Instructions



1. PREPARE YOUR STORAGE BAG

Clear an area to ensure no pointy objects puncture the plastic

Lie bag flat on the floor and your items flat beside it

Peel open the zip seals, starting from the middle working your way to the ends



5. VACUUM OUT THE AIR

Remove the plastic cap from valve, leaving the small red/pink rubber disc inside

Place nozzle of vacuum cleaner over valve and remove the air

Once air is removed, screw plastic cap back on tightly in a clockwise direction




2. PACK YOUR ITEMS

Ensure items are clean and dry; tuck away any zips or buttons

Fold items to the size of the bag and slip them in

Be careful not to overfill the bag; do not fill past the dotted "STOP!" line



6. STORE YOUR ITEMS

Place plastic slider in middle of seal for storage

Bags can be stored flat, folded or stacked Store under beds or couches, in wardrobes, attics, basements or garages

Or use temporarily when packing for travelling or moving houses

Be careful not to store near sharp objects, lights or heaters



3. ZIP THE SEALS

Starting at one end, slowly run the plastic slider along the zip seals

Stop every 10cm or so to readjust and line up the seals; continue to the end

Then slide the plastic slider in the opposite direction



7. REMOVING ITEMS AFTER USE

Peel open zip seals from the middle to the

Remove items from bag and allow air to flow again

These bags are reusable



4. ENSURE SEALS ARE TIGHT

Remove plastic slider

At one end, place one of the zip seals in between your thumb and finger

Slide your thumb and finger across the zip seal applying pressure and making it click

Slide back in the opposite direction, ensuring the seal is tight

Then repeat the process with the other zip seal

Finally, lightly rub the seals between your thumb and finger to check all parts of the seal have been clicked into place
