

- 2. Divide the class into pairs or groups of 4.
- 3. Have students walk around the classroom or hallway and find the Greek Root sheets. Students need to scan the QR code with their devices to uncover the Greek root. Once they have uncovered the Greek root, have them write it on the Greek Roots Scavenger Hunt graphic organizer.
- 4. Once students have completed this activity, have the pairs or groups work together on the Greek Roots Matching Activity.
- 5. Take up the answers as a class.
- 6. Have students write the correct meanings next to the Greek roots on the Greek Roots Scavenger Hunt graphic organizer.
