Spreading Positivity Through Art to Ottawa and Beyond

Mark Jamensky and Karen Faloon have been married for 28 years. They first met when Karen crashed a BNR Christmas party at the Congress Centre, and Mark asked her to dance.

"Our first real date was a skate on the Rideau Canal," says Mark. "We were married at the beautiful Unitarian Congregation on Cleary Avenue, and then had a reception and wonderful dance party at the West Block of Parliament Hill, which included 'free' fireworks since it was Victoria Day!"

A few years later, they moved to their current home in Centrepointe. Karen was born and raised in Ottawa. She studied at Algonquin College and has had her own private hair salon since she was

Joel frequently participates and exhibits his pieces in two local artistic and education groups in Ottawa, BEING and DragonFly. "Both groups have been extremely supportive of Joel's artistic vision, which continues to evolve," says Karen.

Joel's unique artistic abilities emerged at a young age. "In recent years when Joel was included in group art showings, all of his original art would sell out extremely quickly," explains Mark. "This then gave us the idea to make his online art store."

In addition to his artistic endeavours, Joel also loves to cook, and he is proud to have achieved his Kitchen Steward Certificate from Algonquin College in 2017. He has worked in multiple professional

kitchens and also considers cooking another form of art.

"Joel maintained a part-time job at Bridgehead's central kitchen for seven years, until COVID hit," explains Mark. "He was very proud of his job, busing across the city on his own, and now that things are relaxing again, he really wants to get back to working in a kitchen somewhere."

Joel enjoys movies and sports, and he continues to play on a special needs hockey team, the Capital City Condors, while also cheering for the Ottawa Senators in his spare time. Although everyone in the family are Ottawa Senators fans, Joel is known to be the most optimistic, assuming every year they will win the Stanley Cup!

They realized this very early on. "When we first moved into Centrepointe the stimulation program we were doing with Joel required numerous volunteers several times a day," explains Mark. "Our neighbours were initially somewhat apprehensive about the amount of household activity, however they quickly came to understand what we were doing. During this time our living and dining rooms were 100 per cent converted to a full time gym complete with monkey bars and gym mats, so ours was always the main play house for the kids on our street. It was wonderful!"

When Joel was younger Mark also encouraged practical jokes, which then came right back to him. "Joel would hide in the closet when I came home from work and scare the crap out of me!" he exclaims.

Not only does Joel's positive personality and loving sense of life come through in the art itself, but also in the names and descriptions of his pieces, which you can see on his website where he sells art prints, clothing, and accessories: artbyjpositive.com.
