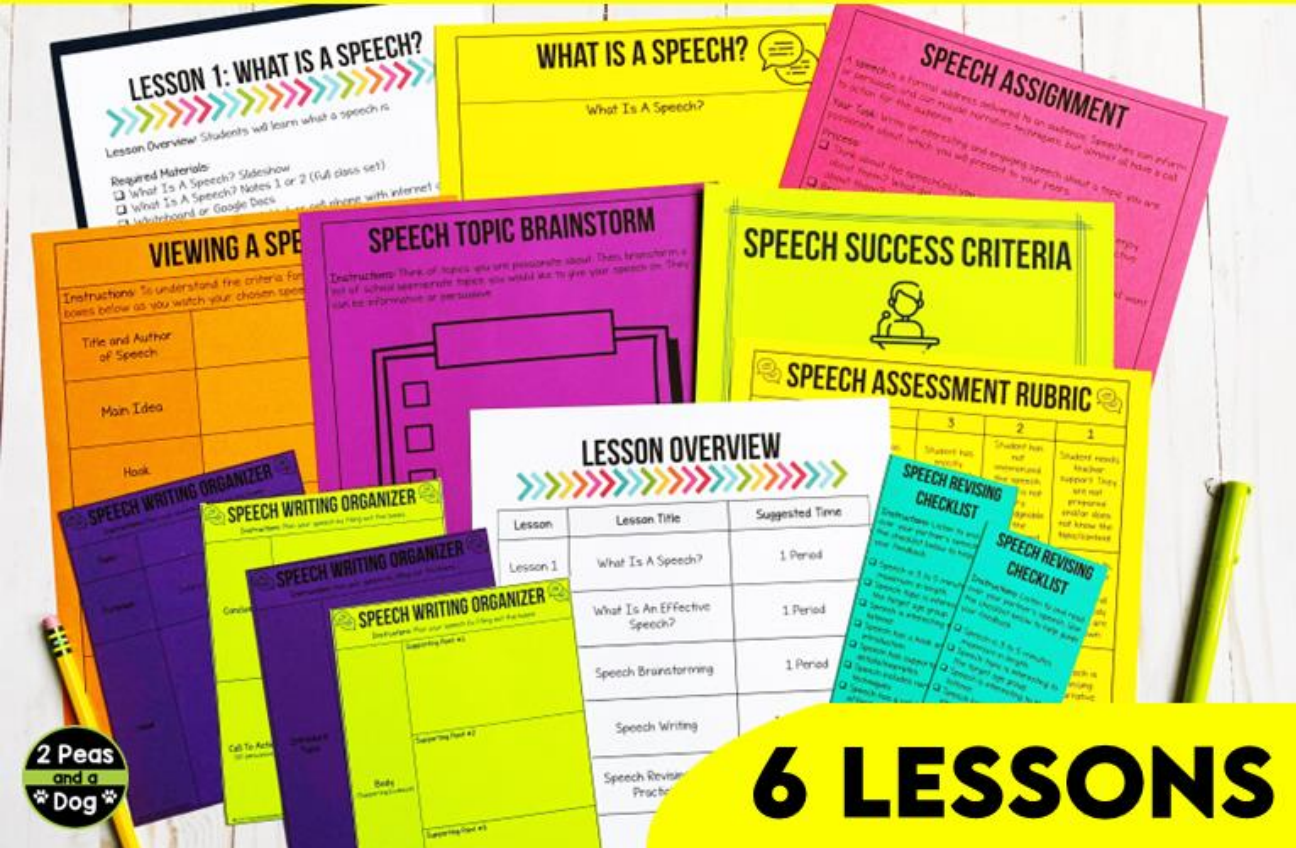

LESSON 1: WHAT IS A SPEECH?



Lesson Overview: Students will learn what a speech is.

Required Materials:

- What Is A Speech? Slideshow
- What Is A Speech? Notes 1 or 2 (full class set)
- Whiteboard or Google Docs
- Access to a computer, tablet or cell phone with internet access

Teacher Preparation:

1. Students will learn what a speech is.
2. Prepare a list of famous speeches to use in the lesson.
3. Prepare a list of famous speakers to use in the lesson.
4. Explain that many people have given speeches throughout history, and in the present day (some in the form of TED Talks), and ask students to name people who have given speeches they have heard of.
5. Record these on your whiteboard, chart paper, or using a digital word processing method such as Google Docs.
6. Then work through the What Is A Speech? slideshow as a class.
7. Have students take notes using Option 1 or 2.

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SPEECH PLANNING EXAMPLES

Possible Topic	Supporting Points
Shopping at thrift stores	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Cheaper than the mall. Better for the environment. Less likely to wear the same thing as someone else.
Texting and Driving	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Dangerous - can cause accidents. Pull over or wait - nothing is that important.
