





Toni Galmes is a Spanish illustrator who takes inspiration from cinema and comics as well as classic 19th- and 20th-century illustrations.

Ros is surprised that their school turns out to be supportive of their identity. But what's the next move? Hormones? Surgery? And what will happen when Eddy finds out?

Chris Ricketts is a former teacher. They came out as non-binary in the 1990s and have campaigned ever since to raise awareness of trans people's issues, and to make Ireland a more understanding and welcoming place for trans people.
