


The following is a list of words used when talking about crime scene investigations. Match the letter for the word to its definition to create a lock code (e.g. 1F).

Word	Definition
1. Evidence	A. A science that helps solve crimes by studying clues such as fingerprints, blood, or D.N.A.
2. Document Analysis	B. Anything that can help show what happened in a crime.
3. Chain of Custody	C. This makes each person unique, which makes it a powerful tool for solving crimes. The scientific name for this is deoxyribonucleic acid.
4. D.N.A.	D. A story or explanation that someone gives to show they were not at the scene of a crime.
5. Forensicology	E. This is a way to keep track of evidence to make sure it hasn't been changed or tampered with.
6. Alibi	F. Examining written or printed materials to gather information or verify their authenticity, such as looking at handwriting, typewriting, ink, paper, etc.
