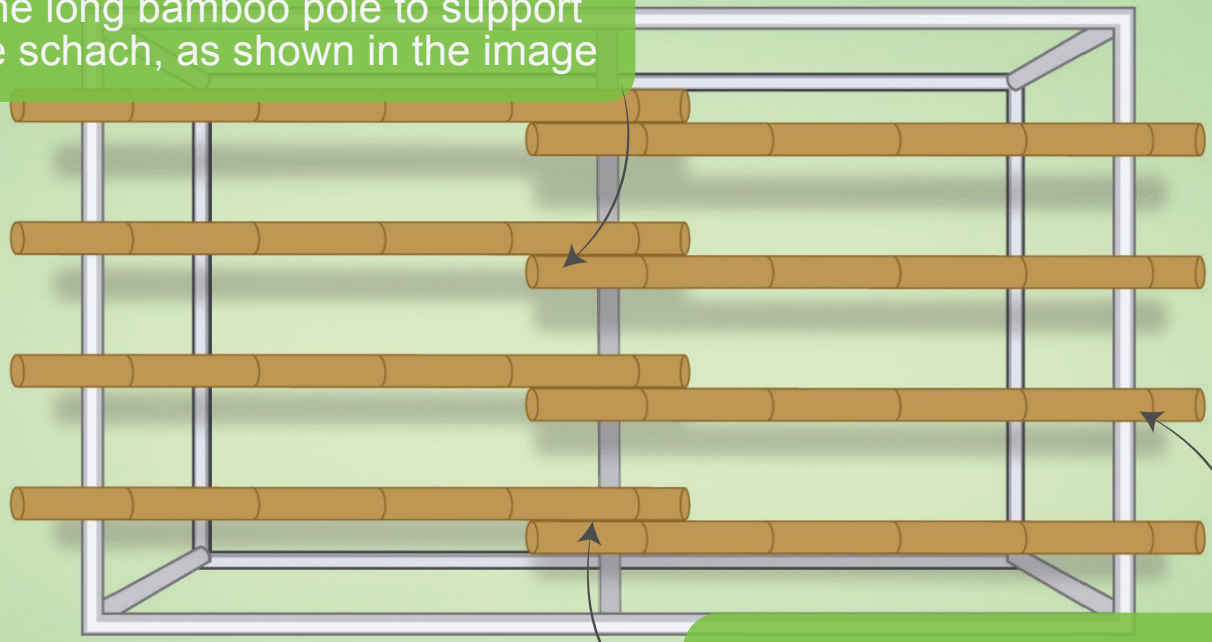
Be careful to make sure the poles are stabilized so they don't fall. If you are building the Sukkah by yourself, we advise to build one section at a time for the top of the frame



Attach the walls with the Sukkah ties. Wrap the Sukkah ties around the frame twice for a tighter fit. It's not necessary to tie every hole, but make sure that the wall is tight on the frame. Ensure there is an even gap of about 2-4 inches between the frame and the wall on all sides.



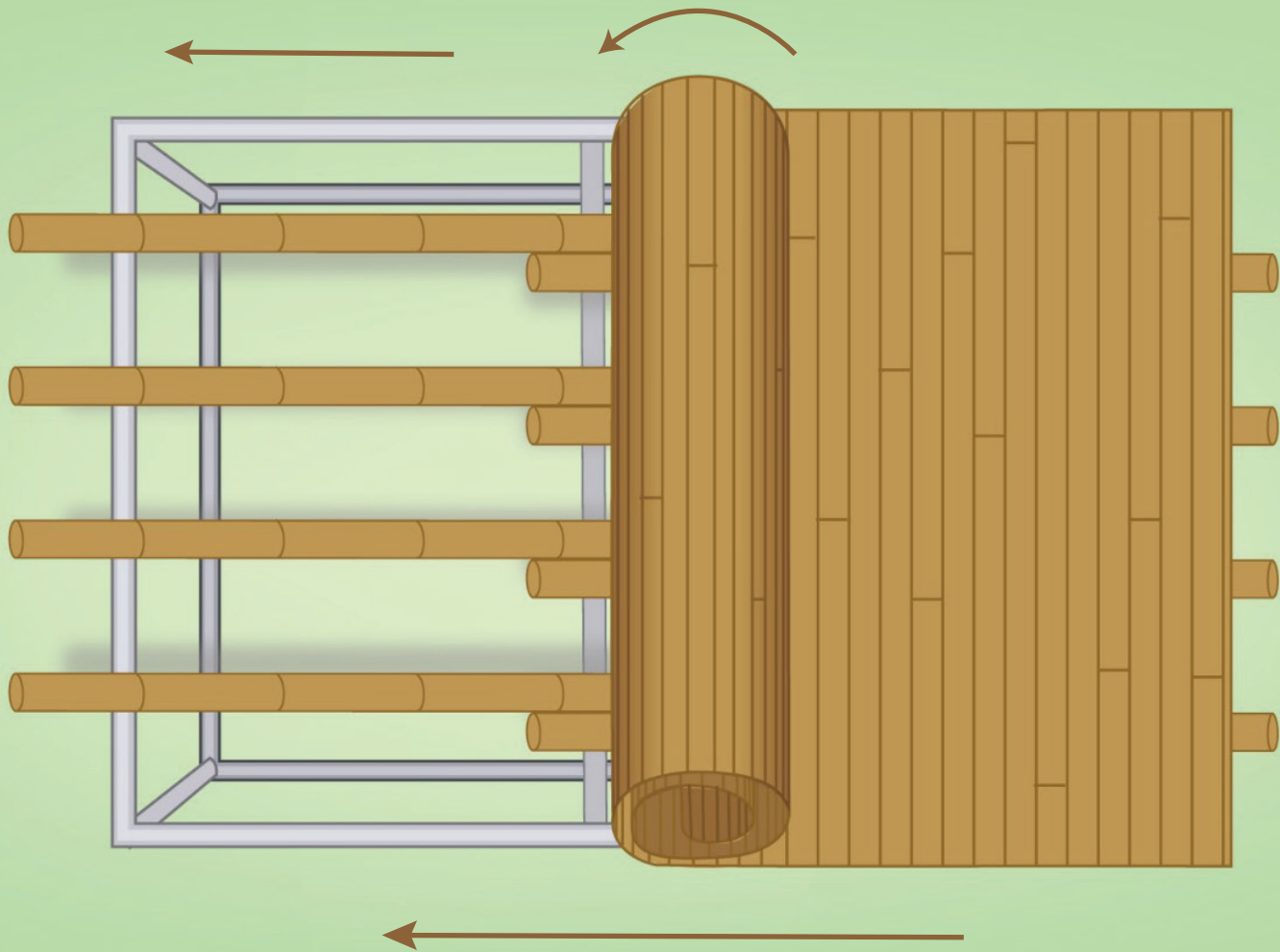
Place the bamboo poles on top of the frame, positioning them tightly against each other to create one long bamboo pole to support the schach, as shown in the image



Ensure the poles extend a few inches beyond the Sukkah frame to prevent slipping



Roll the bamboo mat in the same direction as the bamboo poles. This will ensure the mat sits properly on the bamboo without drooping.
