

Yellow-Bellied Sapsucker

Fascinating and unique woodpeckers that like other woodpeckers eat insects and spiders captured on tree bark but they are also very fond of fruits and sap. Their love for sap is what gave them their name. They access the sweet liquid by creating and maintaining wells, or holes, in the bark of often diseased or wounded trees. Sapsuckers are the only woodpecker from this area that can undertake a long-distance migration to Mexico and Central America. Interestingly, females usually make the longest migrations. Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers have been found on Bird Friendly coffee plantations.

- Offering them a place to make a nest by leaving dead and dying trees in place if safe to do so.

Bird Friendly Coffee

Three quarters of the world's coffee farms destroy forest habitat to grow coffee in the sun. When forests disappear, migratory songbirds disappear too. Certified Bird Friendly coffee grows underneath shade trees that provide habitat for birds, including migratory species whose impressive journeys take them from our backyards all the way to coffee farms in Latin America.
