And we should also have our new honour boards up in the club in the next few weeks. Talks are all also underway to see if we can have monthly Sunday music at the club.

It is great to see our membership base (bowlers and social) increasing and we want this to continue. Thank you to all members who have renewed your membership for 23/24 and we hope to attract more members over the course of the year. The Board and the bowling committee are looking at a variety of ways to get more of our social members bowling even if it is only 3-4 times a year.

The Bowls Report.

The off-season Winter Bowls have been a great success over the last 4 months starting the 1st week with 12 bowlers and working up to a maximum of 48 bowlers when Clayton closed their greens.

SOBC finished at the tail of the field, giving some of our newer bowlers' experience while the other clubs were playing Premier and Sect.1 bowlers. 
