

- 2. Cut out the digital citizenship scenarios. Shuffle them and randomly hang them up around the classroom or the hallway.
- 3. Explain to students that they will work in pairs, reading each scenario to determine if they are appropriate or inappropriate digital citizenship scenarios. This is an anticipatory set activity. Do not define digital citizenship for them. Tell them they can start at any scenario - it does not need to be A.
- 4. Once students have completed their scavenger hunt, take up each scenario as a class through a class discussion. Once the class votes on whether each scenario is appropriate or inappropriate, place the scenario card around either the 'Appropriate Digital Citizenship' or 'Inappropriate Digital Citizenship' title card. This could make a bulletin board if you would like. Have students vote actively - by holding signs or standing up/sitting down to signify their choice. © http://www.2peasandadog.com






