Daylight Savings, also known as Daylight Savings Time (DST), was first introduced many centuries before it was actively used. In 1784, Benjamin Franklin initially suggested its use. The purpose for Daylight Savings was to save money on

waste of daylight. The idea was proposed in both New Zealand and England, and was initially rejected by both countries.

In 1916, two years after World War I had begun, the German government, as well as other countries involved in World War I. began to think about how to save money on energy.

On March 9, 1918, the Daylight Savings law was implemented by the United States Congress. This helped to save money on energy costs because during this time period most energy came from coal.

Is it Still Effective?

Daylight Savings did in fact save money on energy when it was first implemented, since coal was the primary source for energy. However, it no longer saves money today because energy sources have become more efficient than coal. Also, the middle part of the Earth receives the same amount of sunlight year-
