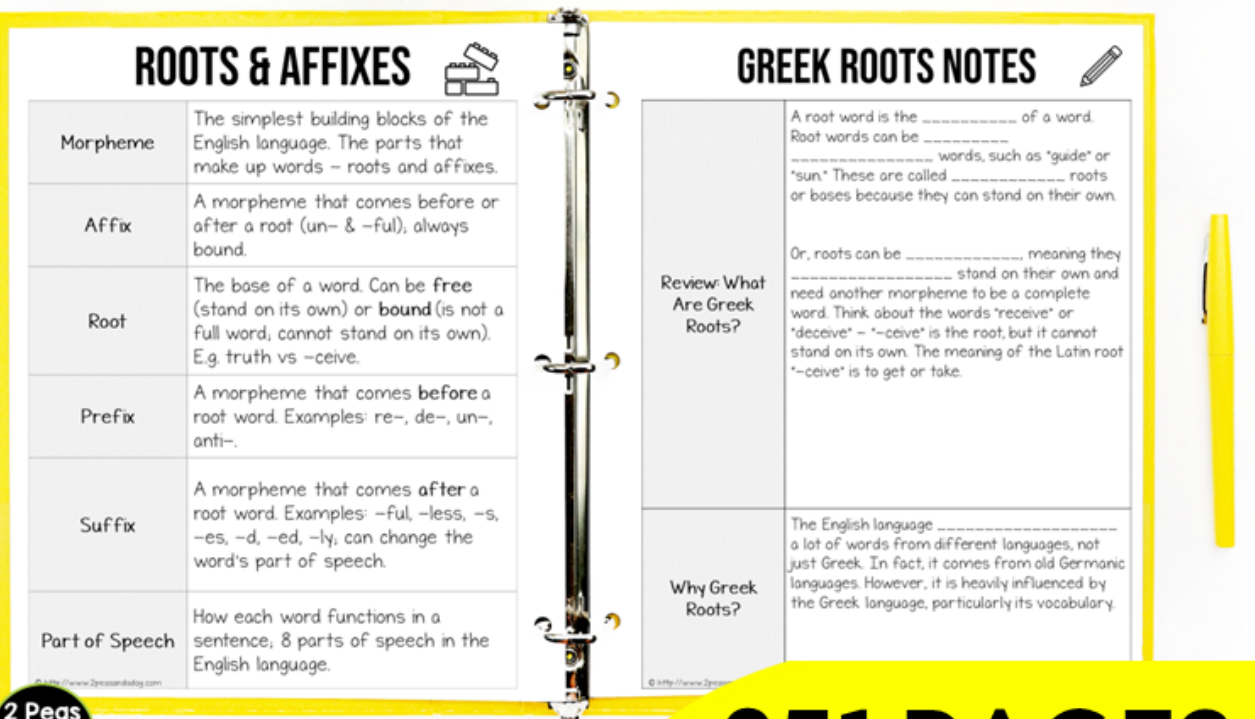

## INTRODUCTION



### Find The Greek Root

**Lesson Overview:** Students will move around the classroom to find different Greek roots.

**Materials Needed:**

- Student technology, e.g. cellphones, iPads
- Photocopy a class set of:
  - Greek Root sheets (QR Code or Non-QR Code option)
  - G
  - G
  - D

# LESSON PLANS

- Tea
1. H using the QR code or non-QR code format.
  2. Divide the class into pairs or groups of 4.
  3. Have students walk around the classroom or hallway and find the Greek Root sheets. Students need to scan the QR code with their devices to uncover the Greek root. Once they have uncovered the Greek root, have them write it on the Greek Roots Scavenger Hunt graphic organizer.
  4. Once students have completed this activity, have the pairs or groups work together on the Greek Roots Matching Activity.
  5. Take up the answers as a class.
  6. Have students write the correct meanings next to the Greek roots on the Greek Roots Scavenger Hunt graphic organizer.

Meaning: Hun

### Examples:

- ✓ anthropology:
- ✓ philanthropist: the welfare of others
- ✓ misanthrope: someone who hates humans
- ✓ philanthropy: the desire to improve the welfare of others
- ✓ lycanthropy: in mythology, a person's magical ability to transform into a wolf; the characteristics of a wolf

## ROOTS AND AFFIXES NOTES

All words in the English language (and other languages) are broken down into \_\_\_\_\_.

Morphemes are the many parts of words or whole words that make up a language. They are like the simplest \_\_\_\_\_ of our language.

Examples:

- There are 3 morphemes in the word "untruthful": "un-", "truth," and "-ful."
- In the word "guided," there are 2 morphemes: "guide" and "-d." The word "guide" is the root, and "-d" is an affix, which tells us when the word "guide" is taking place (in this case, past tense).

Meaning: Human

Examples:

### ANCHOR CHART

- ✓ philanthropy: the desire to promote the welfare of others
- ✓ lycanthropy: in mythology, a person's magical ability to develop the characteristics of a wolf.

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## GREEK ROOT: ANTHROP - NOTES

Meaning: The root -anthrop- means "\_\_\_\_\_ " in Greek.

### NOTE-TAKING SHEETS

Examples and Definitions: \_\_\_\_\_ the welfare of others.

- **misanthrope (n):** someone who

### ANSWER KEY

Meaning: The root -anthrop- means "**human**" in Greek.

- **anthropology (n):** the study of humans.
- **philanthropist (n):** one who promotes the welfare of others (humans).
- **philanthropy (n):** the desire to promote the welfare of others.
- **misanthrope (n):** someone who dislikes humans.

### ANSWER KEYS

Sentence(s): always intrigued by the **anthropology** of the place.

- The generous **philanthropist's** new business venture gave one pair of socks free for every pair of socks purchased.
- Everyone thought Granger was a **misanthrope**, but he really was just shy.
