#### GLOBAL COLLABORATION



Canada is a big leader in the world. It is part of groups that help countries work together.

Canada is part of trade deals. That is when countries agree to trade things like goods and services without big taxes. Free trade agreements can also help with financial investments, workers, tourists, and intellectual property protection moving across borders. The Canada-Linted States-Mexico Trade Agreement (CUSMA) is a recent example of a trade deal.

Canada is also part of Intergovernmental Organizations (IGOs). They help each other and find ways to cooperate around the world The United Nations and the World Health Organization are some examples of IGOs. They help solve problems around the world.

Canada belongs to a military alliance called the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO). It is a group of countries that promis to defend each other if one member is threatened. They share military personnel, tools, and more. NATO started in 1949, right ofter World War III.

Conada and the United States are also part of a mutual defence pact called the **North American Acrospace Defense Command** (NORAD). They watch the skies over the two countries to keep everyone safe. They even track Santa on Christmas Eve.






