

PICTORA

- **Pictora** is an innovative 'not for profit' Social Enterprise
- Bringing the therapeutic value of art together with the practical creativity of entrepreneurship and business enterprise skills
- Supporting offenders in prison, "Through the Gate", and back into society
- Engaging hard-to-reach disadvantaged groups in the community
- Established in 2009 with support from the Ministry of Justice







2MAKEIT

- 2makeit is a charity that helps rehabilitate prisoners and ex-prisoners by offering them creative expression
- Guided by expertly trained musicians and other specialist practitioners they learn how to collaborate and create
- Inspiring to lead more productive and positive lives whilst in jail, and law-abiding lives on release
- Our work continues in the community supporting people to re-build their lives on release.







PRISON - THE CHALLENGES

- 317 people died in prison in the year to March 2019. 25% were self-inflicted.
- Self-inflicted deaths are 6.2 times more likely in prison than in the general population.
- 26% of women and 16% of men said they had received treatment for a mental health problem in the year before custody.
- Over half (54%) of people entering prison in 2018 were assessed as having literacy skills expected of an 11-year old - more than three times higher than in the general adult population.
- A third of people (34%) assessed in prison in 2017–18 reported that they had a learning disability or difficulty.







MADE VISIBLE PROJECT THE IDEA

- An innovative new project that builds prisoner and disadvantaged individuals' self-esteem, challenging Learned Helplessness / lack of purpose.
- A key aim of the project is to challenge the 'us and them' mindset, by removing labels of offender and ex-offender.
- In prison, perhaps more than anywhere else, the value of creativity should not be under-estimated: receiving praise and being recognised as something other than 'offender' such as an artist or writer.
- A key aim of the project is to bring often hidden talent out to be...









MADE VISIBLE PROJECT HMP THE MOUNT

- A Cat C Prison with a population over 1,000 male prisoners in Hertfordshire
- The project focuses on prisoners creating their own art for their own exhibition
- Exhibition and awards in the Prison on 9th July 2019, supported by The Arts Society – Gade Valley and the High Sheriff of Hertfordshire
- Exhibition featured over 130 items



- New partnerships






