

BOSS BALLET BARRE ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

1.

On a clean surface that will not scratch the finish of the bars, sort out the different bar lengths and connectors so that they are ready to assemble. All included pieces are shown below:



2.

Assemble the lower stabilizer bars and Advanced Stability feet, as shown. It's recommended to measure to find the exact center of the bar for the middle connector. You can spray some glass cleaner or soap & water solution to ease on the foot pieces. Ensure they are pressed all the way on:

Assemble the two main vertical barres with the corner- and cross-connectors, as shown in Fig. A below. It is helpful to line up the two verticals parallel to each other to ensure the connectors are perfectly aligned with one another, as shown in Fig. B. Ensure the set screws on both sides are facing up. Tighten the set screws extremely well, to ensure they "bite in" to the steel:

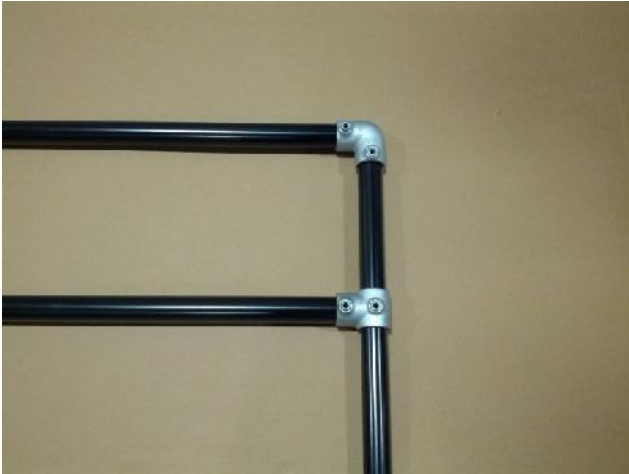

Align the vertical assemblies with the horizontals, on each end of the barre (ensure set screws are facing up on both verticals, as shown):

After visually ensuring they are square, fully tighten the connection hardware on both ends extremely well, to ensure the set screws “bite in” to the steel:

Place the base stabilizers that you assembled in Step 2 to the side of each barre end vertical, making sure they are to the same side of each vertical:

With the help of an additional adult, lift the assembled barre upper until it can be placed into the receiving connectors on the base stabilizers:

Place the assembled barre upper into the receiving connectors on the base stabilizers, and line them up as square as possible with the rest of the barre. FULLY tighten all set screws on the entire barre, once you have ensured that all pieces are square:

Tips for your Boss Ballet Barre:

Your new Boss Ballet Barre is engineered to be the strongest free-standing barre available, anywhere. With a little care and maintenance, your Barre will last many, many years. Some examples:

- Clean with a soft cloth (cotton or microfiber) and warm water or non-ammonia-based light duty cleaner only
- Check and tighten set screws monthly, or as needed; if assembled correctly, the screws will not need more frequent tightening
- Boss Ballet Barres are not designed for use as a “jungle gym” or as playground equipment; using the Barre in this manner is dangerous and will void any and all warranties and guarantees
