Or or 17, 62 in first parade for St. Patrick's Day was held the Unit States. In the parade, Irish soldiers who had so ved in the English army walked proudly. Throughout the next 3 years, Americans became devoted to the Irish culture and created Irish aid groups such as the Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick, and the Hibernian Society.

Several of these groups created a massive parade in New York City in 1848. To this day, the parade remains the largest with a total of over 150,000 participants. New York City, Boston and Chicago are known for having the largest St. Patrick's Day parades.
