

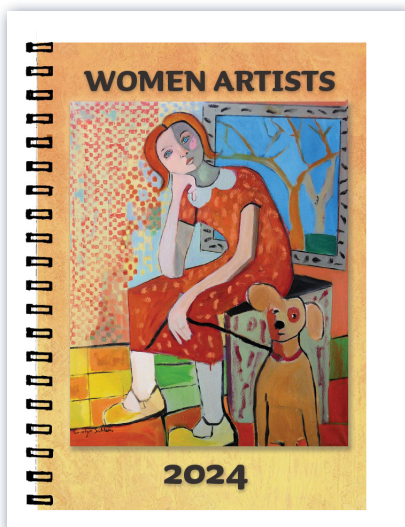

- Limit 8 images may be submitted
- Final Dimensions 5.5" high x 4" wide
- Up to 5 MB each PDF, JPEG, and TIFF

### COMPENSATION

Cover Art: \$200, + 4 datebooks

Inside artwork: \$70 + 2 datebooks

### POETRY

Submissions accepted in any style or language (please provide English translation)

- Limit 4 poems, include name/contact info on each page
- Times New Roman 12pt single spaced
- Send as Doc, Docx, RTF or PDF files
- We are only accepting unpublished work

### COMPENSATION

Inside Poetry: \$70 plus 2 datebooks
